SECRETARY'S REPORT

On behalf of the Committee, it is my pleasure to present the 136th Annual Report of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Incorporated, for Season 20015-2016.

The Club for some time now has an expectation of multiple Grand Final appearances and a placing at the top of the Club Championship table. Again, we were not disappointed with the outcome against our initial targets: 3 senior teams making the finals, the 1st & 4th XIs appearing in Grand Finals with the 1st XI getting the ultimate prize, the 1st XI again taking home the Grand Final Cup in the Twenty/20 competition and the Club finishing very high in the VSDCA Club Championship was just fantastic and a fitting reward to the hard work put in by all, especially coach Brendan McGuinness ably leading from the front.



A Grand Final win in the Under 18 T/20 and further finals appearances in the Junior Section and the future for OCC still remains bright. Without a doubt, the nurturing & organisation of our junior teams along with continued initiative of the Acorn Squad sees our boys prepared to take the step up to senior cricket. So it is sincere thanks to the junior coaches and managers who are outstandingly led by Junior Co-ordinator Gary Iverson. Gary has of his own initiative arranged special training for the boys and parents at TNF over this winter break to ensure they hit next season up and running. The results of the Junior Section are detailed further in this report.

The Club, of course, was represented in the JC Craig competition again this season and the lads did themselves, parents and coaches proud. This has been covered in the President's report and the JC Craig Coaches own report in this document.

While we lost Jolyon Leaver after one season, we were most fortunate to have Michael Allen come to our club who, apart from being a fine cricketer, is a fine man who slotted straight into the OCC furniture to play with his old mate Jarrod Travaglia for the one season. We wish him well playing in his local competition. Jarrod has announced his retirement from playing but it is

expected that when the horses aren't running he will still remain a valued contributor to the Purple & Gold.

Brent Warren took the reins as 1st XI captain this season and must have thought how easy it was – 2 premierships in the first season – hard to beat but 'the best get better' is the man's motto. We look forward to all of us getting better off and on the field under Brent's stewardship.

I must make a point of the 2nd XI post Matt Naughtin's departure to Qld. Robert Howes took over the reins in only his second year at the Club and did a fine job. The experience he will gain from it will be invaluable.

I recommend you to read the comprehensive reports compiled by the Coach, Captains and Chairman of Selectors contained within this document for more details of the season's performances. The season's statistical information is also contained within and has again been provided by the irreplaceable R C Williams Esq.

On the administrative side of things, there were a few changes in the line up: Peter Webb returned to his old reign as President and took over from John Doig who resigned from the committee. We had hoped and planned to have John as President for several years and to follow on our fine leadership over an extended period. Unfortunately work pressures forced John to cut back on his cricket duties. The previous season, John coached our Under 17 team, coached and managed our Craig XI, umpired VSDCA first XI every Saturday, as well as being president with all the tasks that involved. This massive list of tasks saw John drop the presidency and the Craig coaching roles. Doigy's passion, positive outlook, energy and enthusiasm is greatly missed from the committee. The team line up has been reported in the President's report.

We welcomed the addition of Julie Harrick to the Committee as the representative of the netballers. Julie fitted straight in with zest, passion and with a different perspective which is always needed. The netball teams/girls are now true members of the Club. The girls were the driving force behind a movie night and we look forward to more integrated functions in the future.

All award winners are listed in the Annual Report but a mention of a few special winners needs highlighting:

- Last season the AC Traill Award for Outstanding Club Service was retired and the Committee saw fit that it be replaced with the Allan Stamps Award for Outstanding Service to the Club. It gave me great satisfaction to present the first one to Trent Shields. Trent is a great worker and ambassador for this club and is a very worthy winner. His volume of work is unfortunately not appreciated by most members.
- The Lionel Dickson Award for services to fundraising was won by Geoff Latham. The big fella has stepped up to the plate on many fronts and it is great to see someone off the committee being so involved in our club. Geoff has indicated he will become a committee member this coming season. You have to love his passion! Thursday night lotto will need a new name.
- The DW Nicoll Award for OCC's most promising junior was duly won by Daniel Croft. I'm sure we'll see Daniel put many seasons together in the 1st XI.
- The winner of the VSDCA's Young Cricketer of the Year Award (the Anthony Gale Award) was presented to our own Jordan Brambleby at the Annual VSDCA Hatch Dinner. Well done Jordan.

- On the opposite end of the scale, the VSDCA has named the award for the best player of the 3rd XI in the Grand Final the Allan Stamps Award.

The Committee did not put forward a recommendation for Life Membership last season.

This was the first season since the changes to the Incorporation Act Amendments of 2014 took place. As a result the role of the Secretary has expanded yet further, not only with more compliance/legal activities and reporting, but it has taken over the role of the abolished Public Officer position. I have advised the Club Executive that I will be stepping down from all the general secretarial activities but will remain performing the 'backroom activities' including dealing with Consumer Affairs and the Gambling & Liquor Authorities. We have already completed the necessary paperwork and registration for the ability to run raffles....even (ex) Latho's Lotto is bound by law now. The next thing is to see if we can extend our 'red line area' for where we can legally consume match day drinks outside the confines of the Holten Room.

Therefore I have proposed that the 'legal' Secretary role only be used & named where required and that we name a position of 'Administration Secretary' who will be performing most day to day activities. Similarly, the MyCricket administration & audit will be a separate position now. At the time of writing we have incumbents for these positions but they have not been ratified yet. They need support though!

The Club operations are now just too great for a hard working and aging few and there will be the continued plan of delegating tasks into logical chunks and having committee members concentrate more on managing portfolios as opposed to the random 'filling in the pieces'. Players must take a more active interest in their Club if we are to remain the 'best getting better'.

The Club again fulfilled its obligations with CV for the VCCL and hosted a Division 1 match between Mornington Peninsula & Sale-Maffra on Feb 3. It is fitting that we were allotted a Div 1 game due to the excellent facilities at our ground which are only surpassed by the dedicated hard working OCC faithful who take great pride in the running of these matches.

We have one of the cleanest 'records' with VSDCA and ISEC with regard to following and adhering to the plethora of instructions, compliances and lawful directions – well done to all involved. Our professionalism encompasses the playing field and the Committee room.

The financial dividend we used to receive from Cricket Victoria is over. Again, players will have to run and support more social functions and maintain our sponsors support. The Club had also been very fortunate to secure some government, council and other sporting body grants over past seasons due to the diligence of Matthew Naughtin. As a result of Matthew's departure we need to have someone put their hand up and, if it be, just solely concentrate on seeking these avenues and piecing together submissions. A task that can be done from home! No cricket knowledge required.

Make no mistake, we as a club and the association are facing more and more opposition & challenges. We are supporting the Executive of the VSDCA with the stance of not accepting the Cricket Victoria proposal of the restructure of turf cricket across the metropolitan regions as what has been presented. VSDCA will accept change though, if for the better, warranted because something is wrong and the solution is viable and well planned. The current paper from Cricket Victoria does not support any of this. Watch this space!

On the local level there has been 'informal' queries would OCC consider moving from Scammell Reserve (Guest Rd) to another site to enable the South Oakleigh Sporting Club to utilise the

ground more i.e. let the hard wicket competition use this ground instead of us, perhaps under the pretence more football being played there. Like both of our grounds, this was a site OCC owned but gave the management to the Council of the day. The wickets that RC Williams and co sewed by hand on their hands and knees and then hand watered day in day out!

The irony is not lost on me is that a possibility for a new ground is Clayton should that club not field cricket. This is the club we nearly merged with in 1986 when our administration numbers were so low that amalgamation seemed the only option. Personally, I'm happy to take over Clayton for our 5ths, 6ths and junior turf teams. Scammell Reserve, Guest Rd is as much Oakleigh CC as is the DW Nicoll Reserve and we must never forget that and the cricketers that have grown from it.

