FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

Although season 2017/18 resulted in a loss for the club of \$5,000 it must be remembered that the prior season saw a profit in excess of \$10,000, indicating the fluctuating fortunes of running a club with four senior teams and eight junior sides, in ever tighter financial climes.

Congratulations to our four senior teams on making the finals, culminating in the club winning the VSDCA Club Championship, and a number of the junior teams participating in finals with the Under 13 Naughtin team, beating arch rival Caulfield in a high-scoring Grand Final.

Income for the year rose by \$10,000 to reach \$100,000 however expenses rose sharply by \$25,000 - to almost \$106,000 - a breakdown of material items follows.

Wins for the season included a \$6,000 Telstra grant (to be used for the sole purpose of making improvements to training facilities); a further \$9,000 being invested in various term deposits (totalling approximately \$78,000 by 30/4/18); an innovative social committee organising a highly successful picnic/past players/reverse draw day; and to replace the irreplaceable "Fossil" (Allan B. Stamps), a restructured Secretarial Department i.e. a number of people performed sections of the role, saving the club in excess of \$1,000.

Members' subscriptions were kept at the 2013/14 rate, netting \$20,930 for seniors and \$12,810 for juniors.

Again, Sponsorship revenue was a major contributor to our overall results. Magnificent backing was received from our loyal supporters: the Murrumbeena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; Rotary Club of Oakleigh; Sign*A*Rama (Oakleigh); Rosstown Hotel; Allfloors Carpet Gallery; Mortgage Choice; Ray White Oakleigh; Atherton Road Podiatrist; Junkeer Business Solutions; Spring Osteo Clinic; and Cote Terra. A big thank you to all of these organisations, and - especially Trent Shields - for his diligent pursuing of new sponsors such as Jetts Fitness – Oakleigh; Escape Travel; Greenworks Indoor Gardens; L & L Butchers and Salts of the Earth.

Player Sponsors declined slightly on the prior season, but I have faith in our dedicated players turning that around in 2018/19!

Refreshment and food sales, raffles and fundraising activities again contributed to generating revenue for the Club. The \$2,000 drop in refreshment sales - resulting in an \$800 profit decline - was offset by the successful past players/reverse draw event. Thanks go to those who participated in various activities, whether by running the event, purchasing supplies for the Bar/BBQ, or working on the day. Special thanks go to the finance team of Roly Williams, Ivor Donohue, and Steve King for their guidance and support; and Connor Byrne for running the Thursday night raffles during the season.

Profit from Social Activities rose by \$3,800 driven by a hardworking committee, and could have been more as numbers were down at the second major function – the Oakleigh CC Ball – even though a great time was had by those who attended. A summary showing the results of these activities is included with this report.

I am again looking forward to support from the lobster-king (Neil Croft) as his skills at organising and recruiting new members to the Lobster Club resulted in a profit of nearly \$5,000. Roly's skills at processing payments also made my job easier.

There were 43 members in 2017/18, and these supporters of the Lobster Club enjoyed a sumptuous dinner in April, as a reward for our First Eleven winning eight games over the season.

Enough stock of polos, vests & singlets was purchased to last this and next season (taking advantage of discounts for bulk purchases). Inventory levels were also added to as a result of our major supplier (BLK) trading out of bankruptcy, enabling OCC to recoup over \$1,700 written-off in 2016/17, leading to a profit of \$900 on Merchandise sales this season.

The \$25,000 increase in expenses for 2017/18 consisted mainly of the following committee approved and worthy items:

- Reserve again, and under 17 teams resumed playing on turf in 2017/18.
- TNF fees were slightly higher than other venues – offset by ease of access and proximity to OCC – and no charge to players for fitness sessions, saw a rise in “Training” costs of nearly \$2,000.
- Repairs to the air conditioner, refrigerator & bowling machine led to an increase of \$2,000 in Repairs and Maintenance.
- Increased coaching payments, allied with measures to foster player improvement involving an extra development coach being appointed; plus residential costs (re our overseas player) being reimbursed to the generous hosts, saw overall coaching expenses rise by over \$5,000 on the prior year.
- Ground rental fees rose by \$7,000 due to us being charged for using the W.A. Scammell
- A new way of celebrating Oaks Day wins was introduced this season with free meals on the Thursday following a round where all 4 senior teams won. This eventuated in a \$1,400 increase in costs, and reduced bar takings on the night.

