Ray Moody

Life Member Ray Moody passed away peacefully in November last year at the age of 84. Ray began with the club around the time that Oakleigh was admitted to the VSDCA in 1949/50. No records are available from his first years but from 1950/51 to 1967/68 (18 years) he played a total of 200 games - 63 1st Eleven, 114 2nd Eleven & 23 3rd Eleven.

Ray's playing achievements are significant – he played in the 1963/64 Second Eleven premiership team captained by Oakleigh legend Sam Blackburn, and won the 2nd Eleven batting average in 1956/57 @ 27.78

Ray scored a total of 4044 runs @ 16.71 scoring 13 half centuries & 2 centuries with a top score of 110 no. He only bowled a small number of overs taking a total of 6 wickets but he also took 125 catches & 7 stumpings.

Ray was Treasurer for 2 years - 1957/58 & 1958/59, and was elected a 'Life Member' in 1966.

To all in the Oakleigh Cricket Club family who have lost family members and loved ones during the year, we offer our condolences and our heartfelt support.

To highlight the importance of the program, all of our senior teams had either past or present junior players in their respective line ups. My great thanks to all of the coaches, parents and supporters who contribute to the success of the junior program. Gary has decided to step down from his role after eight seasons, we are forever in your debt Gary, and we wish you and Christine all the best for the future. The club has appointed Tom Facey as Junior Coordinator for the coming season, and we are very confident that Tom will perform the role very capably.

The Under 15 Craig Carnival team was again coached by Ryan Chapple, ably assisted by Satvik Verma. All the boys played well, and had a wonderful learning experience over the carnival period. Special thanks to Rowland Williams and Gary Iverson for attending to the many administrative tasks required. Ryan is an unsung hero of our club, and etched his name into Oakleigh Cricket Club folklore, when he performed CPR on an Endeavour Hills player during a Fourth X1 match late in the season. Ryan saved the players life, and we are all extremely proud of the brave and heroic way that Ryan managed an extremely difficult situation.

I must sincerely thank all of the members of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Board of Management for their tireless efforts in ensuring the club has the appropriate platform in place that is required for achieving sustained success. The board this season consisted of Vice President; Trent Shields, Treasurer, Michael Lawson; Administration Secretary Glenda Splatt; Secretary ACT Allan Stamps; Assistant Secretary; Bruce Dowland; and Board members Gary Iverson, Ivor Donohue, Geoff Latham, Michael Splatt, Brendan McGuinness, Craig Allen and Shannon Kirkby. SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is a pleasure to present on behalf of the Committee, the 141st Annual Report of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Incorporated for the 2020-2021 season.

This season suffered a significant change to previous years with the on-going Covid-19 restrictions that delayed the start to the season, impacted the format of the matches, created a new challenge to all members meeting Covid safe guidelines and subsequently social functions were unable to be held in our usual way.

In spite of these unusual circumstances Oakleigh once again continued its amazing record in finals appearances in all grades. This season all 5 sides not only participated in finals action, but we had premierships in the 2nd XI and 5th XI and won the T20 premiership. A wonderful achievement which reflects the dedication on and off the field by all members of our club.

Our Club coach Brendan McGuinness represented the playing group. Gary Iverson once again headed up the management of the Junior teams and Michael Splatt was the convenor for the Woolworths Blast program for the 4 – 9 year olds. Andrew Splatt faced the often-unenviable task of Chairman of Selectors. A special thanks to our Coach and Captains as they had the added responsibility of managing the Covid guidelines during training and matches.

One of Oakleigh's long term and decorated players, Michael Splatt, registered his 200th first XI game for Oakleigh at the start of the season and was awarded a place in the VSDCA team of the year to cap off another excellent season for the mighty Oaks. However, at the end of this season Michael announced his retirement after 21 years playing with OCC. The OCC board and members wish Michael all the best after an outstanding playing career.

A well-deserved recognition was given to a long time playing and administrative member, Allan Stamps, who received the Cricket Victoria 50 year service award. Allan has been a stalwart of OCC in many capacities and given untiring service throughout, now his 51st year.

An important role of the board is to award Life Membership. The board was pleased to nominate Michael Splatt and Andrew Splatt for Life Membership. Michael becomes just the 64th and Andrew the 65th Life Member of the Oakleigh CC in our 141-year history, and their elevation to this honour is a thoroughly deserved recognition for a lifetime of outstanding contributions both on and off the field.