Those of you reading this report care for our great club and can contribute just by doing the small things and let the committee do the big things: you have my number.

Lindsay Kline, Oakleigh Cricket Club's only test player, passed away this year. Lindsay's time at the club coincided with an extremely successful period, culminating in our breakthrough First XI premiership as the bowling star in legend Val Holten's armoury. Lindsay remained in close contact with Oakleigh in the ensuing years, notably through his great friendship with fellow Oakleigh premiership star, Geoff Longney. His last official engagement was as a guest speaker alongside Val Holten at the 50 year reunion of the 1963/64 premiership win, his charm and wit on show as always. He left an indelible mark on all of those from the current generation who attended that event.



In 53 matches for Oakleigh, Lindsay took an amazing 233 wickets at 10.59. He took 5 wickets in an innings 15 times and had best bowling figures of 7/19 against. Ivanhoe.

Lindsay played 13 Test matches for Australia and took 34 wickets at 22.82. His best bowling figures were 7/75, versus Pakistan at Lahore in 1959. Lindsay is one of the small number of test players to take a hat trick. Lindsay faced the final ball from Wes Hall in the tied test between Australia and the West Indies in Brisbane in 1960/61.

COACH'S REPORT

In July last year, we assembled at the Val Holten rooms to outline our plans for the season ahead. After enduring the pain of successive Grand Final losses, our attitude and approach to the upcoming season could go one of two ways – embrace the challenge, work harder than ever and go one step further, or be satisfied with our performance and accept that our best isn't good enough.

We embraced the challenge. We committed to doing the hard work. We succeeded.



Early in the preseason we enlisted the services of Andrew Horsfield to help us dissect our approach to training and game day, and identify what was required to elevate the group to a new level. The sessions were informative and collaborative, and truly tested our thinking and approach to everything we do. A real eye-opening experience, the group walked away with a greater sense of self-awareness and ownership.

We needed to stand for something; a motto to live by - The Best Get Better.

We attacked preseason with the determination and energy you'd expect from a club with something to prove. A move to Maddocks Sports provided a much needed change of scenery, which was well received! The President doubled as Net Captain at every session, and player numbers were excellent. The expectations of the playing group continued to rise.

Our batting received a much needed injection of talent over the off-season, with Sam Jones returning from Premier Cricket, the return of Jarrod Travaglia, and the addition of high-profile recruit Mick Allen.

We welcomed a number of new faces to the fold and said goodbye to a handful of players, however the quality and depth of the playing group remained constant – ensuring we were well placed to push for the title once again.

Practice matches against Prahran CC, Balwyn CC, Kingston-Hawthorn Hawks CC and Mt Waverley CC had us primed and ready for the season ahead. Team bonding and dance floor antics were at the fore over the 3 weekends. No-one forgot their whites, and only one person ended up fully clothed in a pool.

Over the course of the season, all XI's showed glimpses of their true potential. It's exciting to see the progress of our younger players – Alex Ross, Daniel Croft, Jordan Brambleby, Matt Price, Daniel Shaw, Geoff Latham and Luke Rhodes – to name a few. An extremely talented group of young players pressing for regular 1st XI cricket, with an opportunity to take Oakleigh CC to even greater heights in the years to come.

Ably led by Daryl Mendes, our 4th XI had another extremely successful season. To reach a Grand Final is a fantastic achievement, and to do so with such a young and inexperienced side is simply brilliant. The combination of youth and experience continues to bode well – the 'wiser heads' in Daz, Chaps, Foss and Dharmesh provided the valuable experience required to win games from any situation. Pleasingly, a number of younger Oaks are starting to make their presence felt at senior level, with Darcy Burke, Max O'Driscoll, and Liam Sherlock showcasing their talent throughout the season. Definitely keep an eye out for these boys in the coming seasons as they make their way up the grades.

Conversely, it was a tough season for the 3rd XI, losing captain, Andrew Donohue after only 4 rounds. We put the call out, and Trent Shields answered - stepping up to lead the young XI for the remainder of the season. Unfortunately, we struggled to maintain composure in pressure situations, narrowly losing a handful of games by less than 10 runs – ultimately costing us a top 6 finish. FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

Season 2015/16 was both a financial and on field success resulting in the Senior XI premiership and runners-up position for the Fourth XI; plus, at junior level, the U18 T20 premiership –and the U17 Holten team were runners up.

Our result was a \$17,550 profit against a budgeted figure of \$1,200.

Income for the year rose significantly (up \$15,000) to over \$114,000 with social functions and increased sponsorship the main factors, while expenditure dropped (by \$7,000) to \$97,000 mainly attributable to not spending \$11,500 on synthetic wickets this season.

Wins for the season included obtaining sponsorship from the Rosstown Hotel; increased sponsorship from the Murrumbena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; \$5,000 transferred to the Term Deposit account; and a Committee initiative enabling the younger members of the club to decide on, and organise social events.

Special thanks to Geoff Latham for his running of raffles and managing of various tasks associated with event operations.

Members subscriptions were kept at the 2013/14 rate, netting \$20,715 for seniors and \$14,980 re juniors.

A major contributor to the improved end of year position was revenue from sponsors. Magnificent backing was received from our supporters Rotary Club of Oakleigh, Sign*A*Rama (Oakleigh), Allfloors Carpet Gallery, East Bentleigh Bakers Delight, Mortgage Choice Oakleigh, Your Local Telecom, Spring Osteo Clinic and Ray White Oakleigh. A big thank you to all of these organisations, and Trent Shields for his diligent pursuing of sponsor payments.

Player sponsors were \$500 over the 2014/15 amount received; thanks to players and their sponsors.

Refreshment sales, raffles and fundraising activities again contributed to boosting the Club's financial position. Thanks go to those who participated in these revenue generating activities, whether by purchasing supplies for the Bar/BBQ, or working in these areas. Special thanks go to the finance team of Roly Williams, Ivor Donohue & Steve (Irish) King.

I am again looking forward to the magnificent support of Neil Croft in organising (and potentially recruiting new members to) the Lobster Club, and Roly for processing payments, as the proceeds generated increased by over \$2,600 on 2014/15.

Club members and supporters who subscribed to the Lobster Club enjoyed a sumptuous dinner in April, thanks to the First Eleven winning 13 games, including that memorable Grand Final Fund raising activity profits rose by around \$7,000 (mainly due to 2 successful social events – a Trivia Night + International Beer & Food Night - being held in 2015/16), and the higher Lobster Club proceeds mentioned above.

Thanks to attendees at these functions, and to those responsible for assisting and/or organising the events. A report showing the results of these activities is included with this report.

Fortunately (due to the items mentioned above and the hard work of members and supporters in the past) the club is in a healthy financial position, as the \$9,000 VCA Administration Grant is scheduled to end next season, leaving us with a major income shortfall.

Efforts will be made to attract government grant funding in the new season, to replace some of this lost income.

Coaching/Professional Player fees and expenses increased by approximately \$8,000 mainly attributable to costs associated with the development coach appointment.

Ground & Pavilion Rent dropped by approximately \$3,000 as a result of delays in receiving Monash Council invoices each season – then making revisions to correct Council errors (detected by Roly) - resulting in over-estimating the 2014/15 expense, combined with not as many junior teams making the finals this season

Umpires fees fell by \$2,000 because several rounds were cancelled due to wet-weather & even one "heat-out". An early Easter meant one less playing day being scheduled, also.

With less junior teams playing finals, umpire fees dropped accordingly, and the 3rd eleven did not play finals which in itself reduced the amount by \$560 (4 days @ \$140).