Some items the incoming committee may look at to boost income/control expenditure include:

- Running a Christmas Raffle
- Increasing player subscriptions
- Maximising term deposit interest
- Controlling electricity costs as the Oakleigh Chargers are after greater compensation from OCC for use of their facilities
- Increasing the price charged for Thursday Night “Splatt” meals
- Improving ground floor storage to enable bulk purchase of refreshments



SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

2017/18 was supposed to be a transition year, when the Second XI, after empathetically winning the past two premierships, would farewell some mainstays, promote some precocious talent and look to develop the next generation of First XI Oakleigh players. However, a fighting minor premiership and complete team performance in the Qualifying Final against a strong Mt Waverley side had the players daring to dream. Alas it was not to be, with a bitter semi final result that saw us move away from the discipline that had served us so successfully through the first 14 games.

From a personal point of view, with my career well and truly in the twilight if not resembling a Scandinavian summer day extended by several hours, I was thrilled to be given the seal of approval to captain the second XI and follow on from club luminaries and great friends: Benny Drew, Neil Croft, Matt Naughtin and Marcus Spencer amongst them.

My brief was clear and my directive succinct: prepare the younger, hungry and ambitious players to be First XI players. From this perspective the obvious standout achievement of the year was five well credentialed young men making their First XI debuts: Josh Taylor, Josh Knight, Satvik Verma, James Benn and Miles Fabris. Pleasingly, four of those boys are products of our junior program or moved up through the grades with hard work and personal development. Additionally, each display strong leadership attributes and should continue on their upward trajectory in 2018/19 and beyond.

Round 1 was reduced to a one-day fixture after the traditional spring rains reduced the preparation time after the end of football season and began brightly as I won the toss and, much to the chagrin of long term captains everywhere, elected to bowl first. Things were going swimmingly until the umpire called play and then realised he'd locked the match balls in his car...

A breezy start from the usually strong Croydon openers and 7 wides from our openers saw them reach 30 for no loss and a few worried expressions. However that was quickly reigned in as the bowlers found their range and we bowled them out for 99 in the 44th over. Despite a few heart flutters early, we passed the score for only four wickets in just the thirty-second over thanks to some lusty hitting from Miles and Jimmy.

Round 2 bore witness to the most lopsided game I've played in. After pummelling 375 on day one thanks to twin hundreds from Andrew Splatt and Matt Price, we rolled them for just 54 on the stroke of tea. Aaron Lund recorded the remarkable feat of 5/12 with all wickets clean bowled, in a devastating precursor to his stunning first 2nd XI season.

The following rounds continued the winning ways. Importantly we were starting to develop a consistency of performance with all disciplines and not giving the opposition an opportunity to get into the games. Easy wins against Elsternwick and Balwyn and a moral winning draw against Bayswater were followed by a comeback win against Box Hill. This included a few nervous moments when the 9th wicket partnership reached 110 after we'd had them 8/84 chasing 249, but imperious performances from James Benn (with 5 successive scores over 40), newcomer Gareth Campbell (with a stunning hundred), and a lion-hearted spell from Geoff Latham to both set up the victory and come back and deliver it after they'd threatened to steal the game.

Cricket is a rare game that is usually won by the side that can best display team work and a fierce commitment to adhere to a group goal. However, to achieve this relies on individuals to execute with each of the disciplines, often for long periods of time. This is why we celebrate the individual achievements as part of a larger collective, and my overarching message this season was that some players would score more heavily or take more wickets on a given day, and it is the job of the team to support them to the best of our abilities as it would invariably be someone else with the results next game.

A close fought win at Brighton Beach Oval, and then a hard-fought loss to Malvern at home, ended the pre-Xmas period with the Oaks sitting on top of the ladder but not in great form. A disappointing wash out against Endeavour Hills was followed by an undisciplined loss to Mount that was almost salvaged with a 29-run last wicket stand.

A refocus on what worked early in the season saw a stunning outright victory achieved against Moorabbin; despite the opposition's deficiencies, some great signs of accurate, partnership bowling, energetic fielding and confident stroke play had returned. This continued through the last two games: a nail-biter against a powerful Caulfield XI that this time reversed the Mount result with an unbroken 15-run last wicket stand that scored the winning runs in the last over, and a devastation of Noble Park by 10 wickets.

