PRESIDENT'S REPORT



It is with a great sense of pride that I can report that our club has completed another tremendously successful season.

To have our four senior teams contesting the finals, and the second and third elevens, winning their respective Premierships, was a marvellous achievement. We were the only club out of the 28 competing clubs, to have all teams in the finals, and the only club to win multiple Premierships.

We again featured prominently in the K.G Fewster Club Championship, finishing a very close runner up to the Williamstown Cricket Club.

My congratulations and thanks to Senior Coach, Brendan McGuinness; Assistant Coach , Andrew Splatt; and our four captains, Brent Warren, Matthew Naughtin, Andrew Donohue and Daryl Mendes for the tireless efforts, and commitment to ensuring that all players were provided with the opportunity to develop their talents, and the respective teams performed to their potential.

The season did present its challenges however. This season saw the withdrawal of the Cricket Victoria funding for VSDCA clubs. Despite this very significant funding shortfall, I am very pleased to report that the club has been able to return a profit for the season. My great thanks to our Treasury team of Michael Lawson and Rowland Williams for their vigilant monitoring of the club's finances. In addition, the redevelopment of Scammell Reserve, required the third and fourth elevens to play their home games at Warrabee Park Oval on Sundays throughout the season. This placed a heavy burden on all involved, and I thank everyone for the extra time and effort that this arrangement required. As I have mentioned in my Community Partners Report, the redevelopment at Scammell will provide a magnificent facility for our third and fourth elevens

to enjoy for many years to come. My great thanks to the City of Monash for committing to the redevelopment, and for upgrading the turf wicket square at Warrawee Park Oval, which is now in excellent condition.

The Junior Program was again very capably coordinated by Gary Iverson. The junior program is the lifeblood of our club, and it is imperative that it continues to provide young players with the opportunity to participate in our great game, in a caring and enjoyable environment. To highlight the importance of the program, in the first eleven finals team this year, seven players had graduated from our junior program. My great thanks to all of the coaches, parents and supporters who contribute to the success of the junior program. I would also like to acknowledge the work of John Delaney our 'In 2 Cricket Coordinator', who ran the program on Saturday mornings pre-Christmas, and provided the opportunity for many young children, to experience the joys of the game for the first time.

The Under 15 Craig Carnival team was again coached by Ryan Chapple, ably assisted by Jordan Brambleby and Anthony Howes. All the boys played well, and had a wonderful learning experience over the carnival period. Special thanks to Rowland Williams for attending to the many administrative tasks required.

I must sincerely thank all of the members of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Committee for their tireless efforts in ensuring the club has the appropriate platform in place that is required for achieving sustained success. The board this season consisted of Vice President, Trent Shields; Treasurer, Michael Lawson; Geoff Latham, Secretary; Allan Stamps Secretary ACT; Bruce Dowland, Assistant Secretary; Gary Iverson, Junior Coordinator; Ivor Donohue; Steve King; Rob Warren and Marty O'Driscoll. A special thanks to Geoff and Rob for joining the board this season, your contributions were greatly appreciated.

As can be seen from the Financial Statements, the club's finances are in a sound position. Our Treasury team of Michael Lawson and Rowland Williams do a superb job supervising the club's accounts, and their efforts are much appreciated.

I thank the Social and Player Sponsorship Committees, chaired by Trent Shields for the significant roles they have played in contributing to our financial wellbeing. A particular thank you to James Benn and Sam Jones for driving the Player Sponsor Program.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is an absolute honour, to present on behalf of the committee, the 137th Annual Report of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Incorporated for the 2016-2017 season.



It has become a regular occurrence now at Oakleigh to see a very strong presence throughout the XI's deep into finals and this year our teams certainly did not disappoint. This season all four sides not only saw a finals berth (the only club throughout the VSDCA to do so), but due to an Oaks Day in the first round of the finals, all four XI's made semi finals for an opportunity at the big dance. With the second eleven and third eleven making their respective Grand Finals (also the only club to do so), the Club was delighted to have both flags return to the Val Holten rooms after a short lived break. A special mention to the third eleven going through the whole season undefeated, a spectacular effort from Andrew Donohue and the boys. The Club Championship was tightly contested this year as we lead the pack for most of the season, only to be over taken at the final hurdle by Williamstown Cricket Club.

Unfortunately, with the new format of the Twilight Twenty/20 competition being a knockout competition, we didn't get to see much action on Tuesday nights due to an early loss.

The 2016-2017 season was a highly successful one making the efforts of the playing group and coaches evident, and it should come as no surprise that the committee has rewarded coach Brendan McGuinness with a contract extension.

As Oakleigh's Junior Program continues to thrive, the senior club continues to enjoy the rewards. A very talented group of young men were involved in the Acorn Squad this season which saw many new faces introduced to senior cricket with an abundance of success. Run extremely successfully by Gary Iverson, our junior system is as strong as ever and each year seems to be able to take seemingly impossible steps forward. 'Normy' fitted in instantly to the group and became a crucial player very quickly for the First XI, going home with a few awards from Presentation Night. It was an honour to have Simon at our club and we would be very lucky if we were able to have him back for another season in the future. A mention must go out to Simons host families over the stay, the Splatt's, the Naughtin's and the Croft's. We are lucky to have such supportive families around our club and this was something these families took in their stride and we thank them very much for doing so.

The captains of each eleven should be very proud of their efforts this season, leading their teams through long and successful seasons. Congratulations to Matthew Naughtin and Andrew Donohue on their flags, with three for the great Matthew Naughtin now at the Second XI level. Commiserations to Brent Warren and Darryl Mendes, they lead extremely well all year and were

unfortunate not to bring home a flag each for Oakleigh, but no doubt that success is again not far around the corner for the First and Fourth XI's.

Selection this season was also a very tough task and it cannot have been before long that club legend, Jarrod Travaglia, regretted taking up the role of Chairman of Selectors. The push for selection in all grades was tough with great performances through all teams and I commend all parties of the selection committee on a tough year at the selection table.