Ending on a positive note, with new recruits and Gary Iverson's junior production line continuing to provide talented players, the aim is to keep the mighty Oaks on top of the pack, again!

SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

Being in my first season as captain and taking over from someone who commanded such great respect around the club in Matt Naughtin, I knew that it was going to be a big challenge – one that I was very much looking forward to.

Coming off back-to-back premierships in the 2s, the goal of the side remained the same – to once again make it to another Grand Final and give the club a rare opportunity at a 3-peat. The side changed a lot from last year's premiership winning team, with only 4 members of that side finishing off the season in the team. Losing Naughtin x2, Rhys Allard, Will Taylor, Jordan Brambleby and Geoff Latham for half the season through injury was always going to take a lot of experience away from the side, but what it presented was an opportunity for younger guys to step up and take their chances.

This season saw the likes of Luke Rhodes, Daniel Shaw, James Duckett, Dylan Brambleby and Tom Corrie all demonstrate at various stages that the future of the Oakleigh CC is a bright one. All put up strong performances throughout the season, culminating in Rhodesy's outstanding innings in the Semi Final loss against Malvern – compiling a magnificent 53 opening the batting that belied his young age. The secondary purpose of the 2nd XI outside of obviously winning matches is to help develop the future generation of 1st XI players. There is no doubt in my mind that these guys can follow in the footsteps of recent 1st XI additions in Jordan Brambleby and Matt Price and play key roles in the 1s in the future.

With a few new additions to the 1st XI, we were also very fortunate to attain the services of Alex Ross and Andrew Splatt for the entirety of the season. The many years of 1st XI experience that these guys brought was a major boost for our young side, with both being our two most consistent performers across the season with both bat and ball. The years these guys had and the way they responded to coming back down to the 2s was a credit to their characters, being able to put any disappointment they held behind them to contribute significantly to our team throughout the season.

Ultimately, our side fell 9 runs short in the Semi Final against eventual premiers Malvern (who we defeated in last year's GF). The disappointment written upon every single one of the guys' faces following this loss showed just how much it meant to us, knowing that we'd let a great opportunity slip after coming so close. There is no doubt in my mind that we clearly had enough talent in our side to win the premiership, however as we have seen over the last few years – talent only takes you so far. Finals are often won on the back of guys 'digging in' and being prepared to fight to turn the match back in their team's favour. This is certainly something that I know the boys will learn from and use both next season and in seasons to come when they find themselves in similar positions.

The batting this season in the 2nd XI, as it was throughout the club, left a lot to be desired in terms of both application and performance. A common theme throughout the season was the inability of guys to adjust to different conditions, and be prepared to tough it out when things were not all in their favour. Without doubt the most disappointing batting performance for the season was when we lost 20 wickets in the course of one weekend to have a 'reverse-outright' inflicted on us. Whilst there was a bit in the pitch for the bowlers, it was certainly not a wicket that justified such a performance. Many lessons I am sure would have been learnt from that disappointing weekend, something that was demonstrated as early as a week later where we managed to make 6/320 (including two centuries) against Moorabbin after being in a precarious position at 4/38. Alex Ross, Sam Jones and myself were all able to post centuries this season, a positive sign that guys are more than capable of playing that long innings if they stay focused and refuse to be content with a start.

Our bowling this season really carried us, helping us win matches that we had no right to even be in contention in. The best bowling performance of the season, in quite possibly the best win I have been a part of, was against Caulfield in Round 12. Defending just 135 on a slow outfield, and with Caulfield in a strong position at 4/101, Alex Ross and Daniel Croft put on an incredible display of partnership bowling that saw us get over the line by one solitary run. With figures of 23-11-2-27 and 22-12-4-27, it highlighted

the maturity of these two in being able to execute a plan perfectly. The bowling unit as a whole were able to do this on this day, with hardly a bad ball bowled in those 81 overs. This became the blueprint for us for the rest of the season, with such a simple game plan helping focus our bowlers on what they needed to do to get us over the line. The amount of talent the club has in its bowling stocks made things a whole lot easier for me, knowing that I could turn to any one of these blokes and know that they would be able to perform the job expected of them.

Being a first year captain I could not have completed the role without assistance from the following people:

- Richard Blaze for once again being our team manager and giving up his Saturdays to help out where needed and provide experience to both myself and the team;
- Webby and the Board for giving me the opportunity to captain the side this season. Your faith in me really meant a lot and I am very grateful for the opportunity you provided to me;
- BJ, Mitch, Rabs, Shieldsy, Doc and Daz for providing me with assistance and experience both at selection and throughout the season to help make things a lot easier for me;
- Norto for all his advice at the start of the season. Losing you after only a few games was a big loss for not only the side but me personally, but your support throughout the season was very much appreciated;
- The parents that came along and supported us each week, in particular Gail and Neil Price who could always be relied upon to be there to both support and help set up afternoon teas every week (the 2s will miss you guys from now on!)
- Geoff Latham for being my go-to person who I could always rely on, whether it be to bring gear to the matches or to help organise covers. Your influence on the team once you returned from injury really showed how much you are the heart and soul of the 2s; and
- Andrew Splatt – as I have said to you both publicly and privately, I could not have completed the role without you this season mate. With the amount of experience we lost - compounded by the loss of Norto - you really stepped up and took on a much more senior role in the side. You were a constant source of support for me and were able to provide me with assistance whenever I required it, something that I am very appreciative of. Thank you again for all your support throughout the season.

Finally, I very much enjoyed my first season as captain of the 2nd XI at Oakleigh. Being a leader is something I really wanted to take on and whilst it was certainly challenging at times, it was definitely something that I felt I improved upon the longer the season went on. Seeing the reactions of the younger guys when informing them of their promotions to the 2s is such a fantastic part of the job, albeit often being due to a tough decision being made on someone else. Captaining a talented bunch of guys certainly made my job a lot easier and was a role I really enjoyed fulfilling. I look forward to seeing the growth and development of all the guys I was fortunate enough to captain this season in the years to come.

THIRD ELEVEN REPORT

This season offered much promise following on from the burgeoning performances of a core group of younger players in 2014/2015. But while most importantly the club as a whole benefited from this growth, from a third eleven perspective (and from a personal perspective), this season was disappointing in terms of the lofty goals we rightly set at OCC as we took a bit of a backward step this year. Though we were still a chance to make the finals come the final round, we were ultimately unsuccessful, the only senior team not to make the finals, and finished the year 9th with five wins (one outright), two draws and six losses. The bitter blow was worsened by finishing just one 3rd XI victory away from claiming an unprecedented sixth club championship title. Probably a realistic representation of where we sat in the grand scheme of things. It was a year of ups and downs with some top notch performances as well as some disappointing ones, and overall the year was characterised by a lack of consistency.



Firstly, and for the first time in many seasons, we had an inconsistent core playing group. Over the last few years the thirds have had a remarkably stable group characterised by low player turnover (especially for a club's third eleven) and over half the team playing in more than ten games per season. This year things were a little different with injuries and unavailability, in both the thirds and higher elevens, meaning it was almost impossible to put a regular team on the field and resulted in 30 players coming through the team and only two players playing more than ten games in the team. This team fluidity told in our results.

We were inconsistent on the field. There were some close losses to Balwyn (less than ten runs, though perhaps this was a bit flattering), Elsternwick by six (a great effort chasing 241), and Bayswater by four. Draws against Malvern and Moorabbin possibly evened out on the ledger. But good solid wins against Box Hill, Ormond, Brighton, Noble Park and Caulfield were tempered by bad losses against Endeavour Hills, Mount Waverley and crucially against Croydon in the final round. Only one win and two close losses against teams in the final six told the tale that we were not able to compete with the better teams for whole games.