Michael and Andrew's nomination is also a milestone as their grandfather, Gordon Raymant, was one of 3 members awarded a life membership in 1955.

Trent Shields, Life Member, and a very close lifetime friend recounted Michael and Andrew's career during their time at Oakleigh CC.

A brief outline of Michael's outstanding career at Oakleigh CC is as follows:

- Only the third player to represent Oakleigh in 200 First XI matches
- Four VSDCA Team of the Year caps
- Six Val Holten Club Champion awards,
- One Sam Blackburn MVP Medal,
- One Jack Sheehan Medal,
- Multiple bowling averages
- One batting award
- Numerous T20 best player awards,
- Five premierships medallions with a sixth medal as 12th man in the 04/05 triumph as a youngster,
- Along with a five-wicket haul in a Second XI flag for good measure

In Michael's 325 matches in the purple and gold, nearly 5,500 runs, and 425 wickets, 333 of these in the First XI – placing him 4th overall.

In addition to this extraordinary on-field record Michael has contributed off-field in the following:

- Service on the Board of Management
- Coordination of the social committee,
- Facilitation of the Woolworths Blast Program.

A brief outline of Andrew's outstanding career at Oakleigh CC is as follows:

- First XI Century among three in his career
- Club record opening partnership of 201 vs Moorabbin in 2017/18
- 160 First XI games
- T20 Captain
- 4 time First XI & 5 time Second XI Premiership player
- Ken Fewster Club Championship winning coach

Alongside the many playing achievements, Andrew has also made a major contribution off-field

- Took on the senior coaching role ultimately realising the Club Championship, a record seventh time the Oaks had claimed that title.
- Social positions
- Recent election to the role of Chairman of Selectors.

In response, Michael and Andrew were extremely proud to accept their Life Membership and both spoke with a passion and a belief in the values of Oakleigh, both on and off the field. They especially value the friendships they have forged and emphasised a commitment to the lifelong success of the club.

One of the on-going Board projects, which has been progressing successfully, is the history of the Oakleigh Cricket Club. Many members have now been contacted and submitted their recollections of their time at our wonderful club.

Secondly, the planning for new / improved clubhouse facilities and pavilion has seen initial positive conversations with Monash council.

FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

Another season affected by events outside our control ultimately resulted in 2 senior premierships, plus winning the VSDCA T20. Congratulations to our respective captains & coach for guiding all 5 senior teams to the finals, culminating in those 2 flags for the Oaks & T20 glory – however, off-field – we lost \$2,000 financially.

Income for the year fell by \$1,000 to \$99,000 and expenses increased by \$5,000 - to \$100,000 - a breakdown of material items follows.

Wins for the season included entering a 5th XI team; increased sponsorship from Junkeer Business Solutions, Craig Allen & Associates, and Mortgage Choice; obtaining a number of new sponsors – including Oak Construction, Elite School Photography & Bentleigh Wine Store – which were crucial in us remaining relatively stable in a pandemic affected season as Oakleigh Rotary were unable to maintain their usual \$5,000 contribution, and we lost the Rosstown Hotel's regular \$1,500 sponsorship, also. Hopefully, this will return in 2021/22.

Members' subscriptions totalled \$20,600 for seniors & \$10,000 for juniors, as a consequence of discounted rates following the Committee's decision to help players & families cope with financial constraints, brought on by COVID & the shortened season.

As mentioned above, Sponsorship revenue continued to contribute significantly to our overall result, both from new & our loyal ongoing sponsors. OCC was fortunate again to receive sponsorship from: Murrumbeena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; Junkeer Business Solutions; Allfloors Carpet Gallery; Ray White Oakleigh; Mortgage Choice; Craig Allen & Associates; ICON Sports; Kookaburra; Signarama; Bakers Delight East Bentleigh; Spring Osteo Clinic; Eye Care Plus and Cote Terra. Thanks to all of these organisations, and - especially Trent Shields - for his diligent pursuing of new sponsors such as Bentleigh Wine Store.

Player Sponsor profits increased by \$1,000 thanks to the hard work of Michael Splatt & our players chasing sponsors to help out, in what loomed as a dire season, financially.