With the administration this year, I joined an already very strong team as Administration Secretary along with Rob Warren as Facilities Co-ordinator. Julie Harrick continues to have a positive impact joining the Cricket and Netball clubs.

Special award winners:

For the second year of the Allan Stamps Award for Outstanding Service to the Club, this was awarded to Gary Iverson for his substantial contributions with the junior program and sponsorship.

Stephen King was awarded the Lionel Dickson Award for services to fundraising and his great work behind the bar. He worked tirelessly to gain major sponsors for the club providing many benefits, and has greatly reduced the impact from the lost revenue from Cricket Victoria.

The DW Nicoll Award for Oakleigh Cricket Club's most promising junior was awarded to Elliot Fabris. We look forward to closely watching his development and continuing success – well done Elliot.

Life Membership was presented to Glenda Splatt. Glenda has been an integral part of the club for a long time, from a young age to this season where she supported both her sons playing in the First XI. This can be seen from her past contributions to the committee and more present day cooking the Splatty Meal Deal after every Thursday night training. During the season Glenda can be found most weekends supporting either Michael or Andrew with her adorable companion Cocoa and sometimes Peter. It's a massive effort from Glenda when she hasn't had an impact on the field but has made a significant difference off it.

Due to Scammell Reserve being upgraded we were unable to use that ground which meant the third and fourth elevens had to move their home games to Warrawee Park on Sundays. This meant extensive use of the pitch almost to the point of overuse. To accommodate, the council changed the turf on the wicket table to couch grass as well as adding an extra pitch to the table. To ensure the condition of the pitch remained, we were unable to host any country week games.

COACH'S REPORT

A club with a prolonged period of success can fall in the trap of expecting results without being prepared to do the hard work. Not the Oakleigh Cricket Club.

This season we won a 2nd XI and 3rd XI premiership, and were the only club in the 28 club VSDCA competition to have all four XI's play finals. A truly remarkable season for the Purple & Gold.

We assembled at the Val Holten rooms back in July in preparation for the 2016/17 season. There was a real appetite for success amongst the group and the desire to further assert ourselves as the benchmark of the competition.



Despite the loss of VSDCA legends and premiership heroes, Jarrod Travaglia and Mick Allen, our leadership group was bolstered by the return of former 2nd XI Captain Matthew Naughtin from Queensland and 3rd XI Captain Andrew Donohue. The arrival of young guns Joshua Knight, Nick Thurgood, Connor Byrne and Ash Khullar, as well as the return of Elliot Fabris to the squad, gave us further depth for the season ahead.

We also welcomed Simon Normanton from Didsbury CC in the UK. Simon has strong connections with a number of Oakleigh Cricket Club players from his time at Stockport-Georgians CC, and proved to be an excellent addition to the club both on and off the field.

Our pre-season training moved to the brand new facilities at TNF in Oakleigh this season. TNF is arguably the best facility in the state, and is conveniently less than 500m from the club! The group was refreshed, enthusiastic and focused – preparing and progressing well for the practice matches scheduled for September.

Unfortunately, inclement weather put an end to any hope of practice matches in the country, but we did manage an intraclub match at the all-synthetic oval in Point Cook as well as hit outs against Kingston Hawks and Riddells Creek. Despite the lack of opportunity to get on turf, our sides were primed and ready for the season ahead.

The 4th XI had an excellent season, all while developing numerous junior cricketers coming through the Oakleigh ranks. Led by Daryl Mendes, the 4th XI reached the semi-finals before bowing out to eventual premiers, Bayswater. As in previous seasons, the combination of youth and experience bodes well for the 4th XI, and all players should be exceptionally proud of their efforts.

The biggest positive from the 4th XI has been the development of Jordy Brasher, Liam Sherlock, Harry Stanhope, Sam Vance, Luke Doherty and Christian ver der Merwe – it's both exciting and scary at the same time! These boys all have a serious amount of talent and I'm really excited to see how they progress over the coming seasons.

While our young Oaks continue to develop in the lower grades, the support and leadership of the senior players can't be understated. Dharmesh Patel, Ryan Chapple, Dave Anselmi, Gary Iverson, and new recruit Matthew Robertson have provided a foundation for success and development in the lower eleven – ensuring a procession of talented young cricketers vying for

selection in higher grades. While it was disappointing to bow out in the semi-finals, all players should be exceptionally proud of what was achieved this season.

Last season the 3rd XI failed to qualify for finals. Fast forward 12 months later and the 3rd XI are the undefeated Premiers.

The 3rd XI is a side brimming with raw talent and confidence. To see such dominant performances week in and week out is a credit to the application and commitment of all players. I couldn't be more proud of the way this group went about their cricket.

Congratulations to our 3rd XI Captain, Andrew Donohue, and the senior players who supported him throughout the season. Doc led by example with the bat, and the bowling unit somewhat mirrored the 1st XI in years gone by. The attack, consisting of Matt Stamps, Trent Shields, Anthony Howes, Ben Hogan, Aaron Lund, and rising star Zach Raymond was the envy of the competition. Sadly, the poor spinners never got a look in!

Congratulations to all 3rd XI players on a stellar season. I'm extremely proud of what you achieved, and the progress you've made. I'm excited to see what the future holds as you push for selection in the higher grades.

It was a case of 'back to the future' for the 2nd XI – with the very timely return of Life Member and 2nd XI Premiership Hero (and skipper), Matthew Naughtin. After suffering a heart-breaking 9 run loss in last season's semi-final to Malvern, the 2nd XI were keen to atone for last season. The injection of Josh Knight, Nick Thurgood, Ash Khullar and Satvik Verma, combined with the continued development of Geoff Latham, Luke Rhodes, Matt Price, Miles Fabris, James Benn and Daniel Shaw, meant that the 2nd XI had an enormous pool of talent at its disposal.