Inconsistent individual performances from the playing group, particularly in the batting, let us down this year. Disappointingly no one qualified for the batting averages and competition wise our highest performer was 62nd whereas last year we had 5 in the top 20! I believe this is the most important aspect we as a team need to address to ensure continued success. The coaches' message throughout the season was simple, place value on your wicket, too often we didn't do that and good starts or recoveries were thrown away through lack of temperament. The credo that propelled the First XI to three stunning finals victories was 'get to ten', our 3rd XI batsmen would be well advised to buy in to this resolve as it will be equally successful in the lower elevens.

Our bowling was again a strong point and was crucial in a number of matches however it too was a little down on previous seasons with only Trent Shields and Anthony Howes in the

competitions top 25 compared with five bowlers last year. Again too often the good work of one or 2 bowlers was counteracted by the inability of the rest of the attack to sustain pressure.

But while the results didn't pan out for the team as a whole there are some real positives for individuals, team and club. The 3's provided a number of players for higher 11's (which is one of its primary roles after all) with more than sixteen players from the thirds from this, or last season, playing in the seconds at some point during the season and more importantly having an impact at that level. Nearly all of them were young players (e.g. Corrie, Brambleby, Braganza, Benn, Duckett, Rhodes, Howes, Shaw, Wallis, Anselmi) who will provide the backbone of the senior 11's in years to come. Dylan, Daniel & Luke in particular showed temperament and skill beyond their years in match winning innings throughout the season which thrust them confidently into stints in the higher XI's. We welcomed new players to the fold with Michael Cummings, Tom Brasher and Anthony Howes joining the team at various points and making valuable contributions both on and off the field.

The youngsters keep stepping up. Max O'Driscoll made his senior debut and then headed into the 3's where his great control was a shining light, David McCarthy got more game time this season, and if not for injury would have been a key contributor in our run to the finals and for the second year in a row we unearthed a talented young keeper/batsman in Jarryd Raffa who stepped up after Luke Rhodes headed to the 2nds.

It was also great to see the return of club and subbies legend Barry Ensil whose talent, experience and professionalism was a huge bonus for the group. One of the best moments of the season was the energy and excitement the younger players exhibited playing with Baz. Hopefully we can coax him back for some appearances next year - his ability has certainly not wavered over time. We also saw returns from Kobi Wallis whose top order consistency was invaluable early before getting promoted and establishing himself in the semi-finalist 2s. Ever so briefly we saw a long overdue return from the Chairman of Selectors himself Andrew Mitchell.

From a personal perspective it was an extremely disappointing and frustrating season after my inability to control a bike resulted in season ending injuries. As a consequence, my biggest thanks most certainly have to go to Trent, who was metaphorically and literally catapulted over the handlebars into the captain's role and did a fantastic job. The atmosphere, cohesion and sense of purpose he brought to the team was a joy to watch.

Again a huge thanks to Shannon for not only scoring, but doing such a good job of it and on top of that helping out with all sorts of off field tasks and putting up with the whole group for another season. Thanks to Scammel's curator Paul Orchard, Roly, Michael Lawson, Allan Stamps, Darryl Mendes, Glenn Shaw, BJ, Rob Howes and of course Peter Webb and his board for all ensuring things run smoothly at every level. Everyone in the team appreciates parents, siblings, kids, friends, colleagues and club mates acting as taxis, coming down and supporting, having a chat, helping out and pitching in. It is what makes the OCC such a great club. I'm looking forward with much anticipation to 2016/17.

FOURTH ELEVEN REPORT

The 4th XI had 29 players play at least one game this season, welcoming new OCC senior players Cameron Bishop, Anthony Howes, Sam Le Lievre and Joachim Rymarz, and junior players Max O'Driscoll, Liam Sherlock and Satvik Verma. For the home and away season, we played seven one dayers and four two dayers, winning ten games to finish third on the ladder in a very tight top six.

The first game of the season was a one dayer against Balwyn, a team new to the SE group in the 3rd and 4th elevens. After losing two early ones courtesy of debutant Anthony Howes, Balwyn steadied to 4/74 before losing an extraordinary 6/0, Darcy Burke the chief destroyer with 4/4. The 75 runs required were brought up in 25 overs in a no-frills fashion, and as a team, we were once again on our quest for a long overdue flag akin to the Argonauts on their quest for the Golden Fleece.

The second round for the 4th XI (and for the entire club) was all about celebrating the 500th game of Allan Bruce Stamps, one of the few to reach this milestone in any cricket association. Thanks to David Long and the Elsternwick Cricket Club for agreeing to alter the fixture to play this match at W.A. Scammell Reserve. We amassed 206 on the first day (A Stamps 0*), with a 115 run partnership between Chaps and Forba before Stamps Junior and Senior opened up together to close out the day to the strains of 'Cat's In the Cradle'. The wickets were shared around on the second day to dismiss them for 113, with a typically frugal 12/7/1/6 from Al.

Round 3 was an exact copy of Round 1, just against a different enemy as Ormond were skewered for 74 before Dharmesh Patel and Ryan Chapple compiled the bulk of the runs in a measured performance to see us home, and settled in the upper echelon. Early wins in the season are really about which team is better prepared, and to have the team win three out of three was heading more in the direction of Jacob's ladder than Dante's Inferno.

Rounds 4 to 6 showcased the burgeoning talent from some of the junior brigade that we are blessed to have at Oakleigh. After batting first in the one dayer against Bayswater, Dylan Brambleby and the ubiquitous Burke put on an opening stand of 149, devastating the Bayswater bowling attack. Brambleby continued the onslaught, exponentially increasing the boundaries to end up carrying his bat for a well-deserved 124* as we finished up at 6/198cc, winning comfortably by 51 runs.

Round 5 was one of the best wins of the home and away season. After looking down the barrel at 7/86 against a disciplined Box Hill attack, enter *wunderkind* Matthew Wilson. With great composure, he slowly compiled his innings and began to dominate the attack with Max O'Driscoll as they put on 71 for the 8th wicket. Wilson continued to rapidly accelerate as the innings came to a close, achieving his maiden century for OCC (117*) as we finished up at 9/238cc. This was one of the most measured (and chanceless) innings ever played for the 4th XI, as Box Hill could do nothing but watch on in disbelief as their valiant efforts hitherto were quickly distant memories. Our bowlers made easy work of the hapless Box Hill line up to remain unbeaten after five rounds.

Round 6 against Brighton was a real let down given the juggernaut that we were for the first five rounds. After having them 6/85, we let them back into the game with a lack of intensity both with the ball and in the field. However, O'Driscoll's control and turn (who could forget that wrong 'un) prevented a huge chase, taking 5/32 as we dismissed them for 176. However, after being 2/84, our bats couldn't follow through and we were caught short by 25 runs. This was disappointing,

made even more so as the Round 7 fixture for the 3s/4s was called off by the VSDCA due to extreme heat.

The new year was heralded with a gutsy victory against the unpredictable Endeavour Hills, who blasted 196 from their allotted overs on their Barbecue Shape-sized ground. Dharmesh's heroic 86 combined with the wily Brad Nicholson's swashbuckling 45 got us to within two runs before a last ball boundary (another Jatin Shah special) sealed the win. A strong 51 from Chaps won the one dayer against Mount Waverley before both weeks of the Moorabbin game were unfortunately washed out. A clinical victory chasing Noble Park's meagre 66 followed in the penultimate one dayer.