With the minor premiership secured and all four Oakleigh senior teams embarking on finals action, the 2s ventured on their now traditional path of away finals to Mount and produced a stunning 160-over performance. Fighting hard in tough conditions to 2/40 at tea, the platform was well set and Miles Fabris 106* and Connor Byrne 58* capitalised to deliver a professional 4/241cc. Day 2 saw the return of disciplined bowling with all those given responsibility performing admirably as Mount were vanquished for 120 after reaching 2/86. The Semi-Final unfortunately produced an antithesis of the first final, cavalier shots and decision-making reducing us to just 160 on a good pitch with a small outfield. With the ball, we chased wickets rather than sticking to our plans and fielded poorly. All that being said, just one outstanding performance bested us and a year that had low expectations at the beginning finished on a disappointing note but was overall a resounding success.

I'd like to give many thanks to Kristi & Keats for allowing me to continue the Peter Pan life a lot of Aussie males continue well into middle age, to Webby and the board for trusting me in the role and providing support throughout the season, BJ for his outstanding preparation and trusting my judgement, Nicho for his no nonsense approach and ability to cut through emotional decisions with great logic, Shannon for her absolutely incredible dedication to scoring and team managing. I presented a submission to the VSDCA executive during the year complaining about the lack of scorers in Second XI games, perhaps I was just spoiled by clearly having the very best. Tony Raymond for his help with whatever was required on game day, and Wendy with the afternoon tea and drinks preparation. We are very lucky at Oakleigh that people realise that without volunteers we can't possibly achieve what we do on the field. So to all those who put their hand up, thank you very much, it is greatly appreciated.

To my team: Latho and Miles who took on unofficial leadership roles, you both had ups and downs during the year, but are genuine Oakleigh people and I look forward to supporting your careers from here, which will hopefully involve more First XI cricket. Elliot, Satvik, Knighter you've each had a taste of ones cricket and know what is required to achieve at that level, your time is now – remain patient, but with that steely resolve I know you each have. Zac, Lundy,

Jimmy and Con, I probably took some liberties promoting you early from the Third XI premiership side last year, and each of you applied yourselves brilliantly, as I knew you would. Keep working hard, higher honours are just around the corner if you continue to push. DC, not ideal that you ended up with me towards the end, despite me being more than happy to have you, but you've got a lot to give, Jun-Sep is your time to shine. Skadey, who knew what to expect? And I've got to say I was thoroughly impressed with your application to improve, you were an important cog in our success, hope you can make it down under again some day. Cambo, as a mature recruit, especially into an established group, can be difficult. You let your performances do the talking early on and I've got no doubt you'll continue to improve with a couple of minor tweaks. Dyl, JOK, Ed and other blokes in the 3s unlucky to not get more of a look in, we will reward consistent form and that starts in pre-season, I'd strongly encourage you to plan for cricket season starting in July. Go Oaks!

THIRD ELEVEN REPORT

It was always going to be difficult to follow up a premiership and undefeated season but we came oh so very close. Thanks also to my friends and family, in particular Kerri, Hamish, Angus and my father, who still indulge my cricket habit. Lastly to everyone who played in the 3's this year thank you very much, I hope you enjoyed it, learnt something and experienced what a great team the 3's is, I know I did. Don't take it for granted, and whether it is in this XI or another one appreciate the club we have: they aren't all like OCC.

FOURTH ELEVEN REPORT

The 4th XI had 33 players play at least one game this season, welcoming new senior player Neel Saraiya, and new junior players Tom Cashman, Ryan Hammond, Jack Iverson, Prithish Pancholi, Chris Toole and Matty Tyson. For the home and away rounds, we had eight one dayers, four two dayers and one T20, with eleven wins (including two outright) and two losses to finish second on the ladder.

The first game of the season was a one dayer against the unpredictable Croydon. With three OCC debutants in the team, a 57 from Ryan Chapple had us finish with 7/161cc. While Croydon looked on track for a fairly convincing win, the 'Reign Of Terror' combination of Jatin Shah, Darcy Burke and Will Iverson was too good, guillotining 7/27 to lead us to victory by nine runs. Burke followed up on a second ball duck with 116 in Round 2 against Ormond, with solid contributions from Chapple (50) and the middle order in a total score of 316; though we were bafflingly dismissed in only 69 overs. Our fielding was akin to a Hardy Boys story, as "The Curse of the Dropped Catches" let a potential outright chance go begging against Ormond, Luke Doherty the pick of the bowlers with 3/29.

