FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

Season 2021/22 saw the Club again affected by non-cricket events, impacting on both revenue & expenditure. Congratulations to our respective captains & coach for guiding 3 out of 5 senior teams to the finals, and to all associated with the Junior Program which saw an Under 17 flag resulting.

Off-field – we made a profit in excess of \$12,000 – however had Monash Council not waived the charge for ground rentals, instead of showing a healthy profit, there would have been a markedly different result.

Income for the year rose by \$17,000 to \$115,000 - an increase in Subscriptions was ratified by the members at the AGM (as recommended by the Committee) - resulting in \$9,000 extra income, and expenses rose by \$3,000 to \$103,000. A breakdown of material items follows.

Wins for the season included Rotary Oakleigh Clayton Huntingdale (\$5,000) coming back on board as a sponsor; continued support from our core sponsors; & an increase in the number of player sponsors – all of which were crucial in remaining financially viable - in a pandemic affected season.

Members' subscriptions totalled \$26,000 for seniors & \$14,000 for juniors.

As mentioned above, Sponsorship revenue continued to contribute significantly to our overall result, both from new & our loyal ongoing sponsors. OCC was fortunate again to receive sponsorship from: Rotary Club of Oakleigh Clayton Huntingdale; Murrumbeena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; Oak Traffic and Labour; Intent Business Solutions; Allfloors Carpet Gallery & a new sponsor in ARQ Projects Pty Ltd; Ray White Oakleigh; Mortgage Choice; Craig Allen & Associates; ICON Sports; Kookaburra; Signarama; Spring Osteo Clinic; Bentleigh Wine Store ; Elite School Photography; East Bentleigh Bakers Delight, Eye Care Plus and Boost Juice Oakleigh. Thanks to all of these organisations, and - especially Peter Webb & Trent Shields - for locking in continued sponsorship.

Player Sponsor profit remained at \$5,000 thanks to the hard work of Elliot Fabris & our players chasing sponsors to boost finances.

Profit from Social Activities rose by approximately \$2,600 - mainly due to increased Lobster Club returns & the Presentation Night raffle – hopefully, normal use of the Bar & clubrooms will return by next season & fundraising events can be run in future.

Thanks go to those who purchased supplies for the Bar. To Glenda and Pete for their ongoing commitment to Splatty Meal Deals & East Bentleigh Bakers Delight. I especially appreciated the work of the finance team of Bettina Latham, Roly Williams & Ivor Donohue, for their guidance & support; & Matt Tyson/Tom Ison for running the Thursday night raffles during the season.

I cannot thank Neil Croft enough for organising and recruiting new members to the Lobster Club - which produced a profit of over \$11,000 – due to the first eleven winning an admirable 11 games. Thanks again, Bettina for processing these payments.

There were 52 members in 2021/22, & these supporters of the Lobster Club greatly enjoyed their dinner to be held in May 2022.

Merchandise inventory levels rose by around \$12,000 due to a combination of buying large quantities to take advantage of volume discounts; playing format restricted to 1-Day cricket - meaning coloured clothing sales only, (when we had stocked up on both 2-day & 1- day items); purchases proceeding without comprehensive consultation i.e. the junior program ordered white playing shirts & then changed to the gold training shirts. Also, shirts were ordered in anticipation of fielding two female teams – which didn't eventuate. These purchases left a surplus in excess of 90 junior sized white shirts & 70+ junior sized training shirts. Hopefully, these can be utilized in future seasons.

The \$3,000 increase in expenses for 2021/22 consisted mainly of the following items:

- A \$10,000 increase in investment in the cricket operations areas for both the senior and junior programs
- \$4,000 rise in the History Book cost – possible grant/donation to offset this expense?
- Cricket balls (approximately \$1,000) attributable to a price rise & purchase of surplus stock

Reductions in expenses included:

- Approximately \$10,000 in Ground & Pavilion rental being waived
- Umpires' fees fell by \$2,000 due to the shortage of available umpires, & also the reduction in the number of playing days

This has been my last season as Treasurer, and I would especially like to thank Roly Williams for giving me the opportunity to be involved with the finances of such a large, vibrant & professional club & Peter Webb for his unwavering support, & the non-stop work he puts in.