The victory against Caulfield was not only satisfying on a team level, but also on an individual level. Darcy Burke continues to go from strength to strength in all facets of his game after announcing himself in that memorable semi final against Caulfield two seasons ago, and this was the pinnacle. Opening with Dharmesh, the pair put on 207 before Dharmesh was dismissed for 82, breaking the previously held Oakleigh 4th XI first wicket partnership of 176. Darcy continued on to 105, his maiden century for Oakleigh and a moment that we as a team have been waiting for in earnest. 5/272dec was always going to be a winning score, though our attempts at an unlikely outright were thwarted.

The final home and away game was once again dominated by the Burke/Patel opening combination, who calmly chased Croydon's 120 without breaking a sweat. This meant another finals campaign for the 4th XI, our eleventh in the last twelve years, playing Croydon inexplicably at Endeavour Hills. After Gary Iverson's 5/15 decimated Croydon to 8/57, we let the young Croydon team back into it, finally securing the last two wickets for 126. Of course, it would not be a 4th XI finals series without the standard zeitgeist, as we slumped to 7/80. It was O'Driscoll (33*) who saw us home, working under immense pressure with the tail and securing the win with Iverson from a precarious 9/117.

We played an experienced Brighton in the semi, who were put in on an uncertain Scammell wicket. This turned out to be the right decision, as the bowlers systematically dismantled a strangely fragile line up for 97, Iverson continuing his rich vein of form with 4/27. I'm unsure what was in his Kool-Aid, but Brighton's J Jones singlehandedly turned our jubilation to horror by taking the first five wickets as we slumped to 5/6. Burke and Nicho took us to 64 before Darcy fell, and we finished the day poised to strike at 6/84. Eleven runs from the second over of the day (including a memorable pull shot from Aaron Lund) saw us pass the score without the loss of any further wickets, with Nicho (51) and Lund (38) the match winners in our score of 143. Brighton's decision to throw the bat for a chance at the reverse outright was short lived, finishing at 6/28.

For the third time in a row, the team had deservedly made it to a Grand Final, playing Bayswater at Scammell. Bayswater batted first on a slightly damp deck, and the bowlers did the job as a rampant Aaron Lund (4/24) and Gary Iverson (4/27) tore through the formidable line up to leave a shell shocked Bayswater all out for 102. Of course, capricious Fortuna provided a slight change in plans as we once again slumped to 4/23 overnight, and were unable to muster a final heroic saga to take the points, being all out for 68. We had no option but to go for the reverse outright, but after Iverson's two early wickets, the game petered out to a Bayswater victory. Congratulations to Andrew Wheeler and his team for their efforts.

It was fitting that in his last match, Allan Stamps was 1* with the bat and bowled the last over (a maiden) of the game with keeper and nine slips in a fitting tribute to Allan's career, which has

been recognised by the VSDCA by honouring the best player of the South-East 3rd XI Grand Final with the Allan Stamps medal. Excellent form from the Bayswater lads to be part of the guard of honour after speeches were completed as well.

Three Grand Finals in a row for three losses is very difficult to accept, especially this one where we had completely outplayed the opposition in the first innings and had plenty of batsmen in form. But good teams find a way to win, and they were better than us when it counted. Definitely lessons learnt there. But the exciting part of the year was definitely the continual development of quality juniors and young senior players, many of whom will hopefully play 1st XI cricket.

Apart from those highlights mentioned earlier, a few other mentions:

- Darcy Burke – 282 runs @ 40 and 10 wickets @ 19; a deserved winner of the batting average and while we are all fans of Sue Burke’s scones, your time in the 4th XI is done
- Gary Iverson – 26 wickets @ 8; that 15 of these wickets came in finals shows the type of big game player that you are, thanks for your support on and off the field
- Dharmesh Patel – 399 runs @ 36, 25 catches with the gloves; an excellent season with both bat and gloves, thanks for your support and filling in during my absence
- The guys from higher elevens; the likes of Geoff Latham, Michael Cummings, Kobi Wallis, Matt Stamps, et al showed us why you’re in the higher elevens, but thanks for being willing to play in the lower grades to help us and the club
- Lastly, Allan Stamps – 512 games, just short of 950 wickets, where does the time go? I bet Sue knows. While it was unfortunate that we couldn’t send you off with a flag, you have been one of the smartest bowlers the club has ever seen, and your sense of competitiveness up to the last ball shows why you are respected by most other clubs as well as us. In addition, you’ve played as large a role as any with the development of many of the junior and senior players current and past at the club (sometimes whether we liked it or not!) Thanks for your support on and off the field, especially during this finals series. You will be missed in the dressing room...I mean who will players go to for a spare hat now?

Thanks to all the players who have represented the 4th XI, all who have provided advice to me over the season, the selection committee, the OCC board, the junior coaches and all parents, families, wives and girlfriends. Well done to the 1s on winning the flag after two years of heartache.

Spike and Tricky bowled the first 5 for just 0-16, which could have been better but for a grassed chance in the first over. Croydon improved to 2-51 after 10 courtesy of the wind, but after 15 were 5-72, needing 51 downwind off the last 5 to make the final. When the 16th over – bowled by the “ice-man” Jordy Brambleby, went for just 5, the fat lady was sighted. This proved premature however after the 17th went for 12. Jordys 2nd over was again superb, snaring two wickets and going for just 6.

Croydon needed 28 off 12 With Spike to bowl the 19th OCC supporters felt very comfortable, but a Croydon hitter got hold of two deliveries for big Zaks to set OCC heart rates accelerating madly as the over went for 18. With one over left Croydon needed just 10 to edge us out of a game we had looked to have won for most if not all of the 39 overs bowled. Jordy's icy veins were barely stretched though as he delivered the perfect final over, 3 consecutive yorkers denying the Croydon striker any air to get under the ball. So its off to yet another T20 GF for the mighty Oaks, our 6th appearance in the Grand Final in just seven seasons of T20 cricket. (In the other season we were narrowly beaten semi-finalists as well). The final is at a date and venue TBA, possibly Wednesday 10th, probably a central ground somewhere between Brunswick and Oakleigh like Balwyn Kew, Malvern Caulfield or Ivanhoe perhaps. We will wait and see.

“Our T20 Cups Runneth Over” from ‘The Outer Eye’

The mighty Oaks are T20 Champions. Again For an incredible 4th time in just 7 years, we have secured the Legends and Heroes T20 Cup, this time accounting for Brunswick easily in the decider, played serendipitously at our own Warrawee Park Oval on Tuesday.

After the scheduled final was delayed due to inclement weather at Altona, both finalists submitted proposals to host the game.

In their wisdom, the Subbies executive opted in our favour, and it was on a wintry Tuesday night that we played host for the big game.

The weather had done us no favours, with gale force winds blowing the covers off that morning, allowing an alarming amount of rain onto the pitch, which, even by game time, was still soft, not the ideal conditions for a final of any brand of cricket, least of all the crash and bash format of T20. Nevertheless, winning the toss and sticking to our tried and true format of batting first (surprisingly Brunswick would have chosen to bowl anyway) we set about trying to post a competitive score.

As early as 2 overs in, with BJ out and the score at 1-3, a total of 100 looked to be ultra-competitive. At 1-7 off 4, 80-90 was in the offing. But a big 5th over of 11 runs got us underway. Sam was soon runout to a sharp piece of fielding and direct hit, but we had got the scoreboard momentum ticking.