A composed 51* from Dharmesh Patel saw us chase down Elsternwick's 3/100 with the loss of only two wickets in the Round 3 T20 fixture, before Balwyn provided the first challenge of the season in the Round 4 one dayer with a quick fire 3/144 with plenty of overs to bat. The mixture of a late night and a delayed response to an alarm had afforded us with the presence of Nick Thurgood and Daniel Shaw, and it was Shaw's 4/27 blitz that constrained the Balwynites to 9/174cc before Chapple (77*) and Thurgood (47*) combined for a 95 run stand to give us the win. The Round 5 one dayer against the ever-struggling Endeavour Hills was a non-event, with the Hills hoisted again onto fast growing bamboo to mark a painful afternoon as Patel (69*) and middle order bully Anthony Howes (58) delivered 6/220cc before Thurgood (4/38) ripped through the top order to give us a 79 run win.

We faced Bayswater in Round 6, and after batting first saw Chapple's fine form continuing with a glorious 100 from 91 balls, though regular wickets limited us to 9/179cc. An undisciplined line and length combined with an overabundance of extras gave Bayswater a rapid run rate early on, and while we took key wickets to stay in the game, it was an easy victory for them with plenty of overs to spare. The lesson for us in how minimising extras is always among the more important desiderata to win games went unheeded, having Box Hill on the rack at 8/102 before unwittingly loosening the ropes to give them 9/160cc. At 5/70, it was looking mediocre at best before Dave Labrooy (55) and Tom Brasher (42*) brought us to within a whisker of victory, falling short by nine runs in the end.

A good team enmeshes off the field on game day to ensure that all of the one percenters are completed before and after matches. A timely reminder of this principle was made clear before our away fixture against Brighton, where we put on a gritty but promising team effort of 7/190cc (with no score over 36), before our bowling depth of Shah, Jordan Brasher and the returning James Duckett was too good for the Brighton Doilies in a 36 run triumph. A stoic Malvern looked like compiling a large total against us in the final match before Christmas before Brian Grace surfaced as an unlikely hero, taking 4/20 to quell Malvern to 9/130cc. A boring run chase ensued with little risk (just the way I like it), with the returning Rob Howes (44*) in his second game back from a devastating knee injury leading the conquering party, leaving us once again poised for a finals berth.

Our first match in the New Year was finally a two day game (labouring the point I know) against Mount Waverley, where the 1-2 middle order punch of Chapple and Howes formed the backbone of our innings, dismissed for 181. Unable to snare any wickets on the first day, it was the reliable Shah and newfound weapon Grace that combined to douse any potential of a Mount Waverley win.

The Round 9 two dayer (loving it) was surprisingly adjusted into an obtuse split-innings format (not loving it), and it was a dominant performance from Patel (74*) and Burke (48) that had us circling the hapless Moorabbin at 2/177 from our first set of 40 overs. But for one innings of 69, the under strength Moorabbin were bundled out for 97 with the disdain of discarding a used tissue, with wickets shared among Shah, Duckett and Daryl Mendes. A declaration of our first innings gave us an opportunity of an outright win, and the incomparable Duckett (4/25) led the way in overcoming the underwhelming Moorabbin for 104 before Burke and Howes peeled off the required few runs.

Our fixture against local rival Caulfield was an annihilation; imagine a toddler's plastic tricycle being flattened by a car crusher. An extremely young Caulfield imploded under the barrage of pressure applied by Duckett (4/2), Doherty (3/6) and Mendes (3/9), at one stage being an extraordinary 9/11 before the final nail in the coffin at 23. An opening stand of 146 between Burke (74) and Patel on the first day was unfortunately broken, leaving Patel and Chapple to continue the carnage and declaring early on the second day to finish on a demoralising 1/236, Patel with a patient 100* and Chapple with a swashbuckling 57*. Regular programming resumed in Caulfield's second innings of 60, with all bowlers sharing in the spoils of our second outright for the season, putting OCC back in contention for another Club Championship in our last match of the home and away season. An unusually fluent Noble Park raced quickly to 70 before Tyson and that man Grace combined to limit the Parkers to 9/142cc. Any semblance of worry at 1/24 was slowly eroded away as repeat offenders Patel (74*) and Chapple (46*) took us to a marauding win at 1/144, wresting away the Club Championship from Brunswick to take sole ownership once again.