In conclusion, best wishes to the new Treasurer & going forward, I recommend a co-ordinated purchasing approach regarding merchandise & cricket balls between the purchasing officers, the Treasurer and Junior Coordinator to ensure stock levels are manageable & to avoid obsolescent stock being written-off (currently \$1,800). To reduce the level of this write off, the club may like to consider a "fire-sale" to be held just before next season.





FIRST ELEVEN REPORT

For many OCC members, this season proved to be one of the most challenging seasons we've ever experienced. The impact of a second COVID-interrupted season was significant – player & volunteer numbers were decimated, the mental health & wellbeing of everyone was challenged, and COVID-compliant training & matches stretched every member of the club well beyond capacity.

In light of the circumstances, everyone should be extremely proud of the commitment, flexibility and resilience shown to successfully complete the season.

Regrettably, several of our core players needed time away from the game for various reasons, depriving us not only of great people but also much needed experience, depth & comradery. Fortunately, the significant losses were offset by the opportunity to fast-track the development of some of our emerging players – with some very promising signs for the future.

Preseason proved difficult considering the COVID protocols, however the squad took it all in their stride. It was inspiring to see so many players commit to training in isolation or small groups throughout August & September in preparation for the season ahead.

This season, we had four 1st XI debutants – Anthony Howes (#377), James Ritchie (#378), Thari Goniya Malimegue (#379) & Prathamesh Khare (#380) – who were rewarded for their strong preseason & early season performances. And off the back of a very strong preseason, Matthew Stamps returned to the 1st XI – some 10 years since his last 1st XI match. These new faces added a fresh look to an otherwise familiar Oakleigh CC line-up over the past few years.

Disappointingly, this season was arguably another missed opportunity to secure a coveted 'blue triangle' for the 1st XI. A season of one-day fixtures suited our skillset and game plan, and early signs were extremely pleasing with comprehensive victories over Altona, Taylors Lakes, Hoppers Crossing, Malvern & Melton. To head into the Christmas break with only a single loss against Brighton was as good a start to the season as we could've hoped for, but knew we had some challenging fixtures in the back half of the season to contend with if we were to book a 20th consecutive 1st XI finals appearance.

A resounding win against Caulfield immediately following the Christmas break ensured we started the year on the right foot – reclaiming the Richardson-Travaglia Shield in the process. Important wins against Port Melbourne, Yarraville & Williamstown meant we continued to bank points, yet we were starting to see less of our best cricket when it really mattered.

February proved to be a difficult month – a string of losses against lowly opposition undid all our hard work in the first half of the season. Successive defeats at the hands of Elsternwick,

Moorabbin, Werribee & Ormond saw us slip from equal first to fifth by the end of the regular season. An elimination final against 2nd placed Werribee stood in front of us and a Semi-Final berth.

Despite the wretched run of form, we produced arguably our best performance for the season. Losing the toss and bowling first, we executed our game plan perfectly – dismissing eventual premiers Werribee for only 140. The Oaks bats weathered the early onslaught and went on to pass the total 5-down – booking a Semi-Final against Ormond at Ormond.

In a similar vein to last season, our top-order succumbed to a disciplined bowling attack in the Semi-Final. A humble start and stuttering in the middle overs, we finished with a late flurry to finish with a less-than-modest 7/164(cc). We got to work defending our total, but our bowling lacked impetus and subsequently failed to make early inroads. Once the Ormond bats navigated their way through the new ball, the game slipped from our grasp – eventually passing our total 5-down with plenty of balls remaining. A very disappointing end to our campaign. Another opportunity missed.

The disappointment of a second premature exit in as many seasons should provide the motivation for all 1st XI aspirants to push themselves beyond their comfort zone in the pursuit of being better cricketers. We have the talent and depth, but we simply need all players to commit to doing the hard work – otherwise, we'll continue to achieve the same results. We must learn & improve. We must be better.

Conversely, it was brilliant to see the youthful 2nd & 3rd XIs reach the Grand Final. Considering the significant impacts of COVID and player churn – to reach the Grand Final is a fantastic achievement with such a young & inexperienced team. While we were unable to achieve the ultimate success, both Rob & Ben and their respective XIs should be extremely proud of their efforts! Well done on an excellent season to all involved.

As always, it would be remiss of me not to call out the incredibly important and significant contribution of those who ensure our club continues to be the envy of the VSDCA competition.

SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

Season 2021/22 can probably be summed up succinctly for the entire senior club – extraordinarily tough and ultimately frustrating.

After the highs of the 2020/21 season for the 2nd XI, unfortunately the impact of a season of short-format games was felt in the off-season as we experienced an exodus of core senior players from our 1st and 2nd XI teams.

Across the 1st and 2nd XI alone we lost 9 players – a seismic change that most clubs would find immensely difficult to remain competitive in light of. The numbers alone do not do justice to what we truly lost – these players were part of the core senior group, helping drive standards at both training and on game-day by being amongst the most vocal members of our group.

Coming into the season I actually felt a sense of excitement about the opportunities this would afford to the younger cohort of our senior group. It has in the past been immensely difficult to provide opportunities in our higher XIs due to the sheer strength of our senior group – something that has been reflected in our enviable record of success across all grades over the past 10-15 years.

This season would therefore finally put to the test the much-vaunted depth of our senior group – with opportunities aplenty to identify who would seize their chance and make spots their own in the higher grades. It was therefore most pleasing to not only see new guys come in and play their roles for the side, but for them to actually excel and look like they had been playing 2nd XI cricket for a number of seasons.

Our season started off very strong, with convincing wins in each of the first 4 rounds raising hopes of what this inexperienced group could be capable of. Unfortunately, however, even during this period it became apparent that there were some glaring issues within our performances that would ultimately prove difficult to shake throughout the season.

Our fielding left a lot to be desired, both in terms of skill as well as voice. Having arguably possessed the best fielding side at 2nd XI level last season, this season we came right back to the pack. Despite it being a constant focus each week, unfortunately there was very little improvement shown in this area throughout the season. There were occasions during games where it did rise to an acceptable level, but unfortunately this happened too sporadically for it to ever be considered sustainable improvement.

The second area of our performance that really let us down was the inability of members of the side to fully support each other as a team. Whether it came about due to the impact of COVID or the departure of members of the senior group that had previously helped to enforce team standards, there was an increasing focus by players this season on how the team could serve them rather than vice versa. This was reflected on game day where there was very little support from players both out on the ground and off it when we were batting. This was something I have never previously seen during my time at Oakleigh, and is certainly not the hallmark of premierships sides we have had in the past. This attitude unfortunately appeared to be an issue across the board at the club this season, and is an area that must be addressed as soon as possible if we want to return to performing at a consistent level on a weekly basis.

Despite these issues, we finished the H&A season in 2nd place on the ladder – a mighty achievement given the increased size of our competition to 16 teams this season. Whilst our

colours were lowered on 3 occasions during the H&A rounds, we also dished out some thumping wins that was reflected in our bowling attack being arguably the best performing group competition-wide this season.

The finals series was in the end symbolic of the group that we had in the 2nd XI this season – inexperience led to inconsistent performances, but in between was a flash of brilliance.

The first final against Williamstown quite clearly did not go to plan. Playing on our home deck, our fielding really let us down – allowing them to get off the hook in the final 10 overs and ultimately post a score that proved too much to chase down. The feeling during the game was that it did not feel like a final in terms of our intensity in the field – perhaps owing to the relative inexperience within our side.

Finishing 2nd provided us with the double-chance opportunity – which handed us the unenviable task of heading down the freeway to face an undefeated Werribee. In our meeting during the season they had beaten us convincingly – something they had done to all other sides. With nothing to lose, we decided to adopt an all-out aggressive approach in game plan to try and unsettle them. Rhodesy was elevated to open the batting, Ant was used as a spinner to open the bowling and bowlers were rotated every couple of overs to ensure the opposition batsmen never felt settled. The execution of this game plan could not have gone more successfully on the day, with the end result being a massive victory and a berth in a second consecutive Grand Final. After the game I said to the boys that this was definitely one of the best wins I had ever been a part of – it was a result that no one outside of our side expected, and was great reward for what can be produced when playing as a team.

After the highs of a Semi Final victory like that, it can often be difficult to replicate such a performance. So it proved in the Grand Final, where in the end we were beaten by a better side on the day. To fall 40 runs short of going back-to-back no doubt hurt, but clearly we exceeded expectations this season by getting so close. To put the season in perspective:

- 27 players represented the 2nd XI this season – the most in at least 25 years;
- 12 players debuted in the 2nd XI this season; and
- 4 players from our Grand Final side were playing 4th XI last season.