Profit from Social Activities dropped by approximately \$3,000 - mainly due to the inability to hold major events following restrictions on numbers attending – this was partially offset by increased Lobster Club returns. Thanks go to those who participated in various Social Activities, whether by running the event, purchasing supplies for the Bar/BBQ, or working on the day. Special thanks go to the finance team of Bettina Latham, Roly Williams & Ivor Donohue, for their guidance & support; & Connor Byrne for running the Thursday night raffles during the season.

I cannot thank Neil Croft enough for organising and recruiting new members to the Lobster Club - which produced a profit of over \$8,000 – due to the first eleven winning an admirable 12 games. Bettina's skills at processing payments, also made my job easier. There were 47 members in 2020/21, & these supporters of the Lobster Club enjoyed a sumptuous dinner in March re the postponed 2019/20 function.

Merchandise inventory levels fell by around \$3,000 in a conscious effort to reduce obsolete stock & hold only necessary/saleable items. Thus, Geoff Latham took deposits from players to ensure only items required were ordered, rather than build up stock levels.

The \$5,000 increase in expenses for 2020/21 was caused by the \$12,000 increase in cricket operations. This was funded by attracting new sponsors

Reductions in expenses included:

- A \$5,000 discount in Ground & Pavilion rent arising from the shortened season
- Hire of training facilities fell by \$2,000
- Substantially lower Repairs & Maintenance spending

In conclusion, continued development of our outstanding junior players, allied with the core of current senior players, is aimed at keeping OCC around the top of the VSDCA ladder.





SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

This season I had the absolute honour of captaining the 2nd XI for the second time, having previously done so for the 2015/16 Season. Over the past 5 years a lot has certainly happened for me personally, and so I was incredibly excited to put into practice a more informed approach regarding how I would go about leading the 2nd XI during the 2020/21 Season.

With the COVID-19 lockdown here in Melbourne making for a very different looking pre-season, it gave me a lot of thinking time regarding how I wanted to approach this season. My approach coming into this season was to focus on maximising the individual strengths of each of the guys in the 2nd XI – rather than worrying about what their perceived weaknesses may have been.

With our matches being reduced to only 40 overs a side due to the impact of COVID-19, it provided us with both positives and negatives. The main positive was that we had an entire season to finetune our game plan given the consistency of the playing format. The negative however was that it often made things quite difficult to provide opportunities to everyone on a weekly basis.

After a dominant performance in Round 1, we subsequently put in two below-par performances that saw us sitting at 1-2 after Round 3. What was of more concern however were some bad traits that appeared to be creeping into our game, both out on the field in addition to off it. A post-match spray after our Round 3 loss to Croydon (something that is certainly out of character for me) appeared to hit home, as we put together some outstanding cricket for the rest of the season where we went on a run of 13 consecutive victories.

During this time our bowling was dominant - no opposition scored more than 157 against us for the entire season, with us managing to restrict sides to less than 100 on 10 occasions. There was no doubt in my mind that we possessed the most well-rounded and consistent bowling attack at our level, and it really showed with sides often blocking out our new ball bowlers in Stampsy and Zac only to find themselves struggle even more against our first change bowlers in Ant and Thari.

From an individual perspective for the bowlers, there really were some outstanding seasons that were put together.

After forcing his way into the side after taking a mountain of wickets at 3rd and 4th XI level over the previous 1.5 seasons, Thari quickly cemented his position by confounding batsmen with his quick top-spinning deliveries. 18 wickets at 9.17, a Bowling Award and plenty of dancing wicket celebrations were the result for the 'King', a truly impressive first season for him at 2nd XI level.

Ant also returned to the 2nd XI after dropping out of the side last year and readily bought into the role that we envisaged for him. No longer taking the new ball but instead playing the role of the defensive bowler through the middle of innings in tandem with Thari, Ant was rewarded for playing this role – 28 wickets at 9.79 is an elite season by anyone's standards at our level, and one that I hope he learnt a lot from regarding the role he can play in a successful side.

The third bowler that I wanted to make mention of was Stampsy. Stampsy and I had a chat prior to the season about the role I envisaged him playing for our side given his position as the leader of the bowling attack. He took the new ball all season and bowled the majority of his overs to the oppositions' best batsmen, giving them no opportunity to ever feel comfortable at the crease and on more occasions than not getting the best of them in their battles. Stampsy really set our

bowling innings up for Ant and Thari to go to work, and had a season that he should be incredibly proud of regarding the selfless role he played for the team.