When Rabbs was adjudged LBW we were 3-41 off 9, Jex doing the bulk of the scoring, as is pretty much the norm for us these days... The crucial partnership formed, between Tricky and the in-form Jex who monstered a huge Zak near to the RSL to see us 3-52 off 10. If one or both of these two could bat deep, 100+ was right on the cards. Tricky's innings began beautifully, 8 controlled singles from his first 8 balls faced, whilst Jex added another invaluable 4 as we went to 3-66 off 12. Brunswick then bowled 3 tight ones allowing us just 10 runs, leaving the contest interestingly poised at 3-76 with 5 overs remaining. The 16th over was crucial as both Jex and Tricky pulled impressive boundaries as we took 13 from it, but it cost us Jex's wicket, bowled for a vital 41, 4-89 off 16.

JT came and went quickly, stumped by a good one from their leggie, but Pricey joined Tricky and got busy with a 2 first ball. Every single was a win for the batting side.

With 12 balls left we were 5-98 and headed for an above par total. Crucially, Tricky launched a big Zak from Brunswick skipper Dave McKay's last ball (rubbing salt into the wound as McKay had earlier grassed a regulation chance from Tricky at point).

We took 10 from that over and importantly a further 9 off their Carlton import Stevenson's last over, to total 5-117. This looked a very very large score on a soft slow wicket, with the outfield also slowed due to rain. Tricky finished with a tidy 32no, Pricey 8no in a very professional batting display by the boys in purple and gold.

With almost exactly a run a ball needed, Brunswick started their chase well enough, moving to 0-9 off 2. But our young veteran, the man with the whitest teeth in subbies, soon had those choppers dazzling in a wide smile as he claimed a wicket in the 3rd over courtesy of a great catch by Sam to a smoked on-drive. In over no5 Spike was smiling again as a false drive looped to Jordy to take a neat catch at mid-off to leave Brunswick 2-20 off 5. 2 danger men, McKay and Stevenson, were still left, but not for long, as JT lured McKay into going after a big

one with only his 2nd ball, managing only to hole out to Sam at long-off, 3-22 off 6. Bowling his 4th over straight, Spike sent the Oaks crowd into a frenzy when he induced a regulation nick off Stevenson's outside edge, the catch gleefully accepted by Pricey. At 4-25 off 7 with all the Brunswick guns out, it was looking very very rosy for our boys. When Jordy bowled over no 9 and grabbed a wicket as well, any vestiges of Brunswick momentum were gone, such that the score read 5-38 off 10, 80 needed off the last 10 and this looked waaaay too many. Successive overs of 4, 6 and 4 saw Brunswick remain statistically viable, but the equation was getting bigger and bigger. When young Shawry bowled over no 14, Brunswick need 66 of 7. Following an injudicious reverse sweep that looped simply to Pricey and a 2nd pole in the same over, it was 7-55 and the fat lady had been sighted. With 5 overs left it was 7-62. An 8 run 16th over which included a boundary momentarily jangled OCC nerves, but a runout and just 4 runs from over no 17 proved the perfect tonic (8-74). With the game in the bag Jordy decided to set the Zinger Bails into action twice in over no 19, the deepening gloom allowing the bails to dance a very visible victory waltz for our boys. The game was iced as Brunswick fell for 90, an emphatic 27 run victory to the mighty Oaks.

With President Peter Webb observing on this inclement night that everyone looked "purple and cold" we was at least half correct as a sea of Purple and Gold descended on the victory ceremony to watch Subbies President Jack Sheehan hand the cup to skipper Rabbs. With ceremonies over and speeches made, the team and supporters retired to the home rooms to hear a rousing rendition of the song. 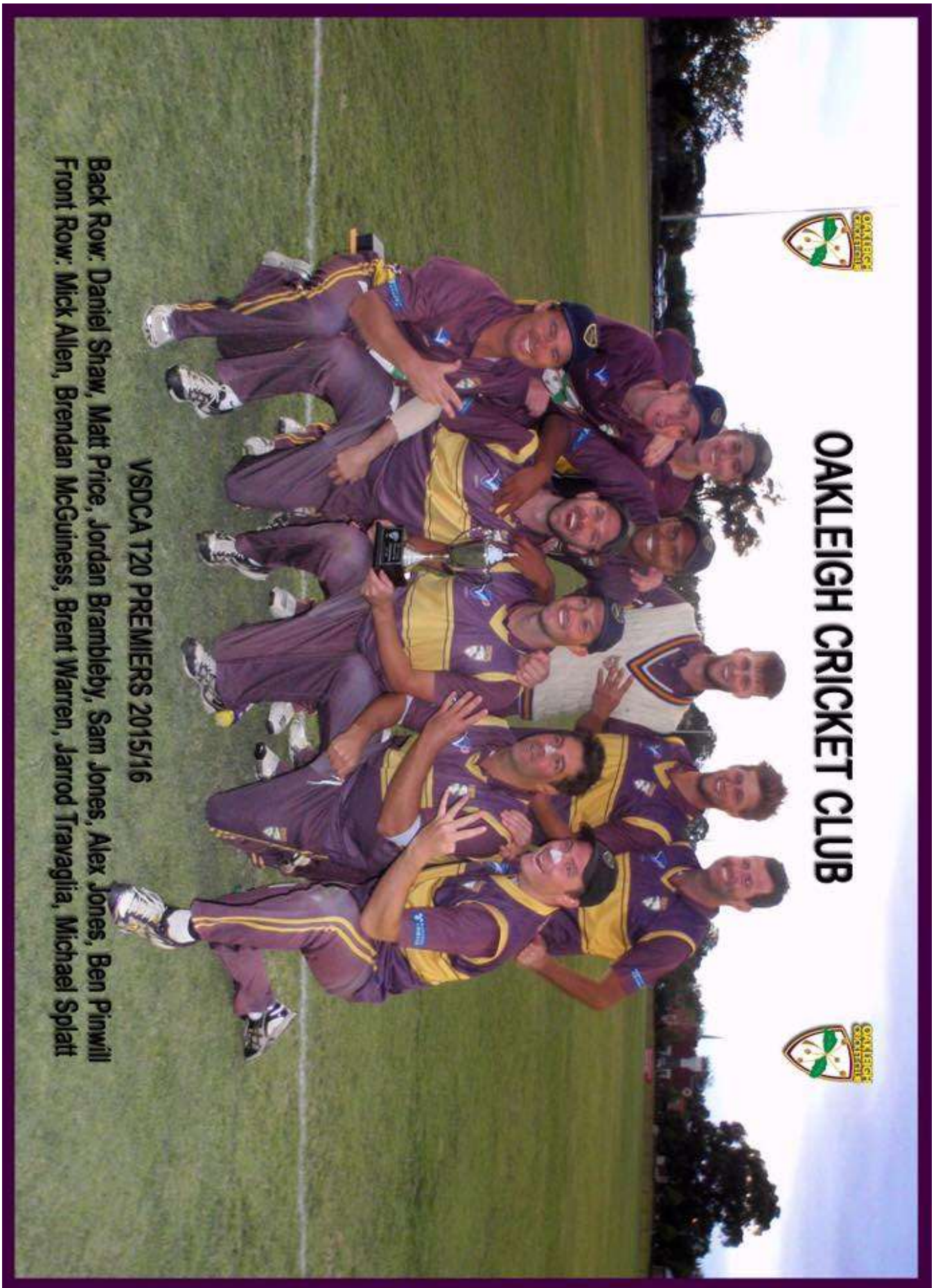

BREAKING OF FIRST ELEVEN GAMES RECORD

Oakleigh champion Ben 'Spike' Pinwill still going strong after breaking club first XI games record

February 8, 2016 2:30pm. Eamonn O'Molloy - Monash Leader
IT MUST seem unfair to batsmen across subbies cricket, after 16 seasons of facing Ben Pinwill, that the Oakleigh champ is still going strong at 34.

Pinwill, better known as Spike, broke the club record for first XI games on Saturday. It was his 237th match, one more than fellow club legend Ron Munyard.