Our thirteenth finals campaign in fourteen seasons began against a renewed Croydon in the quarter final, losing the toss and bowling on a hard Croydon Oval in humid conditions. Numerous dropped catches made for difficult viewing, eventually fighting back from chasing a potential 300 to inexplicably dismiss Croydon for 250, largely due to the lion-hearted Duckett's 6/41 and Kobi Wallis' 3/33. Day Two started disastrously at 3/17, with the main scorers for the year in Patel, Chapple and Burke all dismissed. Enter Brian Grace. The no-nonsense Grace put on a partnership of 71 with Wallis before a couple of quick wickets fell, bringing Duckett to the crease. A 92 run stand between the two ended unfortunately for Grace on 98, but Duckett continued on with support from the tail, whittling down the target to 9/247 with one ball to go. With only a clear two struck on the last ball, the final wicket was a suicidal run out, ultimately falling one run short of a draw which essentially would have been a victory for us as the higher placed side; the weary Duckett finishing on 74*.

Luckily for us, we went through to the semi as the highest placed loser against the fancied Bayswater, winning the toss and batting. After a promising opening stand of 33 between Burke and Will Iverson, their tight line and pressure resulted in both openers subsequent regular wickets falling, with only Brian Grace's battle hardened 76 and a 22 run partnership for the last wicket giving us something to defend, finally bowled out for 177. An opening stand of 75 threatened to sap any life out of the game, but our bowlers dug deep and at 5/117, we were a

fighting chance. The pressure cooker atmosphere applied by Duckett and Wallis in particular saw another twist in the tale, taking 4/14 between them and at 9/165, both sides played intense cricket before Bayswater managed to fall over the line led by opener Dean Connell's 75*; unfortunately smashing the cover off one when on 40 only not to be given by the umpire. But that's cricket. While there was some small solace in that the 4th XI GF was washed out and we would have hence lost to Box Hill who would have been the higher side, it was still disappointing to not win a final this season

I maintain that it is of key importance to continue to maintain the balance between youth and experience with both the bat and the ball in the lower elevens. It's always a positive to see more young talent coming through, and we saw more than glimpses from Cash, Ryan, Prithish, Tooley, Tys, Will and Jack, the youngest player at 12 years old by age group. Throw in the further development of Luke Doherty and Christian van der Merwe, and the OCC has plenty to look forward to.

Notable mentions for the season as follows:

- Ryan Chapple – 584 runs @ 58.4 (HS 100) and winner of the batting average
- Dharmesh Patel – 488 runs @ 48.8 (HS 100), 26 catches & 1 stumping with the gloves, second in the VSDCA Ted Plant Medal (Best 4th XI player) missing by one vote
- Darcy Burke – 275 runs @ 39.3 (HS 116) in only 7 games with us
- James Duckett – 74* (QF) and 25 wickets @ 7.8 (BB 6/41) and winner of the bowling average by a street
- Brian Grace – 98 (QF) and 76 (SF), but more importantly 11 wickets @ 6.5 (unluckily not qualifying for the bowling average, falling 16.3 overs short!) and a host of higher XI experience and advice that the team will be much better for in the long run
- Luke Doherty – 17 wickets @ 18; getting more consistency as each season goes by
- Jatin Shah – 17 wickets @ 18.2; just keeps on keeping on over the years

Thanks to all who have represented the 4th XI this season for your efforts. A special mention to those who came down from higher grades for their attitude towards playing with the 4s. Additionally, to Dharmesh for captaining in my absence in the first two rounds and to the selection committee, the board, the junior coaches and all parents, families, wives and girlfriends.

LEGENDS AND HEROES T20 COMPETITION REPORT

Oakleigh conducted yet another highly successful T20 campaign, albeit falling short of adding to our 4 previous T20 premierships, bowing out at the semi-final stage. Nevertheless, we once again underlined our ability to field a highly competitive team while bleeding the requisite 3 U21 players. We also eschewed the option to play a marquee player in all but the very first game, preferring to play a 4th youngster on other occasions.

Our tournament started with an unlikely victory over Ivanhoe, who had vanquished us to a first round exit last year on the back of a ton from their marquee player. This time around we forged a very solid 6-179 with Sam Jones 55 and Jim Benn 47 the standouts. In reply, Ivanhoe cruised towards victory with another ton, this time from import Sharma, but his dismissal in the shadows of victory saw us put the squeeze on in the last 5 overs and amazingly restrict Ivanhoe to 5-178, handing us victory by a single run.