The consistency of our senior players set the foundations for success in the 2nd XI. Luke Rhodes was a standout with the bat this season, peeling off 404 runs @ 36.7, ably supported by Mark Harrison (329 @ 65) and Matt Naughtin (344 @ 24.6). All three were well supported by Shane Townsend and Andrew Splatt in the middle-order.

The bowling unit looked somewhat different this season with Nick Thurgood, Josh Knight and Geoff Latham spearheading the attack. These three bowlers took 31, 27 and 23 wickets respectively – a fantastic return for all three players this season.

The performance of the 2nd XI and 3rd XI this season is sure to have the OCC supporters dreaming of another decade of domination. The amount of talent in this group is unmatched in the VSDCA, and serves as an ominous sign to our opposition. I'm really excited to see these boys progress and earn a permanent spot in the 1st XI.

As reigning premiers, the 1st XI carried the tag well. 'Back-to-Back' is a feat that has eluded the 1st XI to date, and the squad were more determined than ever to create their own piece of history.

Our pre-season preparation was sound, and there were no signs of complacency amongst the group. This season we saw signs of transition, with six players making their 1st XI debut – the most in recent history. It was really pleasing to see young guns Elliot Fabris, Luke Rhodes, Geoff Latham and Daniel Shaw make their debuts. All four players have enormous ability, and will no doubt form the nucleus of the 1st XI in the years to come.

We managed to negate a tough fixture to start the season with victories over Brunswick and Kew, and establish ourselves in familiar territory at the top of the ladder. Despite a loss against Caulfield in Round 4, our form in the first half of the year was sound and made it to Christmas 6-1. We'd set a foundation on which we could build on in the New Year.

While we hadn't executed the perfect game up to this point, we could sense things were starting to click. The side grew with confidence as the rounds went by, and we reached finals in second position on the ladder.

Our finals campaign was as good as I can recall. We executed with bat and ball extremely well over the first two finals, however we came up short in the semi-final - losing to eventual premiers Caulfield. We played a really good game of cricket – we were just beaten by a better side on the day. I have no doubt the loss will serve as motivation to work harder and keep improving next season.

I want to take this opportunity to congratulate Elliot Fabris on a standout season. A product of the junior program, Elliot debuted in Round 1 this season and made the opening spot his own – peeling off 329 runs @ 25.64. An outstanding performance in his first full season of first eleven cricket.

We were also privileged to acknowledge three personal milestones for three of our club's greatest servants – Ben Pinwill, Daniel Junkeer and Michael Splatt. This season, Ben played his 250th 1st XI game for the club, Daniel played his 200th 1st XI game for the club, and Michael played his 150th 1st XI game for the club. All three are outstanding players and people, and we're extremely fortunate to call them our own. Congratulations to all 3 players, and all the best to DJ and Jex as they chase down Spikes record!

Our great club wouldn't be what it is without the dedication and support of a number of members and volunteers. In particular, I'd like to thank;

Peter Webb and the Oakleigh CC Board for your commitment and support this season. Webby, I don't know how you do it, but your passion and energy for our club is second to none. I can't thank you enough for everything you do around the club to make it the benchmark of the competition.

Andrew Splatt for your support as Assistant Coach this season. You are a fantastic coach, and were ready and willing to help everyone whenever you can. You are a huge asset to the club, and I hope that you and I can continue to build on what we started this season. Thank you for all your hard work.

FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to be able to report that Oakleigh Cricket Club has had a successful season financially - achieving a \$10,000 profit - to complement the on-field performance where all four senior teams competed in the finals, with two of those winning the premiership.

Significant developments over the year included:

The transfer of over \$16,000 from the day-to-day operating bank account to various term deposit accounts – utilising the financial acumen of Ivor Donohue and Rowland Williams.

Members subscriptions were kept at the 2013/14 rate, netting \$18,400 for seniors & \$13,380 re juniors.

Income for the year fell by \$24,000 with the cessation of the \$9,000 VCA Grant, and loss of our one-off AGL \$5,000 “sponsorship”, being major contributors.

The First XI couldn't complete the magnificent (but almost impossible) double of a flag and T20 Premiership this season, meaning no \$3,000 in prizemoney.

Sponsorship revenue continued to contribute significantly to our overall results. We were fortunate again to receive sponsorship from our supporters Rotary Club of Oakleigh, Bendigo Bank (Murrumbeena Branch), Rosstown Hotel, Allfloors Carpet Gallery, Mortgage Choice Oakleigh, Ray White Oakleigh and Spring Osteo Clinic. Thanks to all of these organisations - plus Steve (Irish) King and Trent Shields - for generating a number of new sponsors including Atherton Road Podiatrist.

Thanks, also to players and their sponsors for raising an additional \$1,000 compared to 2015/16.

Profit from Social Activities fell by approximately \$4,000 as attendances were down at the two fund raising functions held. Thanks to those who attended the Trivia & Casino nights, and to those responsible for assisting in organising the functions. A summary showing the results of these activities is included with this report.

Overall Merchandise Sales resulted in a loss - caused by a write-off of over \$1,700 from the bankruptcy of BLK (hopefully they may trade-on & eventually fulfil our order) - and the write-off of obsolete stock of old style clothing.

Refreshment profits were down by \$2,000 caused by a number of factors:

- no T20 home matches;
- Sunday home games for the third and fourth elevens leading to fewer players staying back to socialise with the opposition;
- many younger players in the Senior Elevens

On the positive side, thanks to club members for donating all prizes re the Christmas raffle as it netted \$2,070.

Special thanks to Neil Croft for organising & recruiting club members and supporters to the Lobster Club – which again raised over \$8,000 – due to the first eleven winning an admirable 11 games. Members enjoyed a sumptuous dinner in April, as a reward. Long may the Lobster Club continue!

In light of the reduced revenue detailed above - expenses were tightly monitored, dropping by approximately \$16,000 – thanks to the finance team of Roly, Ivor and Irish.