Prior to Round 13 we had what became known as “the chat” about a couple of areas that we felt needed addressing if we were going to go all the way this season – in particular, the perception that other people at the club had about the 2nd XI (namely that it was an ego-driven side that was incapable of pulling together as a team), and having a clear game plan with the batting regarding what would be a competitive score if we were to bat first.

I honestly could not have asked for a better response from the group. The buy-in from the group was something that we should be incredibly proud of, with the way we played over the following 4 weeks the blueprint for a ‘team-first’ approach.

A resounding 10-wicket win against Malvern in the Quarter Final (where we bizarrely had to restart the game on the Sunday after having them 9/64 on the Saturday, only to then roll them anyway for 63 on the Sunday), preceded what ended up being a nail-biting Semi Final against Croydon.

Having let things slip late in the bowling innings to allow Croydon to find their way to 8/136 (cc), we collapsed badly to find ourselves at 5/47 requiring close to 6 an over to win. Its fair to say that the opposition were relatively confident given some of the comments that were being made out on the field at this point, however the thing with our club is that we are never beat until the final ball is bowled. Young Will Iverson came out to bat with some real positive intent before departing at 6/71, bringing Ant to the crease. Ant played the most mature innings of his career from there, interchanging his trademark lofts over the infield with some very sensible batting to see us home with an unbeaten 43. An incredible win once again for the Oaks, however little did we know what was about to come just 7 days later.

A significant week of rain in Melbourne added another element to the intense nature of GF week, playing havoc with training preparations. Coming up against Brighton, the side that had crushed our premiership hopes in the 2nd XI just two years earlier and was now stacked with 1st XI players, presented an opportunity for redemption like no other. Going into the game we knew that there were several battles at play – their batting line-up (which had been arguably the strongest in the league all season) up against our vaunted bowling attack; our batting line-up (which had shown elements of inconsistency) up against their 5-pronged spin attack.

Interestingly - having won the toss - Brighton elected to bowl first. Whilst I admit that I was likely to bowl first myself, it was certainly a surprising move given the number of spinners they had and the dampness of the wicket early in the game. As we hoped, the ball sat up when their spinners didn’t quite hit the mark, and the positive intent of our batsmen ensured that we took advantage of anything remotely short.

More drama was to come however. Satvik, our mainstay at the top of the order all season (and our wicketkeeper!), tore his hamstring running between wickets. With the assistance of a runner, both Satty (40) and Andrew (41) batted brilliantly to lay the foundation for our score of 8/159 (cc) – a very competitive total.

With the ball we knew that we needed to start well given the firepower that Brighton had at the top of the order. Zac provided this for us, taking two early wickets including the key wicket of Brighton’s opener who had dominated all season (including at 1st XI level). What followed was

a prolonged arm wrestle throughout the middle of the innings as both sides refused to relent and instead see who would crack first. Slowly but surely on the back of some crucial wickets, we took the advantage which saw Brighton suddenly needing 36 runs off the last 4 overs with just 3 wickets in hand. A massive over off Zac however brought the equation back down to less than a run a ball, and in the blink of an eye it seemed that Brighton were in the box seat.

The final over equation came down to this: Brighton required 6 runs off 6 balls to win, with 1 wicket in hand and Zac to deliver it. Dot, dot, single and single followed, bringing the equation down to 4 runs required off 2 balls with their 'in' batsman on strike. What followed will be etched in my memory for the rest of my life. The ball was swatted down to long off, the batsmen turned for the 2nd run, JOK fired in the throw to the bowler's end (where the batsman likely would have been safe), the ball escaped Zac's clutches and went through his legs (or he left it deliberately as he claims – we will never know for sure), the ball snaked its way down the wicket to Pricy (filling in as our keeper in the absence of Satty), who whipped off the bails with the batsmen short by half the wicket as he had stopped to watch events unfold at the non-strikers end. Truly a remarkable end to a remarkable season, with the Oaks the 2nd XI Premiers by just 2 runs.