Whilst we ultimately fell short of the ultimate prize this season, there was no doubt that it was one of transition as we found out more about which players were ready to take the next step in the top grades. I have no doubt that this will hold us in good stead for the years to come as these players continue to grow and develop their games.

The clear standout player for us this season was Prathamesh Khare. After bowling first change in Round 1 and picking up 3 wickets, PK did not look back as he took on the important role as our strike new ball bowler. PK bowled some incredible opening spells for us this season, often bowling his 9 overs straight as he proved unplayable for opposition top orders.

17 wickets at an average of 12, the 2nd XI Bowling Award and the 2nd XI Most Valuable Player Award was just recognition for the season PK had. When you couple it with him making his 1st XI debut (and playing 7 1st XI games), it makes it even more remarkable to think that he was playing 4th XI cricket last year (and had averaged 31 and 24 with the ball at 3rd and 4th XI level respectively!).

The other standout newcomer to the 2nd XI this season was young Luke Ajani. At the age of 17 years old – and having only played 4th XI cricket previously – Luke decided not to bother with

wasting his time at 3rd XI level and instead was fast-tracked into the 2nd XI side. A punt was taken with him as an opening batsman as we searched for a way to insert him into the side. What we received was an incredible run of consistency at the top of the order. Luke reached double figures in every game (bar being run out in the GF), looking increasingly at ease the faster the bowling was.

335 runs at 26 was a terrific season for Luke, especially when you consider it was his first season at 2nd XI level. The challenge for Luke will be converting those starts into big scores, cashing in on the hard work he has done initially. What I love about Luke though is his willingness to work on any deficiencies in his game – he is one of the hardest workers on the training track, evidenced by the enormous strides he made with his fielding (and voice in the field) throughout the season. Taking out the D.W. Nicoll Memorial Trophy for Most Promising Young Player was richly deserved, and speaks to the future he has at this club as he continues to develop his game.

Finally, whilst the length of innings was increased to 45 overs (from 40 overs last year), the one-day format continued to make it a difficult balancing act to ensure that everyone remained involved each week whilst also trying to win games of cricket. I can only hope that next season will finally see a return to normality whereby we can get back to playing some 2-day cricket.

This season I owe a massive thank you to the following people for their continued assistance:

- To Greg Ajani and Greg Howes for being my scorers this season and helping to alleviate my concerns on game day;
- Crofty for being the ground manager at Warrawee for all home games – including looking after the Frogbox stream this season for the first time;
- Webby and the Board for their support and providing me with the honour of captaining the 2nd XI again this season – something I am very much grateful for;
- My fellow captains in BJ, Hogs and Shieldsy along with Andrew as the esteemed CoS – it is a thankless task with many hours put in behind the scenes each week to manage the sides, so your support during what can be quite a lonely experience was greatly appreciated;
- To my beautiful wife Becky – thank you again for supporting me in everything that I do when it comes to cricket. I appreciate how much time my passion takes up and am forever appreciative for you not only allowing me to do it, but actively encouraging me to keep going.

Whilst this season was undoubtedly challenging, I look forward to seeing what the future holds for our great club as we transition into a new exciting era with a refreshed playing group.

THIRD ELEVEN REPORT

Firstly, I'd like to thank the board for allowing me to captain the 3's again this season. It's an absolute privilege to lead a team at this great club. Secondly, thank you to all the volunteers that make this club operate like clockwork. Thanks to the board, the sponsors, the coaches, the captains and everyone else who voluntarily dedicates their time to help out. I don't think a lot of players realise the sheer amount of effort that goes in behind the scenes. It is very much appreciated.

I've always been blessed to captain a very senior, experienced side in the 3's at Oakleigh. However due to players either retiring or taking the season off, my round 1 team was extremely young and inexperienced. On top of this, the 3's competition had been split into 2 divisions with us allocated to play the stronger sides all season. There were only 3 players from our losing semi final from the previous season that started round 1- myself, Dharmesh and Matty Bergen. Conversely, we had 5 debutantes in Zayan, Patty Ryan, Tags, Ansh and Max Getley. Despite the large changeover in personnel, we were very competitive against a strong Caulfield outfit. We had Caulfield 9/140 at one stage however an undefeated last wicket partnership of 31 ended up being the difference in the game. Bergs was the pick of the bowlers with 2/15 off 6 overs before limping off with a hamstring strain. In reply we could only manage 143. Zayan made a brilliant 49 with great support from Dyon (26) and Ansh (29). Despite the loss, it was great to see some of the younger guys contribute.