The major component was Coaching/Professional Player expenses decreasing by \$14,000 from a combination of not engaging a professional player, and not paying Premiership and T20 bonuses.

As a result of W. A. Scammell Reserve being unavailable, and the D.W. Nicoll Reserve not being used for Under 17 games, Ground Rental expense fell by \$5,000.

Inclement weather during the season necessitated a greater use of the TNF indoor Training Facility; consequently, fees rose by \$1,700 as it was decided not to charge players.

Umpire fees rose \$3,000 as 2 umpires were appointed for the Sunday games mentioned above – this won't happen in future, at least – fees were raised by \$10 which in effect cost the club an extra \$40 per day - and umpires were appointed to all under 17 games this season.

Another one-off (but very welcome) expense, was incurred replacing old/missing premiership flags.

Finally, a number of matches became one day games due to the bad weather, requiring white balls instead of the less expensive red balls, and the type of balls required for Under 17 games was altered to Tuf Pitch instead of Kooka Colt, an increase of \$14.50 per ball.

Considerable discipline and effort from all areas of the Oakleigh Cricket Club, the administration, players, parents and supporters will be needed to monitor and control expenditure as we venture into a competitive future. Continued development of our outstanding junior players & potential recruitment of a professional player, should keep Oakleigh Cricket Club around the top of the VSDCA ladder.

Ending on a positive note, a \$6,000 grant (for the sole purpose of making improvements to training facilities) has just been won by the club!

THIRD ELEVEN REPORT

After the disappointment of being the only Oakleigh team not to take part in finals last season the thirds were keen to join the party this year and bounced back in the most emphatic fashion. We went through the season undefeated, winning the flag and eliciting comparisons with the famed 3rd XI teams of the Nicholson Era.

Despite being undefeated we actually started the season with a loss: the loss of our home ground at Scammell Reserve. Our home games (like those of the fourths) were shifted to Warrawee Park on Sundays, wreaking havoc with selection and availabilities.

But I believe the benefits outweighed any negatives. Playing at Oakleigh's atmospheric and picturesque main ground gave the team a taste of playing in the higher elevens on a ground that feels like a cricket ground should (and who doesn't want to play cricket next to a cemetery?) reminds you it's not all about runs and wickets!

The Sunday games also enabled us to support our club mates playing on Saturdays and likewise many of the other elevens came down and watched, supported and chatted which engendered a great club atmosphere.

On field pre-Christmas saw comfortable wins against Endeavour Hills (Hogan 6-10 on debut), Moorabbin (T20: Howes 2-17, Burke 2-21, Verma 40 no), Caulfield (Burke 58 no & 3-25, Howse 84 no off 37 balls with four 4's and nine 6's) Noble Park (outright, Verma 52, Stamps 43, 3-5 & 6-22) and Ormond (Braganza 69 no carried bat) along with two draws against stiffer opposition in Mount Waverley and Croydon (Benn 60, Donohue 58, O'Keefe 49) due to weather intervention. We were winning well but against opposition of questionable quality.

The post-Christmas games were against teams expecting to play finals and we built form and consistency, gathered momentum and by the end we were destroying good teams. Good wins against Elsternwick (Hogan 4-27, Raymond 2-9, Donohue 69, O'Keefe 62), Balwyn (Byrne 3-26, Lund 4-16) and perhaps our most polished and disciplined pre-finals performance against Bayswater (Verma 91, Howes, 58 (in a last wicket partnership of 85 with Lund) and 4-32 off 16) were followed by a somewhat incident packed win against Box Hill (Donohue 69, Stamps 36, 3-15 & 2-24, Shields 2-6, House 4-16 & Raymond 2-11). Victories against Brighton (Byrne 71, Stamps 51 opening! Who let him do that?) and Malvern (Byrne 54, Stamps 3-16, Lund 3-27) saw us finish the home and away season without a loss and playing our best cricket of the year. We'd earned the double chance and "home ground" advantage, so naturally we played all our finals games away.

First up was Balwyn (BCC 86, Stamps 4-36, Howes 4-16, OCC 1-98 Burke 33 no Lund 34 no at no. 3.) followed by a semi-final out at Bayswater where OCC's 235, (Darcy 41, Miles a lovely



88) was far too much for Bayswater (71 all out, Trent was sublime with 9 overs 7 maidens 3-6). And so it was off to Malvern City Oval for the Grand Final and fittingly I thought we saved our most complete, rounded, grittiest game for the one that mattered the most. I could write a whole other report on the grand final alone as it is the game of which I am most proud of our team as there were important contributions from everyone. Miles (44) top scored for the game, John O'Keefe's 16 was his best and most important innings of the year. Zac, Ben, Lundy were selfless sacrificing their wickets trying to gain precious runs at the end. We fought all the way through the order for 80 overs with the bat to post 196, a good score to have on the board in a Grand Final but on a small, fast ground I wasn't sure it was enough. The next day the fielding was our best for the year, and the bowlers to a man were magnificent. Stamps tore the top order apart and Trent refused to concede runs. There was a run out and key spells from Lund and Hogan with Zac chipping in at a crucial time while Anthony Howes ground away in his marathon spell at the other end, (26 overs 3-33). Malvern were dismissed in the 72nd over for 144. The margin belied the intensity, ebbs and flows and hard fought nature of the game but the result was the right one. Bar the celebrations and awards a fantastic year was thus completed. A superb effort not just those lucky enough to take the field in the Grand Final, but everyone who played in the 3rd XI and all at Oakleigh Cricket Club.