I could not have been prouder of the way the 2nd XI performed as a team, in particular during the finals series when the whips were cracking. The team-first ethos which perhaps had been missing from the 2nd XI for a number of years became our greatest strength, doing justice to the old adage that 'a champion team will always beat a team of champions'. Everyone contributed to us achieving the ultimate success this season – in particular Jim (in his first season for the club), Will and Knighter who all played selfless roles for the benefit of the team, but were always ready to contribute when needed. The GF was no different where Jim and Will ran like hares between the wickets to finish our batting innings off with real momentum, whilst Knighter came on to bowl late and picked up a crucial wicket. You guys should be immensely proud of the way you conducted yourselves this season – it is guys like you that make our club so successful.

A couple of thank you's to finish:

- To Webby and the board for supporting and providing me with the honour of captaining the 2nd XI side this season.
- To Andrew for your support and guidance, both as Chairman of Selectors and as a friend with whom I could discuss things. I really appreciate all the assistance you provided to me and am thankful that I have been fortunate enough to have you in my side on both occasions that I have captained.
- To our esteemed scorers – Bettina for stepping in on a couple of occasions throughout the season, and of course Shannon who has done it for a number of years now. As I said to you Shan – the weeks you weren't there I found myself stressing a lot more about whether everything had been done, so a lot of what you do would go unnoticed by others. You make my life in particular a lot easier and for that I am very thankful for you volunteering your time to help out.
- Finally to my wife Becky for allowing me to indulge in my passion and in particular captain this season. I very much appreciate the sacrifice you make to allow me to do so and am forever grateful. Thank you.

Thank you everyone for a great season, and I look forward to the journey that awaits us next season!

THIRD ELEVEN REPORT

*'Twas the start of October and all through Oakleigh, the ovals were bare, cricket an absentee.
For COVID had come and starting July, Dan Andrews had stated "stay home or die!"
So we all stayed in and waited it out, whilst the Chairman of Selectors said "see ya, I'm out!"
But then in November a miracle occurred, the virus had left and cricket recurred.
We trained for a week and all kept our distance, for coronavirus was still in existence.
Before we knew it round 1 came around, bowlers don't shine the ball and leave your caps on
the ground.
We travelled to Caulfield and gathered around the wicket, we couldn't believe we were back
playing cricket.*

Firstly, I'd like to thank the board for allowing me to be 3rd eleven captain again this season. It's an absolute privilege to lead a team at this great club and something that I'm very proud of. Secondly, a huge thank you to everyone involved in getting the club up and running and Covid ready. In particular BJ who did an incredible job keeping on top of the constant rule changes in an effort to have us as prepared as possible for round 1. And Glenda Splatt for her amazing work as our Covid safety officer.

Round 1 saw us up against Caulfield. With limited preparation and a few new guys, I wasn't quite sure what to expect. Fortunately it became evident early that we were the stronger side. We bowled Caulfield out for 91. Due to my injured shoulder, Thari took over the new ball responsibilities and took a couple of early wickets for not many. 3's debutant Tom Ison destroyed their middle order taking 3, however our favourite new recruit Matt Bergen stole the show with 3/12 from his 6. We made fairly light work of the chase winning 3 down thanks to Willy Iverson and Pricey with 34 and 28* respectively. We dismissed Noble for 71 and chased the total 3 down with Willy I hitting a very impressive 38*.

Our first home game for the year came against Croydon in round 3. Unfortunately the excitement of playing at home was short lived as we were absolutely hammered. We were bowled out for a measly 79 with Doc and Pricey the only 2 guys to hit double figures with 29 and 17 respectively. Croydon made light work of the chase winning 2 down. Another poor performance the following round against Ormond saw us fall 16 runs short of their competitive 180 total. The highlight of the match was a stunning 60 from 3's debutant Ashwin Mehta. Back at home in round 5 and back to some normality as we made light work of Elsternwick on a tricky wicket. Dharmesh Patel had his concentration levels on high as he carried his bat for 49*, whilst Thari was dominant with the ball taking 4/13. At Christmas we sat just inside the 6.