We backed that up in Round 2 with a comprehensive victory over Endeavour Hills, our 3-175 underpinned by a fine 62 from Andrew Splatt, before 3 wickets from youngster Josh Knight and two from Mick Splatt saw Endeavour's endeavours peter out at 9-139.

We dominated the QF against Croydon, knocking them over for 106 and reaching 0-36 off just 4 overs before torrential rain washed the match out. Amazingly, if just one more over had been bowled the result would have been reached, and we would have had to score 10 and not lose wicket to avoid being eliminated. We dodged that bullet, and it seems there has to be some adjustment to the calculations for interrupted games there.....

It mattered not however as we comfortably accounted for Croydon in the replay 2 weeks later, holding them to 9-96 before winning perhaps a little less easily than we might have, reaching the total with 6 balls to spare at 5-97. 27no from Matt Price saw us home.

We took on the gargantuan task of knocking over Caulfield at Caulfield in the semi with a young side, and we posted a modest 9-106, with BJ 29 and Andrew 20 our only players to get a start. We had a chance at 4-50 with some of their stars out, but they steadied and eliminated us in the 19th over without further loss.

Well done to BJ and the other senior players for taking us through the tournament to the SF stage, at the same time allowing for the development of U21 players such as Josh Knight, Josh Taylor and Zac Raymond

BEN 'SPIKE' PINWILL RETIRES FROM SUB-DISTRICT CRICKET

'SPIKE' is hanging up the spikes.

Ben Pinwill, one of the most decorated and respected players in Sub-District Cricket, has called time after one of the most distinguished careers in the history of the Oakleigh Cricket Club.

The Oaks great retires after 271 First XI games, every outing complete with his trademark sleeveless pullover sweater bearing the club's purple and gold colours.

His two-decade career returned 504 wickets, four premierships, four T20 titles, four club bowling average awards, one club champion gong and an MVP nod.

The 36-year-old also featured in Oakleigh's record six club championships.

Pinwill made no fuss or fanfare of his retirement after the weekend's semi-final loss to Bayswater — the timing wasn't right when Oakleigh had designs on advancing to the grand final.

However, tributes have since flowed on social media from current and former teammates.

Oakleigh president Peter Webb lauded Pinwill's contribution to the historic club.

"He's a legend really, not just at our club but every other club in the association knows him and recognises him as one of the elite players at First XI level," Webb said. "His character is outstanding, absolutely outstanding, he's certainly respected by everyone at Oakleigh and everyone he plays against."

"We're going to miss him something chronic."

Pinwill arrived at Oakleigh in the mid-1990s after missing out on Mount Waverley's Hatch side. The Roos would be ruing one that got away.

He made his First XI debut as a 16-year-old in 1998-99, but Oakleigh's culture of success wasn't always the case in the early days.

"We were a real battling club and there was a year there — my second or third year in the ones — where we only won the two games," Pinwill said.

"It wasn't all as smooth sailing as it has been over the last decade but having said that I've been there for the past 15 finals, 16 finals campaigns.

"Would have loved there to be more premierships, I feel we left a few out there but when you turn up each week and you expect to win, it's an enjoyable way to play your cricket."

Pinwill also follows his brother Toby into retirement after the Port Melbourne Football Club great called an end to his VFL career last year.

"It's just a coincidence, I feel for my parents, they've watched footy and cricket for 12 months of the year pretty much for 25 years," he said.



“It’s going to be a sudden stop but somehow I think they won’t stop supporting Oakleigh Cricket Club or Port Melbourne Football Club.”



Pinwill departs up there with the likes of fellow Oakleigh legends Val Holten, Sam Blackburn, Ron Munyard, Roly Williams, Neil Croft, Allan Stamps and Ron Price.

“Everyone has worked really hard to make sure the club wasn’t taken for granted because if the wrong culture was implemented or whatever it may be, there’s no guarantees a club can survive,” he said.

“We all want to make sure we’ve got a place to go and visit in 50 years’ time, 100 years’ time when our grandchildren can still go down to an Oakleigh Cricket Club, we don’t ever want to lose it and I think that’s pretty important.”

DANIEL JUNKEER – THE GLOVES ARE OFF

Daniel Noel Edris Junkeer made his VSDCA debut in 1998 for Monash University CC. A year after the merger with District club Hawthorn-Waverley, an ill-fated decision to solely run District Cricket prompted a move to Oakleigh CC in 2002, where he played for fifteen seasons before retiring as one of OCC's true greats at the close of the 2016-17 season.