Why the difference to last year? Firstly, despite the alternating Saturday/Sunday games we returned to having a remarkably stable player group with low turnover particularly for a third XI. Secondly it is a cliché but it is so for a reason; we did the little things better than we have for a number of years. We also gained some more discipline, spine, some inner toughness and a ruthlessness that despite the obvious skill, has been lacking for a few years. Thirdly, each and every week someone different stood up to do a job, it was a team season. This, along with having access to "go to players" meant that not only could we win games in all circumstances but we could try things; get guys some overs under their belt, bat someone back into form, nurse injuries and workload or do something different. We batted with more application than in previous years and as a result we occupied the crease longer and posted competitive totals. We had the effortless class of Satvik, Miles and Connor, but there was less of the flash and the instant gratification that comes with crashing balls to the boundary and more of the discipline, hard work, ugly runs, inner toughness at the crease I wanted. Stampsy and Zac against Box Hill were outstanding, James Benn at Croydon, Ruergan against Ormond, Darcy at Balwyn and JOK in the Grand Final are just a few of many fine examples. Last year no one qualified for the batting averages and our highest performer was 62nd in the completion; this year we were one run off 10 people qualifying and 5 of the competition top 20 bats were from Oakleigh, a stark contrast. The fielding was much improved, few catches were dropped and some outstanding catches were taken at crucial moments with the catching in the cordon a particular highlight along with the best ground fielding for years. Raffa and Miles were exemplary behind the stumps all season.

These aspects were the difference overall because once again our bowling attack, which has been a strength for a few years now, kept on doing what it does and then got better. With a genuine seven person seam attack I was constantly apologising to bowlers (particularly spinners) for not getting the overs they would have liked as we took out a team for yet another paltry total. The bowlers didn't just bowl to a plan, or in pairs, they bowled as a pack, as a team. The six bowlers with the most overs all averaged fewer than 16, three under 10. Three of the competitions top 10 wicket takers (including number 1 and 2) were from Oakleigh and none of them won the team bowling average! There were so many outstanding performances. Hogan's

debut destruction, Lund and Connor at Balwyn, Trent's inspired finals campaign, Matt putting Noble to the sword and Howesey's relentless attacking pressure. Throw in Shaw, Burke, Ramani, Brasher (Donohue & Benn??) for good measure. If you put a half decent score on the board and you field as you should, this bowling attack will win you the game.

What does bode well for the club's future is that this team is almost entirely composed of an outstanding group of young players who would all be playing higher at weaker clubs and are gaining valuable experience (Brambleby, Braganza, Benn, Brasher, Darcy and Joe Burke, Byrne, Corrie, Miles Fabris, O'Keefe, Raymond, Howes, Raffa, Shaw, Verma). Mix in players with a few more miles on the clock (Lund, Hogan, Stamps, Shields, Ramani, Robertson) to provide some much needed wisdom and intelligence and it provided a wonderful balance.

As usual there are lots of people to thank. Firstly the OCC committee, Roly, Mick Lawson for umpiring and Frank Fabris for his cameo and most importantly to Peter Webb, not only for this year and the tireless work he does, but for getting me to come to Oakleigh initially. To the captains and selection committee Brendan, Brent, Matt, Daryl and especially Jarrod, it was the hardest year I have seen for selection and JT in particular did a lot of the grunt work. Thanks to our scorers, especially again to Shannon Kirkby; we are privileged to have a scorer of her ability. Thanks to everyone in the team who made suggestions, offered opinions and ideas, with particular mention to Matt, Miles, Jimmy, Ben and Anthony. But most especially to Trent whose cricket brain, support and effort, on and off the field are priceless. Thanks to many of the parents, partners, families, children, friends who came down supported, helped, did jobs, acted as chauffeurs, provided and set up afternoon teas, particularly Tony Raymond, Greg and Rob Howes and Al Stamps. Thanks to my parents, particularly my father, who is there every week. Thanks to my family Kerri, Hamish and Angus and my friends who after all this time still listen, talk to me, put up with me not being able to kick soccer balls, turn up to social functions, go riding or go away for weekends all summer.

I am privileged to be captain at a club like Oakleigh and even more so to be able to win a premiership doing so. My thanks to everyone who played with the 3's this year from the guys who played one game to those who played all season. Every single player, without exception, contributed meaningfully on or off the field. I thoroughly enjoyed being on the pitch with this group. I loved chucking the ball to another bowler knowing that whoever it was they wouldn't let me down and I got tremendous enjoyment from batting with nearly everyone in the team at one stage or another. That's why I play cricket and that's why I play cricket at Oakleigh.

There is so much more I want to say. About Pokémon's, Zac's wicket celebration in the final, "thongies" and the incessant noise and ridiculous conversations that punctuated this season (what is "the sound of da police"?). But there isn't enough space or time so you'll just have to wait for the book and the film. So my final word to everyone at the Oakleigh Cricket Club, the successful, family, community club. Thank you.

FOURTH ELEVEN REPORT

The fourth eleven had 27 players play at least one game this season, welcoming new Oakleigh senior players Luke Lund, Sakthi Ramani and Matthew Robertson, and junior players Jordan Brasher, Luke Doherty, Will Iverson, Zac Raymond, Harry Stanhope, Sam Vance and Christian van der Merwe. For the home and away season, we played eight one dayers, four two dayers and one T20, with ten wins and a tie to finish second on the ladder.

The first game of the season was a one dayer against the always unpredictable Endeavour Hills. With five OCC debutants in the team, a fairly nondescript batting scorecard had us finish with 9/203cc from our 40 overs. What followed can only be described as both pitiful and embarrassing, as Matt Stamps (3/10) and Liam Sherlock (4/11) tore through the hapless Hills to hoist them for a paltry 24 runs in less than 15 overs. Only three bowlers were used, and seven of their players failed to trouble the scorers. Endeavour by name, but you can't stop Niagara Falls with a paper towel. A workmanlike effort against Mount Waverley in the second round continued our great start to the season, taking the ten for only 124 runs (Burke 3/17) before a measured performance with the bat saw us pass them with only three wickets down.