After the Christmas break we lost a nail biter against a hard hitting Moorabbin outfit, going down by 1 run on the last ball of the match. Needing 17 off the last, Big Ben and Maxxy gave it a huge crack but fell just short. Gareth Campbell made an impressive 47 whilst Bergs and Iso took 3 and 2 respectively. Unfortunately this loss saw us fall out of the top 6, sitting down at 8 on the ladder and really put the pressure on us to make finals. After this though the guys really turned things around, as we went on to win our next 7 games straight! Dyl Brambleby went on a run streak hitting 67 and 45 in consecutive weeks. Big Ben and DK were amazing with the ball, constantly taking 3 fa's and going for next to nothing. Daniel Croft joined the side and bowled an absolute treat, extremely unlucky not to take any bags. We welcomed Josh Knight for a short

cameo with bat and ball, and Nick "The Cartwheeler" Thurgood joined in to absolutely demolish the eventual premiers Mount Waverley with 5/14 off his 8. Old man Matt Naughtin also joined the side and hit a very impressive 41 in the last round alongside a stunning 4/10 from Marcus Allen. Amazingly Dharmesh carried his bat for the second time in the season, hitting 62*. In an incredible turnaround, we ended up finishing the season on top of the table.

Our first final saw us up against our round 1 opponents Caulfield, and as we've been used to the past few years we had to play them away. In a rain affected first day, Matt Bergen who could only play on the Saturday took 3 early wickets and destroyed their top order. Unfortunately though we couldn't get a result and had to come back the following day. We bowled Caulfield out for 82 on the second day, DK taking 3/12 and Big Ben 2/18 in magnificent spells. The chase wasn't so magnificent though as we fell to 6/51 at one stage before Bergs' replacement, Prathamesh Khare, came in and batted brilliantly hitting 20* to get us over the line 7 down. We then matched up against Mount Waverley in the semi. We were fairly confident after beating them quite easily a few weeks before, however we knew it would be difficult on a flat pitch at their home ground. Unfortunately we put in our worst bowling performance of the season as Mount posted a very competitive 7/170. Nick Thurgood the pick of the bowlers picking up 3/28. The chase got off to a great start with Dyl hitting a quick fire 40 before we had a middle order collapse falling to 6/82. Enter the evergreen, never flustered Andrew Donohue. Doc's 46* was absolutely magic, timing his run to almost perfection. Alongside Nick Thurgood who hit a very handy 22 off 18 and DK with an incredible 19 off 12, we took Mount to the last ball of the game, needing a 6 to win. FOURTH ELEVEN REPORT

Great credit must be proffered to major stakeholders, Monash Council, the VSDCA executive and its clubs and also the OCC Board of Management for working tirelessly to even start the season, let alone complete it under such extraordinary circumstances as we found ourselves in during a global pandemic.

From a cricketing perspective I made a decision in the previous off-season which caused quite a dint in my ego, but was absolutely the right thing to do and energised my commitment to the task once we were finally released to get back to playing.

Seeing the opportunity to hopefully closely guide a precocious list of talented juniors towards success in the higher XIs I honestly hadn't even considered the possibility of team success. However, as the finals drew near our team came together beautifully and we played some fine cricket in March under fierce pressure before ultimately just falling short of the grand prize.

While the missed opportunity stung, particularly as we collectively didn't do justice to ourselves with a poor showing on Grand Final day, overall the season was an incredibly fruitful one. As a club we unapologetically aim to win club championships and premierships in every XI, this can negatively impact us at times in the finals as our 2s and 4s are forced to play away from home even after earning important home-ground advantages, and facing other teams stacked with players better than the grade in which they've been selected.

The peculiarity of an abridged season that saw the abandonment of two-day games, but also coloured clothing and white balls saw most teams struggle to adapt to the different tactics required. Oakleigh was no different in this regard, and while our deep bowling stocks allowed for a relatively even attack throughout the 35 overs, there were many times when as a captain I wasn't able to support individuals with a fair distribution of overs in every game. Likewise, from a batting perspective, the 35-over format was counter-intuitive to players whose strength lies in batting time and building an innings. This in turn restricted the potential overs each batsman could face when in a normal year it'd be far less of an issue.

While there were instances of individual disappointment, I praise all players for their acceptance and buy-in to my philosophy of managing the situation as well as possible, and with eight players scoring 100+ runs, and nine bowlers receiving regular overs we were able to achieve one of the vital measurements I identified in pre-season of incremental improvement.