Spike marked the occasion in predictable style: with wickets. He took three, including one off the first ball of the day, as Oakleigh easily disposed of Sunshine at Dempster Park.

That first ball got rid of Deakyn McIntyre, far from the first batsman to see c DN Junkeer, b BW Pinwill below his name on a scorecard.

The record-breaking game is as good a time to reflect on Pinwill's career as any. It started when he chose Oakleigh over Mount Waverley to play Hatch Shield, simply because he made one club's squad and not the other.

Pinwill has been a one-club man since. He made his first XI debut at 16 and has been a mainstay of a gilded era, winning three premierships from seven grand finals. "I've just never seen any reason to leave, and I've probably got the record because other blokes went to Premier Cricket or somewhere else for at least a season or two," he said. "But Subbies has always been my level."

Pinwill's figures betray the fact that he is unduly modest. He has an amazing 357 wickets at 15.84 over 16 seasons.

Better still for Oakleigh, at an age when some bowlers decline, all the evidence is that Pinwill's outswing is, if anything, more productive than ever.

The right-hander took 57 wickets last term, highlights including a hat-trick and 11 wickets in a match against eventual premier Ormond and 7-59 in a semi-final against Caulfield.

“It’s funny, I passed 50 wickets a few seasons ago (52 in 2009-10) and was sure I’d never do it again. But last year was one out of the box. I don’t do anything special but the wickets started to flow and then bowling seems easy.”

His 23 wickets at 12.13 this season, excluding Twenty20 games, is not exactly shabby either. He says he has not changed much about his approach to provoke such form.

“I feel very relaxed and I’m just enjoying my cricket,” he said. “I might have lost a bit of pace but I don’t think I was ever as fast as I probably thought I was when I was younger. I’ve long since accepted that I’m a genuine medium-pacer.”

Pinwill says the pressure his teammates create plays a big part. Oakleigh is renowned more for relentless consistency than flash, particularly in its bowling.

It is the continuation of a culture that now seems long engrained in the club. Pinwill has seen enough summers to remember when things were different.

“When I started out, we were struggling, getting two or three wins a year,” he said. “There was a definite culture change that probably started with David Hampton, and a little bit of luck when Monash disbanded and we got a lot of players. That put us on the right track. Peter Webb becoming president and Graeme Vimpani becoming coach were crucial as well.”

Jarrod Travaglia’s captaincy accelerated the process. Oakleigh started to win and has not stopped.

Pinwill counts his fortune at being part in friendships rather than medals. Travaglia is one of his best mates and Daniel Junkeer (“a big part of my cricket”) among the players he has soldiered the longest with. Then there is Michael Allen, the Splatts and countless others.

The long list of team-mates encompasses players now in their 50s down to teenagers such as Jordan Brambleby, who has joined him in the attack.

“I remember when I started, the blokes who were 30-plus didn’t treat me as a kid and taught me a lot, about life as much as cricket,” he said. “Some of those guys are in their 50s now but we’re still great mates, we’ll still meet up for a game of golf. I love that about cricket.”

That circle is neatly completed with Pinwill now the mentor. He is enjoying the game and playing well enough to want to continue beyond this term.

The support of his family is crucial. He travels from Berwick to play and has twin girls and a boy all aged under three. They were there to witness his landmark game on Saturday. His wife Carly makes the balancing act of cricket, day-to-day life and a young family look easier than it is.

“That’s the key thing, we sit down every year and figure it out. I’m enjoying it as much as ever so if they feel I can keep going, I will.”

More bad news for batsmen.

His junior playing record stretches from then until 2011/12 with numerous batting and bowling trophies (nine in total), representative honours, captaincy, and selection in Pathway teams such as the Breakers U16 and the Scorpions Under 18 teams .

Jordan's senior cricket performances include winning the Second Eleven bowling average in 2013/14 and opening the bowling in the Matthew Naughtin lead Second Eleven Premiership team in 2014/15.

Jordan has been a fine clubman and last season was an assistant coach to Ryan Chapple for our Under 15 Craig team.

RETIREMENT OF JARROD TRAVAGLIA

Jarrold Travaglia's contribution to the Oakleigh Cricket Club is not something that can be adequately reflected in one page of writing. There are the statistics, which will stand alongside the greats in the history of our club. However when we reflect, in many years to come, those that were around for this golden period of the Oakleigh Cricket Club will still marvel at his contribution to the 'whole club' and not just his on field heroics.



Ten seasons ago Jarrold was announced as the 1st XI captain. He was young, with a strong premier career behind him, having played with some giant names of district cricket and performed on the biggest stage winning a John Scholes medal in a triumphant premiership for Fitzroy Doncaster. His background for Sub District cricket was very, very good. At the time we thought we were signing an opening quick bowler and middle to lower order bat.

Four matches into his time at Oakleigh we had found a new superstar bat who bowled left arm 'off spin'. That first year saw many experienced players retire or move on to new clubs', this naturally had players and supporters guarding their expectations with the prospect of a mini rebuild.

Yet the way Jarrold 'rallied the troops' that first year to finish the season minor premiers, in my opinion, could be viewed as one of his most successful seasons. Unfortunately we lost the semi-final that season by one wicket in an absolute 'nail-biter', yet everyone could see that Jarrold was going to lead our club to imminent success.

As a captain Jarrold immediately instilled his brand of cricket on the club and in particular, the firsts. His plan was to play hard disciplined cricket and aiming to be the best fielding side in the competition, this was quickly achieved. Though he expected much from his players he was a very measured captain. In his 8 years leading the 1stXI I cannot remember a moment when he spoke negatively to a player or publicly cursed a mistake. "No one ever means to drop a catch or misfield, it is how you respond when you get your next opportunity" was his consistent message. This message was always delivered with a hard edge to ensure individuals continued to strive to improve but also provided great confidence for those playing under him.

Jarrold's leadership is something that I doubt we will see replicated at Oakleigh Cricket Club, nor should it ever be expected. As a captain he was a club captain in its most literal sense and as a coach he was a players' coach. The senior players would do anything for him, whilst the younger players simply wanted to be him.

At training he would often make the younger players stand up and address the whole playing group after a strong individual performance. This always provided great entertainment for the group, watching nervous young men retell stories from the previous weekend, it most likely had a greater motive. It ensured everyone player, regardless of age or ability, were involved, extroverted and buying into the goals we had all set together.

As mentioned earlier, Jarrod's playing career will stand up alongside the greats of our club and the VSDCA competition. Regularly he led the 1st XI batting with an average well above 40 and on three occasions he finished the season with an average comfortably above 50. It is even more impressive the manner in which he made those runs. He fought hard, he remained patient, he valued his wicket and he always led from the front. Thirty-one times he raised his bat to acknowledge 50 and on four occasions he passed 100, with a highest score of 124 in 2011/12. For much of his 10 years his bowling was almost equally important, taking 127 wickets at 19.02, always closing down an end and making it very difficult for the opposition to score.

I know that JT however would view his greatest on field successes as those achieved as a team. The three 1st XI premierships, four T20 flags, 7 Grand Final appearances, ten consecutive finals campaigns have created many fond memories and amazing celebrations.

The greatest personal accolade that can be given to a person at any club is that of Life Membership. Jarrod received this honour in what proved to be quite extraordinary circumstances given the short time he had been at the club. However his impact was just that... Extraordinary! Coach, Captain, social coordinator, sponsor just to name a few. The hours spent doing covers, recruiting, rolling wickets, running the 'Lobster Club', doing extra throwdowns for others went far beyond what would be expected of any leader. Having his name on the Life Member's honour board was richly deserved.