The third round against Moorabbin saw the return of the T20 fixture. Looking at the ages of most of their players, it seemed liked they thought it was a Milo Cricket fixture. After an early wicket, Dharmesh Patel and Luke Lund decided to put on a clinic using the bowlers as cannon fodder and the fielders as witches hats, putting on 91 runs in quick time before we finished up with 3/146cc, Lundy's destructive 50 the highlight. Their prayers for rain were fruitless as the day was brighter than St Elmo's fire, and our bowlers tore through the struggling rabble for only 69 runs, O'Driscoll's 3/8 the pick. That the Moorabbin captain was already on his first beer halfway through their innings says it all. The strength of the 4th XI Caulfield side has dropped supremely in the last few years, going from Bucephalus-like to now more synonymous with a one eyed, lame nag. The fourth round fixture against them was remembered more for Dharmesh's cramps than anything else, as we chased their 110 for the loss of only three wickets.

Our first two day fixture against Noble Park had them chasing leather for most of the day, with Jordan Brasher's 71 (56 in boundaries) and Matthew Robertson's 46* (40 in boundaries) the backbone of our 199 from 56 overs. What little enthusiasm they had by dismissing us early was crushed as easily as Oberynt Martell's head by the Mountain, as David Anselmi led the way to scythe through with 6/30 as they were dismissed for 63. Our plans for an outright victory were thwarted by some questionable fielding and some stoic resistance, as they finished at 9/150 at the end of the second day with Will Iverson's 4/22 the highlight at the close of play. A solid batting display from our top order against Croydon saw us amass 6-240, declaring with the hope of early overnight wickets before Anselmi continued his rich vein of form (4/25), combining with the ever reliable Jatin Shah (3/3) to rout Croydon for 79. Rolling the dice for another chance at an outright gave us snake eyes, Croydon finishing with only one wicket down at the end of the second day.

Another damaging batting display of 4/217cc led by Robbo's 53* paved the way for a blitzing win against Ormond, using only four bowlers and requiring only 24 overs to steamroll them for a measly 59 runs (Anselmi 3/10, O'Driscoll 3/21) with only one of the muted Monders reaching double figures. Being unbeaten to the halfway mark of the season was a great effort from the team, though important to remember that all the sides we were to play in the second half of the year were all in or just outside the top six.

Round 8 against Elsternwick showcased the talent that is Dharmesh Patel, singlehandedly snuffing out the Wicks' chances by carrying his bat in the one day fixture for a wonderful 106* out of 3/228cc. Rarely do we see one dayer centuries scored in the fourth eleven, so it was great for all present at Warrawee Park to watch Dharmesh continue to take his game to the next level. Balwyn's recent move to the South East group has shown them to be a force to be reckoned with, grinding out a competitive 7/123cc in Round 9, our attack amazingly castling six of the seven Balwynites. Regular wickets fell as we ticked over the score, Robbo remaining the rock looking to bat time to win us the game. At 9/120 and with most of the OCC players' nails bitten down to the dermis, Gary Iverson proved a dutiful partner for Robbo as we triumphed with two balls to spare.

For the final four rounds of the home and away season, we played like the Pakistani test team; unpredictable, somewhat undisciplined and with moments of sheer brilliance. After a robust Bayswater compiled a gettable 176 in the first week of Round 10, our batting collapsed like the Tacoma Narrows Bridge, bundled out for 98 in our first loss. A much more spirited batting effort occurred in Round 11 against Box Hill, Dharmesh's 87 the platform to build a likely winning score of 228. At 9/195, the points looked to be ours but Hubber and Trollope slowly ground down the deficit. With plenty of batting time and both batsmen playing with no risk, scores were tied at 228 before an unsuspecting Hubber clamped down a second too late on a Luke Doherty yorker. A positive to get three points from the match in the end, and also that Trollope was not out at the non-striker's end.

Darcy Burke's brief hiatus from the third eleven was the catalyst for the win against Brighton in Round 12, his fluent 78 (including a memorable six) at the top of the order the highlight of our 4/194cc. While Brighton may be used to the scones and jam scene (of which Sue Burke's are clearly the best), perhaps it was the lack of doilies in their change rooms that caused an unlikely batting collapse, all bowlers combining to roll them for a meagre 94. With ladder positions now fixed for the top six, the top of the table clash with Malvern ended our home and away season. Our 8/154cc (Robbo 53) was thwarted by an aggressive Malvern, passing us with only the loss of four wickets. A real positive in the loss was spinner Sam Vance (3/28), whose flight would have pleased the Wright Brothers as he successfully bamboozled three victims out of their creases only to be joyfully stumped by Dharmesh.

Finishing second on the ladder meant another finals campaign for the fourth eleven, our twelfth in the last thirteen years, playing Brighton at the neutral venue of Elsternwick Park. Brighton's decision to win the toss and bat on a slightly wet deck initially proved to be similar to picking Richard Tambling ahead of Lance Franklin, as Jordi, Jatin and Iverson went about dismantling the top and middle order, leaving Brighton floundering at 7/51. Some lusty hitting from the Brighton captain gave them something to defend before Jatin finished the innings at 110, his 5/16 a terrific effort. Tyros Jarryd Raffa and Dylan Brambleby went about the chase in a positive fashion, hitting through the ball and running hard before Raffa fell at 1/47. Brambleby continued with support from the middle order, his 65 the difference between the two sides as we were finally dismissed for 199 and the chocolates.

We played an experienced Bayswater in the semi, who batted on a hard Bayswater Park wicket. After Jordi's two early ones and a direct hit run out from Lund, Bayswater's experienced opener Connell made it his day with a gritty 84 as they finished up with 8/237cc with some late order hitting from the lower order. In the same way as the quarter final, Raffa and Brambleby led from

the front, scoring fluently for an opening stand of 96 before both openers perished in a period of 3/12 to be 3/110 at tea.

Unfortunately, two quick wickets after tea at left us at 5/126, and while some pesky resistance from the lower order provided a thorn or two in Bayswater's side, we were eventually dismissed for 183 in a shattering loss. Congratulations to Andrew Wheeler and his side, who went on to be eventual (and back to back) premiers.