A product of De La Salle College, Daniel's prowess with the gloves had been spotted during the ACC school cricket competition by John Murphy, the 1st XI cricket coach. With his VCE completed in 1997, Daniel commenced a Bachelor of Human Movement at ACU in 1998, during which time he was contacted by Murphy who had signed on as coach of MUCC for the upcoming season.



It's a rare occasion that an 18 year old is called straight into a VSDCA 1st XI side on debut, and it was a shy and reserved Daniel (hard to believe I know) who turned up in his blue VL Commodore Executive for his first game under captain Rod Byrnes. It was a steep learning curve for the young gloveman under the tutelage of Murphy, Byrnes and many other players, but his willingness and determination in these early years were to hold him in good stead for the seasons to follow.

After four seasons, the newly named Hawthorn-Monash University decided to dissociate themselves from Sub-District cricket, leading to an exodus of players to Oakleigh CC; coincidentally the last opponent that MUCC had played in their final season. Along with many other former MUCC players, Daniel made his debut as the 299th OCC 1st XI player under skipper Andrew Wyver, later playing in his first ever final that year and marking the return of the 1st XI to finals cricket.



On keeping ability alone, Daniel was in the enviable category of being one of the best in the competition for the entirety of his career; 19 seasons at the top of his game. The body positioning, balance and hand-eye coordination came naturally to him and the basics were performed effortlessly and with fluidity, making the difficult seem almost pedestrian.

But while Daniel's base level of talent was already higher than others, it was his proficiency to keep up to the stumps for the majority of bowlers that raised him to the upper echelon of keepers, leaving a plethora of batsmen bewildered by the conjuring of a leg side stumping. Many a bowler has bought him more than a few Bacardi Breezers along the way for his undeniable contribution to their wicket tally for the season.

The importance of batting and bowling in partnerships is often referenced by many as the key to success, but an oft overlooked relationship is that between the bowler and the keeper. For (preferably) six balls, the bowler's guile and variation combined with the keeper's pressure to lull unassuming batsmen into a false shot or step was carried out time and time again with good

friend Ben 'Spike' Pinwill, with countless 'c Junkeer b Pinwill' written in impeccable script in the OCC book.

At a VSDCA level, Daniel's record speaks for itself with 386 dismissals (310 catches and 76 stumpings) from his 253 1st XI matches, including the VSDCA record for most dismissals in an innings (7 catches and 1 stumping). He joined other former OCC players Val Holten, Ron Munyard, Hamish Morrison and Pinwill as a member of the VSDCA '200 club', playing his 200th 1st XI game in 2014. It's somewhat of a travesty that he was never selected as the keeper for the VSDCA Team Of The Year, with the recipient not always chosen primarily for keeping ability ahead of runs scored.

A curse of playing with so many talented top order batsmen over the journey meant that Daniel's own prowess with the bat was somewhat curtailed. Typically batting in a tail end position for the majority of his cricket, he put high value on his wicket and was involved in several match winning key partnerships along the way, compiling 1,595 runs at the impressive average of 11.55. That's not to say that he was a tail ender in any sense, given his three seasons opening the batting in the 1st XI when an opportunity was presented. By the end of his career, he had batted at least once in every position, his most famous innings coming in the 2004/05 Group Final against Box Hill where Oakleigh were embarrassingly 4/2 in response to Box Hill's 7/238. After some middle order consolidation and a second batting collapse, Daniel joined Pinwill at 8/188 to graft out a partnership of 43 before the stubborn Pinwill was bowled. A tense period with another former MUCC player Matthew Donnelly ensued, the pair scrambling out the remaining 7 runs in a memorable one wicket win with two balls to spare, breaking a thirty year OCC 1st XI premiership drought; the indefatigable Junkeer finishing on 16* in his first senior flag. Two more flags were to follow in 2012-13 and 2015-16.



A little known fact is that though Daniel did have an interest in keeping in his early junior cricket days (his older brother Darren kept wicket), he was actually a medium pace bowler who took the opportunity to fill in when the usual keeper had a hand injury. That said, he loved a bowl at training (and if the match was over, in games), wildly appealing (always not out) at any given opportunity.