After four matches we sat at 2-2 with a lot to learn and internal expectations that this was about our level, however a stretch of four matches culminating in an entertaining loss to the previously unbeaten Box Hill where we noted several key areas we could improve while remaining competitive with the best in the grade. We were bullied against Malvern in a game where we lost belief in the simple game plan of playing your role, and then our match against Endeavour Hills was abandoned after one of their players, Bihan Weerakoon suffered a heart attack after being dismissed. Fortunately, the fast-acting bravery of our own Ryan Chapple and others literally saved the day and Bihan was able to return to his family and teammates a few days later.

That traumatic incident didn't have any correlation with our change in fortunes on the playing field, but coincidentally from that game forward the players started to believe in the 'play your role' mantra to great effect. Recovering from a somewhat disastrous situation against a Mt Waverley team needing to win to make finals showed great resolve by Marcus Allen, Amit Mehta and Harry D'Rozario, all three for varying reasons with a point to prove and the confidence they each gained resonated with the rest of the group.

A thorough thrashing of Balwyn in round 13 had the team in high spirits entering finals. Unusually we were forced to abandon our Quarter Final match up against Box Hill holding the upper hand on day 1 and move grounds for the reserve day due to a clash with a Women's Premier League fixture. The move to a neutral venue at Walter Galt reserve brought out the best in the young Oaks and we steamrolled the favourites for 115. In response we lost some early wickets but youngsters Luke Ajani, Ashwin Mehta and Diyon De Silva set the tone with some stroke play full of intent and aggressive running between wickets. This was of course followed on by a match winning stand between the experienced pair, Ryan Chapple and Nakul Rao

We moved on to another away game, this time against Malvern who taught us a lesson in our first meeting. Again, we were in trouble with the bat, but an incredibly mature innings by Diyon again, along with some later innings fireworks by Amit saw us achieve a competitive total. An exceptional all-round bowling and fielding effort guided us to the Grand Final, Nakul superb with four wickets, showcasing the undoubted talent we know him to have.

The Grand Final saw an incredibly exciting time, unfortunately however as is so often the case tough decisions were made and extremely valuable contributors throughout the whole year Tom Ison and Amit Mehta were left out of the XII for the returning Marcus Allen and Prathamesh

Khare. The two boys who missed out are incredible clubmen and my experience as captain was so much richer for their efforts throughout the year.

It was not to be however as our batting stumbled and fortune fell on the side of Box Hill on this day, a valiant effort with the ball fell short by only an over or two, but again I stress this shouldn't dampen the amazing strides made by our younger players.

Marcus Allen led the attack for much of the season and deserved his elevation and success to the Third XI late in the year, while nothing is guaranteed, Marcus' commitment is exceptional and if he continues to show the same resilience will become a very good cricketer.

Max Cavolo also made solid contributions in the higher XI and is a very talented player who learnt a lot about his craft this season. Harry D'Rozario adapted his game to whatever I required and was instrumental in almost every game. Ashwin Mehta began the season as a highly talented junior player and finished it as someone who believes he can perform against seniors now. There are more areas from improvement if he is to realise his full potential, but a Fourth XI batting crown and valuable runs in the thirds are a strong start.

Luke Ajani began as an opening bowler, and transitioned to an opening batsman, no one works as hard as Luke and his first two senior half centuries were great reward for his efforts. The longer form of game will suit his bowling more, and his fielding improved exponentially throughout the year as well. Matty Tyson is another who is a pleasure to captain, willing to take on any role, he bowled with great discipline and should be extremely proud of his consistency. Tom Ison returned to bowling and delivered some great spells for his team in both the 3rds and 4ths. It'll click with him like it does with all fast bowlers that the simpler you make the game the better your results.

Cooper, Abhilash and Ansh had brief exposure to the 4th XI and are exciting prospects for the coming year, all three being key members of the Fifth XI premiership. While older heads Ryan, Matt, PK, Nakul and Clint were invaluable in providing me with support and setting a quality example for the younger guys.