There were so many positives for the 4th XI this year, none more so than the continual development and improvement of quality juniors and young senior players. Satvik Verma and Zac Raymond worked their way up to higher elevens after starting with us, and the likes of Raffa, Brambleby, Jordi and Vance have shown that they should be permanently playing at a higher level. Our batting was the strongest that it has ever been, requiring the opposition to chase a minimum of about 200 runs in most fixtures where we batted first, and chasing down targets with aplomb most times. Our bowling was as always one of the best attacks in the competition, with the mixture of youth and experience continually troubling the best of opposition batting line ups.

A few other notable mentions as follows:

- Matthew Robertson – 325 runs @ 65 with 6 not outs, a great debut season with OCC
- Dharmesh Patel – 522 runs @ 48, catches all around the ground, 4 stumpings and a wicket; you continue to be a great example for all at the club with how you go about your cricket
- David Anselmi – 17 wickets @ 8, way too good for 4th XI level, but always welcome to turn out with us when football umpiring commitments are light on
- Jatin Shah – 18 wickets @ 11, once again showed the way as a hard edged combatant with quality medium paced bowling
- Sam Vance – 11 wickets @ 18 was a great start to what is hopefully a long career at OCC

Solid batting was required, but our top order was guilty of some rash, injudicious strokes as wickets fell around BJ. Rabbs and Sam fell to horizontal bat swipes that ended with their furniture disturbed while Harro was run-out when he really shouldn't have been. All the while BJ powered on to his 50 off only seventeen balls!! as we looked set at 2-60 off just 4 overs in what was a platform that should have enabled us to win.

But wickets continued to tumble as batsmen panicked and refused to push the game into its final overs. Pricey smashed a 4 but fell next ball, AJ chopped on and then BJ was bowled as we fell apart. Normy tried hard but with the run rate spiralling to 10 an over he holed out on the boundary. Spike was joined by young Josh Knight and they briefly threatened a remarkable get out of jail with a 4 each, a 3 wides and some great running between wickets turning 1s into 2s. But Spike was stumped leaving 26 required off the last 2 overs. It was too much for Josh and Nick Thurgood, despite best efforts. The running between wickets of Josh – along with BJs blistering 61, the only highlights in a poor effort all-round, marked by no-balls, wides and dropped catches in the field, and poor tempo batting around BJ with the blade.

And so, our incomparable record in the T20 competition takes a hit, a hard one too, as there is no second chance this time around. Perhaps we were guilty of a bit of complacency - Ivanhoe's recent form has been very very poor, perhaps it was just the shock of the blistering ton. Glenda, 58, was earlier this year awarded for her contribution to the cricket club, elevated to the status of Life Member — the same recognition her father Gordon, more commonly known as 'Mickey', received.

Last week, Peter, 63, was awarded life membership at the tennis club for his near-on 50-year association with the club.

"It has been a really special time," Glenda said.

Glenda's life membership status continues a strong family legacy for the Splatts at the cricket club.

Gordon, who passed away in 1976 after suffering a heart attack at the age of 52 while playing tennis, batted at No. 4 in the Oaks' first Sub-District Cricket match, while Peter's uncle Fred White, also a life member, batted at No. 7 in the same match.

Glenda and Peter's sons Michael, who is named after his grandfather's nickname, and Andrew have also played more than 100 games each in the First XI, playing alongside each other in the 2008-09 and 2012-13 grand final wins.

Glenda became just the second woman to receive the honour and the first female since 1991.

“They might seem like small things but it is one of the reasons we’re a successful club because we have people doing things behind the scenes like that to make it an enjoyable place to be.”



Glenda said she decided to start cooking meals when Andrew returned from a stint at Premier Cricket club Dandenong.

“I had family of five anyway to feed so another 30 wasn’t much extra,” she said.

“These young lads can eat a lot, too.”

Peter said he was shocked to receive the life membership honour.

“It was a big surprise for her and a big surprise for me, too,” he said.

“It’s nice to both be recognised for what we do.”

UNDER 15 SPLATT REPORT

U15 Splatt (Friday) was always going to be up against it in season 2016/17. Having nominated for 'B' Grade after struggling last season in U13 'A' Grade, ISEC allocated us to 'A' Grade once again and with the majority of the boys being bottom age it was an uphill battle, and unfortunately we went through the season without a win. What we did have was a great core bunch of players who were determined to compete and enjoy their cricket regardless. Add to this a plethora of fill in players including crowd favourite 10 y.o. Sammy Iverson.

Our focus was more around each player learning more about the game and their own game in particular. Straight after the Christmas break we ran some extra training sessions using centre wicket to replicate game day scenarios. We discussed what we could do as a group to improve throughout the second half of the season. The common theme was intensity, which is so important because it is something you need to bring yourselves. I strongly believe you play how you train.

Some other specific focus areas discussed were:

- Fielding - Doing the basics right – picking up the ball cleanly and getting throw to targets and taking our catches. Teams that do the basic best usually come out on top. Taking that extra split second to set ourselves for the catch, or before we throw the ball will serve us well.
- Batting – Rotate the strike. Take a second to check the field often so you know where scoring options are. Learning to use soft hands if the field is deep is a great skill to develop to keep the score ticking over.
- Communication – Talking to our batting partners, calling loudly and clearly to avoid any mix ups.
- Bowling – Reducing extras – be diligent not to just give runs away. Ensure your run up is good and practise consistency when bowling at training.
- Stock Ball – We spoke about understanding and developing a stock ball that the players are confident to bowl repeatedly with minimal risk rather than trying to bowl too much variation.

From this we came up with 3 tasks for the players to complete away from cricket. They were:

1. Develop and know the field you want to bowl to. Practise it at centre wicket and understand why your field is set the way it is.
2. The players were to send me one strength, one weakness and something they want to work on for each of: batting, bowling, fielding
3. Assess what are you strongest and weakest shots when batting and consider which ones you could play more or less of to limit chances for dismissal and/or increase scoring opportunities.