A mixture of good genes, luck and fastidious body management meant that Daniel was largely free of injury during his playing days. His ailments tended to be more extreme rather than standard. In the early years, Daniel kept up to the stumps without a helmet or a mouthguard, resulting in some reconstructive dental surgery on two separate occasions. Three weeks before his wedding, a regulation leave by the batsman from a ball on a good length from OCC's Simon Lewis should have been a regulation head high take for a keeper. I reiterate the 'should have been'. Due to an inexplicable gap between his gloves, his head wore the full impact of the ball, laying him out cold instantaneously on the turf. In better news for me, I did get to turn the siren on in the ambulance.

Daniel seamlessly morphed through all stages from tyro to veteran. His passion, loyalty and commitment to the club were infectious, as was his pursuit of perfection with the gloves, notably bemoaning any byes or ruminating over the rare missed opportunity. Never once reported

(though happy to offer key words of advice to the opposition) and possessing an incisive cricket brain meant that he was the ideal candidate and role model to lead many of the players at OCC, not solely the keepers. He had an 'old school' approach to the game, in that cricket took first priority over everything. He had to forgo many events over the years and would move heaven and earth to plan around matches, abhorring the thought of missing a game to the point of semiconsciously insisting on his hospital bed to a bemused Peter Webb that he'd be fine to play the following week after the incident with the regulation missed take mentioned earlier. Off the field, he is remembered for being the first to bring out the poker chips in the popular days of Texas Hold 'em as well as being a big fan of prank calling other players during the coach's addresses during Thursday dinners.



A lifelong friend to many of the OCC players, Daniel's commitment to his family as a loving husband to Jenny and devoted father to Jazel and Jaxon is to be admired. However, his career would not have occurred without an extremely understanding partner, and it would be remiss of me not to mention Jenny in this discourse.

Significant gratitude is to be afforded to Jenny for her immense support and the innumerable sacrifices she has made as girlfriend, fiancée, wife, mother, friend and business owner over all of the 19 seasons (including listening to all of his blow by blow cricket stories from the days' play) to ensure that he could play the game that he loved.

At the conclusion of his keeping days, the OCC 1st XI had played in 15 finals series in a row (currently at 16 in a row, that pun definitely worth a mention), a period in which Daniel was one of the key contributors in building and maintaining the culture of the team and OCC in general; a factor which I know that he was proud of being part of. Dogmatically routine on game day, his presence in the VIP Room will be missed by those who frequent the inner sanctum of the OCC change rooms.

An excerpt from Rod Byrnes' Captain's report following Daniel's first season at MUCC:

"Daniel put in a consistently good performance behind the stumps with 15 catches and an amazing 6 stumpings. His work up to the stumps was spectacular, especially to medium pacers. 'Junky' has a great future, and if he keeps working at his all round game, he will become one of the elite keeper-batsmen in this competition."

In response to that at the conclusion of Daniel's career, it's fair to say 'quod erat demonstrandum'.

After 284 games across two clubs, Daniel announced his retirement at 37 at the end of June 2017 in the same way that he went about his cricket; matter of fact and with little fanfare.

“The last 15 years and 200 plus games at this club have been a roller coaster of highs and lows. I will be forever indebted to this great club, who through the people in it have shaped me not only as a cricketer, but as a person, teammate, husband & father. I can’t thank you all enough.”

He retired as one of the best keepers that MUCC, OCC and the VSDCA has seen in terms of ability and consistent longevity, a player who got the absolute best out of himself, and who was highly respected by those who played with him and against him. From all the players, members and supporters of both clubs, we congratulate Daniel on what has been an outstanding career at the top level over the last 19 years, and wish him all the best in retirement and the next stage of life.

UNDER 11 MODIFIED RULES REPORT

The Oakleigh Under 11's Team of 2017/18 was looking unlikely to get off the ground. This was mainly due to the introduction of phase 1 of Cricket Australia's new junior cricket formats. As a result several U11 players did not want to play the new rules which were a step backward for them, and they chose to play Under 13s instead.. Some of the changes included:

- Shorter pitch by 3m, reducing length from 18.8m to 16m
- 110 gram soft ball, regressing from the standard 142gm hard ball
- Batsmen do not go out, in the case of a wicket they just change ends and the opposition gets 4 bonus runs.
- 7 players per team

The soft ball was the deal breaker as parents said kids who played previously wanted to play with the hard ball.

The "no dismissal" and "bonus runs" required a new design scorebook and also created a statistical nightmare, but thankfully our numbers man (Roly) kept chasing scorebooks to give the online data the best accuracy possible.