Thank you to Greg & Jen, Craig, Ed and Amit for your selfless off-field assistance, without you it would have been far more difficult to concentrate on my primary role of nurturing better cricketers. I'd also like to pass on my congratulations to Rob & Ant Howes and Blake Pearson on captaining premiership sides this season, Oakleigh was a proud history of getting our teams into finals contention, but premierships are extremely highly sought and difficult to win. Congratulations also to Brendan, Alex, Blake & JB on the coaching that brought us to within touching distance of yet another Ken Fewster Club Championship, it's a truly unbelievable record and you all deserve great credit for continuing our high standards. Thanks also to Peter Webb and his board, and Andrew Splatt and his selectors for providing wise counsel and support to allow us to concentrate on hitting balls and taking wickets on a Saturday.

Last but far from least, thank you to Kristi & Keats and all the other families who support us cricketers in following our passion. We're truly blessed as a club to have built such a hard-working yet enjoyable culture.

MICHAEL SPLATT RETIRES FROM SUBBIES

One of the Oaks' greatest players has called it a day after more than 200 matches in the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association.

It was a photo taken after a final last year.

Michael Splatt had just taken 6-20 off 17 overs for Oakleigh against Ormond and was walking to the changerooms, accompanied by warm applause.

He smiled, removed his cap to modestly acknowledge the clapping hands and disappeared from view.

The photo can serve as a farewell image for Splatt now that the champion Oak has retired from Sub-District cricket.

At age 35 he was playing as well as ever: he claimed 25 wickets last season, 42 in 2019-20, 35 in 2018-19 and 32 in 2017-18.



Splatt and Alexander Jones have formed the best new-ball combination in Sub-District cricket for a few years, giving the impression they could protect any total at the Oakleigh ground.



“Tough decision to make but the boys are getting a bit older and I need to think about my family,” he said.

“Sad to give it away, especially with the team going so well. But looking forward to the next part of life.”

A skilled and accurate right-arm bowler, attacking right-hand batsman and sure catcher in the slips, Splatt figured in five First XI premierships for Oakleigh, as well as five Twenty20 titles.

His head turning to the nickname of “Jex”, he played his 200th match in 2019-20 and with his brother, Andrew, gained life membership of the Oaks last year.

The Splatts had joined Oakleigh in 2000-2001.

“Mum’s dad was a life member, Gordon Raymant, and there were no juniors at the time but mum thought she would take us down, and we clicked straight away with Peter Webb (president),” he recalled.

At the age of 19 he was 12th man in that remarkable grand final against Box Hill, when Oakleigh crashed to 4-2 on the Sunday but recovered to run down 7-238.

He played more prominent roles in five other premiership teams, including 2015-16 against Caulfield when he hit hard and straight for a vital 41 not out, then took two early wickets.

In the 2018-19 grand final he and Jones captured four wickets each as the Oaks hustled out Elsternwick for 62.

In the previous season he grabbed 8-9 off 7.1 overs against Moorabbin.

Splatt had made his debut in the 2006-07 season under the captaincy of Jarrod Travaglia and alongside Oakleigh greats Ben “Spike” Pinwill and Daniel Junkeer.

On top of a string of club awards, he was named in three VSDCA teams of the year and won a Jack Sheehan Medal as player of the grand final.

He finished with 213 matches, 358 wickets and more than 3000 runs, many of them made when Oakleigh needed a few.

The last thing a tiring attack operating under a hot sun needed to see was Splatt walking to the creases at 5pm. “I was lucky ... it certainly exceeded all my expectations,” he said of his VSDCA career.



“Played with some unbelievable people, leaders who pointed me in the right direction. Lucky enough to get some rewards.” Splatt said he was fortunate to play alongside Pinwill, Travaglia and captain Brendan McGuinness.

He said he learned a lot from Pinwill. “To watch him bowl day in, day out at training, his metronomic skill, that made me a better player.

“When ‘JT’ (Travaglia) arrived, I was sort of in the twos and he made you believe in your ability and gave you a chance. Just being around that environment ... I was more of a watch-and-learn player, I didn’t really go out of my way to learn off anyone, but I’d watch Spike and even Alex and see how they went about it.”

Champion Caulfield batsman Graeme Rummans said Splatt had been a “fantastic” player.

“Excellent new-ball bowler with his late swing and he’d hit the seam regularly, the same as ‘Jonesy’ (Jones) ... they’re a tremendous new-ball combination,” Rummans said.

“I know as a lower-order batsman he scored a lot of important runs against Caulfield over the years. Really good all-round cricketer, and a fantastic fella too.”