Some season highlights

- Lachie Stewart made his first 50, switch hit - one bounce for four and bowled with good pace.
- Amos Duckett hit a new highest score and at times bowled with good pace/shape.
- Thenuka Perera refused to give his wicket away and bowled with great pace. When he gets some accuracy he will be a handful!
- James Nimos started to click toward the season end when confidence kicked in. He bowls a nice outswinger.

- Anurag Uprety bowling some great off spin in his first year of cricket.
- Pranaav Baruwal Chhetri playing up as a first year U13 and not being out of place.
- Matt Tyson relentless accuracy with his left arm over the wicket swingers.
- Thomas MacMahons cheeky little partnership breakers

UNDER 13 MENDES REPORT

The Oakleigh Mendes Friday Night cricket team that played in the B Grade Stuart King Shield Division for 2016/17 was an exciting and interesting year for myself and the boys involved.

It was my second year of coaching Under 13 and my fourth at being a coach in junior cricket. This gave me a good feeling that the administration side of the year would be easy and all we needed to do was to get down to business, train well and play great cricket. The side consisted of 12 boys, some of which had played together before and a few new faces.

Jack Iverson, Ashwin Mehta, Max Cavolo, Lachlan McFarlane, Xavier Soldati, Harry Chetwin and Arya Shivan, had all played in a team with myself as coach previously. In many ways, I knew what to expect of them. Samuel Coronado and Kush Pipaliya were new to me, although they both played previous seasons, together with Tyler Jones, Navraj Gill and Aaron Benjamin (first year players) completed the side.

Out of the ten games played, we won four and lost six. I believe the overall result for the season did not reflect how the year was for the boys. Some of the games against the top sides were close and there were at least two games where we had almost total control over the match but lost focus and let it slip away. For many of the lads it was the first time in under 13's and it can take some time to get used to new rules and regulations, not only for the players but the parents as well. Most of the experienced boys who put their hand up to open the batting and the bowling were rewarded with good results. During the year I also tried to give most of the boys an opportunity to be captain. They could bat early and bowl an extra over, as the year progressed the boys found a spot where they felt comfortable in the line-up and enjoyed the game. All the boys showed great improvement through-out the season, and here are some of the highlights and stats that reflected the year.

Jack Iverson: With a highest score of 53 n.o. 227 runs for the year, average 37.83. Bowling statistics: 8 wickets. Best bowling 3/6 with 6 catches. A great year, making the representative team, enigmatic to watch and unstoppable.

Ashwin Mehta: Highest Score of 49 no. in our win against Toorak/Prahran showed skills with the bat making 233 runs, average of 77.67, 4 catches, wicket keeper for most the games, best bowling 2/9, fabulous batting year.

Max Cavolo: Always consistent 154 runs 30.8 average, highest score 36. Best bowling 3/3, average 29.5, and took 2 catches. Always listens and tried extremely hard to better himself, made the representative cricket side, well done.

Xavier Soldati: Another consistent year. His bowling pace and good length deliveries troubled batsmen, he liked bowling with the new ball. Statistics 8 wickets, average 11.0 best bowling 4/12, great economy of 2.32, good accuracy. Batting 125 runs highest score 30, reliable throughout the year.

Lachlan McFarlane: Another boy with great ability and desire to do well in cricket - 74 runs, average 18.25 Wicket kept well in the first games of the season took 3 wickets, nice action in his bowling unlucky through-out the year.

Tyler Jones: For a first-year player he showed great improvement and progress for the 6 games played. He had a batting average of 17, made 34 runs, took a wicket and a catch, (was also unlucky not to have more).

Arya Shivan found some good form with the bat from mid-season on, made a personal best of 31 runs against Glen Waverley Cougars. He made 89 for the year and bowled very well, best bowling 2 for 12 with 4 wickets an average of 27.50. (becoming confident, has progressed a long way).

Samuel Coronado Impressed me with his bowling, he was consistent with his bowling took 4 wickets with an average of 25.75 he made 28 runs and gained more skill as the year ended. (would profit from some personal coaching).

Kush Pipaliya: A boy who loved to wicket keep and did for a few of the games. He is a good medium/fast bowler but found most of his wickets coming from spin. With a bowling average of 15.17 and best 2/11, his six wickets could have easily been more. A handy bowler, great personality, made me laugh. He also made 59 off the bat.

Harry Chetwin: The major improvement from not seeing Harry the previous season was his good catching ability. Most of them stuck. His bowling was another big improvement, 5 wickets with best bowling 2/5, average 21.20. Needs to focus when batting, he can hit the ball hard, would take off with the bat if he got some confidence and personal training.

Aaron Benjamin another first-year player started off the year un-familiar to the sport. He showed without prior training for the first game and could not bowl and had some complaints from the opposition. I must hand it to Aaron, the next training session we worked hard with him and with some determination, Aaron was able to deliver some decent balls. While still learning his skills, his batting was his next challenge. For a first-year player who started late in the sport 19 runs and 3 wickets is a good basis on which he can grow.

Finally, Navraj Gill another first year boy gave it his best. He made 51 with the bat and there was a game against Mt Waverley/Mayfield where he made 25 runs, really smacked the ball. With personal training and some seasons behind him he will be great. He also has some pace in his bowling but just needs to get his run up and follow through in line and he'll get more wickets. Good effort for a first year.

I believe it takes some time for a group of boys to come together and figure out what is needed to play as a team, (not just basic batting and bowling). But the extra little things, how to control the pace of a game, and choke the opposition's ability to score. Staying focused, encouraging, and backing up players who are struggling. Having a good keeper and fielders to minimize extras and having your bowlers consistently place the ball to the favour of your field you set. This was a young side for most of the boys they will get another crack at Under 13 next year, which I think is a promising thought.

I would also like to thank Rahul Surendran, Samuel Iverson, Archie Callander and Diyon De Silva, for contributing to our side throughout the year.

I would like to thank the parents with their assistance throughout the year. Especially Andrew McFarlane, Ed Cavolo and Ahmit Mehta.