Congratulations Jarrod on a remarkable cricket career, a career that most could only dream of. Your impact at Oakleigh has been second to none and all your teammates have walked taller in your presence. Great friendships have been created, many of which will last a lifetime. I know you will not be lost to the club and your interest and involvement will be just as strong in the future. I thank you personally for all you have done for me over the years and what you have done for the club that we all love. Congratulations again JT, a MIGHTY OAK!

IN THE 500 CLUB, STAMPS CALLS STUMPS ON HIS LONG CAREER

When Allan Stamps completed his 300th cricket match; he was left alone to clean out the change rooms. When he completed his 400th match, a post-match examination of the record books revealed that it was in fact only his 399th. When Allan finished his 500th match however, his club, family and friends gathered for a special celebratory function honouring his immense contribution to the game.

On the eve of his 500th cricket match, Allan Stamps drove down Guest Road to check on the state of W.A. Scammel Reserve. Allan grew up less than a kilometre from the Oakleigh South ground, and would often drive down the night before a game to make sure things were in order. This is just one of the regular tasks he has been doing for Oakleigh Cricket Club for over 30 years.

As Allan pulled up, he noticed an unusual amount of activity on the field. Oakleigh's Junior Cricket Co-coordinator, and fellow 4th grade player Gary Iverson had organised a tribute to Allan painted onto the grass. It read "Allan Stamps. 500 Games" painted in the purple and gold club colours and next to his beloved Oakleigh's logo.

Allan was honoured but embarrassed at the gesture, and even more so that he had accidentally discovered it. The next day Allan made an effort to act surprised when he arrived at the ground, but not much happens at Oakleigh that gets past old Al Stamps.

It has taken Allan Stamps 45 years to reach this remarkable milestone. His 500 career matches, spanning from junior cricket to the Sub-District Competition's 1st Grade, have all been for Oakleigh Cricket Club.

"I think it's a great game and Oakleigh is a great club," says Stamps.

Allan has lived in or around Oakleigh for nearly all his life. "When I was a kid there was an expectation that blokes played footy and cricket. That's what you did." He has done it ever since.

It hasn't always been smooth sailing for Stamps, who endured a lean period of success at Oakleigh during the latter part of the 20th century. "While the club was not successful for quite some time through my formative years, it contained mates."

"Regardless of not winning, people still played hard and to win. I've not been one to hop from cricket club to cricket club when things get hard."

Given that, one might assume that it is Oakleigh's recent successes that have motivated Allan to play on. But it was never all about that for him. "I like the challenge of bowling a cricket ball." He has also enjoyed the evolving challenges of the game. "I've really always enjoyed the physicality, running around, I'm a pretty physical sort of person," but recent years have seen him adapting his style.



“I was no longer bowling quick but I was still bowling well, and just getting different things out of the game.” “With a new generation coming through you see things in a different light. You enjoy the respect. Most blokes call me the ‘Fossil’ with respect and I enjoy that.”

Allan has worked in banking most of his adult life but admits that work was never a driving passion. He has often prioritised the cricket club over his work life, taking days off work when things needed to get done at the club.

The cricket club has had a massive influence on his life, but Allan denies that it has defined him. “I have those same sort of principals that I would take anywhere, I don’t think the cricket club has (defined me). I think my family history has defined how I think. I’m very much my father’s son.”



As much as he is a cricketer, Allan is also known around the club as a family man. He and his wife Sue have two children, Matthew and Rebecca. 26-year-old Matthew was lucky enough to take to the field with Allan in his 500th match. Also a talented fast bowler, Matt is a regular contributor in the club’s 2nd and 3rd grade teams. “That was real privilege. It was very special,” says Matt. “I think everyone sort of models themselves on what their Dad does a little bit when they grow up. What I can remember of Dad when he used to bowl quick, seeing him charging in, it was always something that I wanted to do as well.”

Matt, who himself has played 131 games for Oakleigh, admitted that it was the most nervous he’s ever been before a game of cricket. “I just wanted everything to go well for him, and to get the win. I’m quite in awe of him and how he has managed to play that much cricket, especially as a bowler,” he said.

500 games. 941 wickets. 45 seasons. 41949 balls bowled. He is the first Oakleigh player to reach such a milestone.

Allan’s proudest playing memory with his son is of a match where he and Matt were responsible for all 10 wickets in one innings. Matt took six wickets, Allan three, with the tenth wicket involving a sprightly 50-year-old Allan running a batsman out with a direct hit throw onto the stumps. “We have the scorecard framed in the bar at home. It’s definitely something we are both very proud of,” recalls Matt.

Stamps' career is full of highlights, including playing 59 games over 16 years for Oakleigh's 1st Eleven team, where he was the club's fast opening bowler. One of his fondest memories was taking 10 wickets in one match against Ivanhoe in the 1st Eleven in season 1979/80.

Another moment Allan holds dear is his one and only Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA) Premiership. It took him a long time, winning it in season 2008/2009, in his 38th season. Allan took 4 wickets in the winning final, playing a significant part in the win.

But it isn't only Allan's on field achievements that the club will remember him for. As many great clubmen before him, his off field contributions were called "equally incredible" by Oakleigh President Peter Webb. Over his 45 seasons, Allan has been on the club's board for 28 years, in various roles including Secretary, Vice President and Public Officer. Webb, who has known and played alongside Allan since primary school together in the late 1960's, said that while Allan isn't the best player the club has ever seen, he cannot question his overall importance. "In terms of Allan's durability and commitment to the cause, and his love for the purple and gold, he's number one."

Allan cringes and gives a shake of the head when called a legend of the game; it's a mantle that doesn't always sit well with him. When he recently got a call from VSDCA Secretary Ken Hilton to tell him that the medal for the best player in the South/East 3rd XI Grand Final had been named the Allan B. Stamps Medal, he was taken aback.

"I felt really good, it's pretty fantastic really." Allan says modestly, it clearly means a lot to him. With a career batting average of 9.1, it's pretty safe to assume that when Allan came out to bat in his 500th game, the Elsternwick opposition weren't too worried. Nevertheless, Stamps recalls one of the best 'sledges' he's ever received to put him off his game.

As Allan walked out to bat, Elsternwick 4th Eleven Captain David Long stopped his side to acknowledge him. Despite Allan's protests, Long addressed his side, saying, "you're in the presence of a legend of our game". It moved Allan, so much so that he lost focus on his batting and was out a few minutes later.

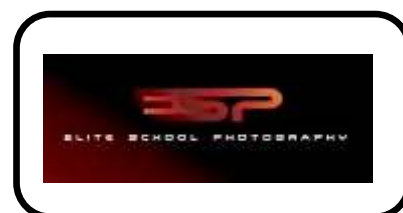

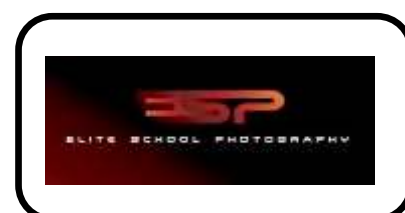

MILO IN2CRICKET PROGRAM REPORT

Oakleigh Cricket Club held the 2015/16 Milo In2Cricket program at Warrawee Park. The program was scheduled for eight Saturday mornings with five sessions running from early November, then a break for Christmas followed by three more sessions after school resumed in late January. All sessions were able to be held as scheduled.

Milo In2Cricket is aimed at 5-10 year old children and is intended to give participants an awareness and introduction to cricket. The kids and parents also thoroughly enjoyed being invited by the Club to attend the T20 games at Warrawee, especially see two of their own dads – Marcus Spencer and Daniel Junkeer out in the middle. It was great to be able to showcase Oakleigh's on-field and off-field attributes through the T20 nights, which left a positive impact on all.