Despite our competitiveness in round 1, I must admit that I didn't hold high hopes for the season ahead. Bergs didn't play another game, and I myself had strained my meniscus and would miss a few weeks. Dharmesh took over the reins as skipper for the following round against Malvern, who are always very strong in the 3's. Despite our inexperience, we absolutely destroyed them, bowling them out for 54. Every guy who was thrown the ball did a stellar job. Razza in his 3's debut took 1 for 1 off 6 overs - his 1 run coming from a wide! Dyon, who kept round 1, opened the bowling round 2 with 2/12 off 7. Panda in his 3's debut took 2/14 off 9. Getely 1/11 off 7 bowled brilliantly whilst Maxy Cavolo took 3/12 off 7. Whilst Tyso didn't take a wicket, his 0/4 off 6 overs continued to build pressure on the bats. We chased their total down with the loss of 2 wickets. Dharmesh brought us home with a patient 21*.

We won our next 4 games as we marched up the ladder. The highlight being our win against the undefeated Mount Waverley in 35 degree heat, despite our front line spinner in Maxy Cavolo sustaining a hip injury early and being unable to bowl. Given we only had 11 players, Maxy stayed on the field to support his team, even taking a brilliant catch at short cover off yours truly. Some highlights over these rounds were Tags hitting a couple of 44's, Tommy Ison taking 3/19 against Endeavour, Tyso taking 4/20 against Ormond and a brilliant match winning performance from Maxy Cavolo taking 3 fa and making 28* to steer us home against Bayswater.

Round 10 saw us up against Caulfield again, the only team to defeat us thus far. Despite some early wickets, we made a very competitive total of 7/181. Jordy Brambleby made a brilliant 76 which was well supported by the evergreen Doc chipping in with 40. Unfortunately our bowlers were unable to impact a strong Caulfield batting side, who won comfortably by 6 wickets. Despite the setback, we battled on to win our remaining 3 games of the season which saw us finish top of the table. Highlights of note were Razza's 4/17 against Baystwater, The big Fish taking 3/20 against Malvern along with Willy Iverson's 35 and Shaun Singh's 29* to make light work of the chase, and then a couple of 3's debutantes in KP making 49 with the bat and Sammy Iverson taking a brilliant 4/16 with the ball to make light work of Endeavour Hills.

3 season's completed as captain, 3 season's finishing top of table. If this were an English comp I'd be hailed as the greatest 3rd eleven captain of all time. "Ben Hogan is to subbies 3's what Ricky Ponting is to World Cups" they would say. Unfortunately though, we play finals in Australia. Our semi final opponent was Malvern, who we'd easily beaten twice throughout the season. Despite this, we were up against a much stronger side in the semi. Thanks to a wonderful 50 from Willy Iverson, we put together a very competitive total of 7/174. When Malvern slumped to 4/85, mostly due to Tyso's incredible 1/5 off 9, we thought the game was almost out of their reach. But some brilliant lower order hitting took us down to the final over.

With 17 runs to play with and after taking a combined 2 for 7 off overs 41 and 43, the 3rds fearless leader (myself) decided to finish off the game by bowling the final over. With the field spread and 5 blokes covering the fence, I was certain a simple victory was imminent. What eventuated was anything but. A decent, straight yorker first up was met with the full force of a Malvern bat, blasting the ball in between cow corner and long on for 4. 13 runs to play with 5 balls left. The second ball was almost identical, this time though young Shaun Singh (who fielded the house down all day) cut it off before the fence, restricting them to 2 and 11 runs to play with. The third ball was a shocker, dragged down as I tried to fire it in fast. The Malvern bat middled it into the Scammell car park for a huge maximum leaving just 5 runs needed from the final 3 balls. The next ball was a wider one that was hit to cow corner for 1- again young Shaun Singh chasing it down quickly and throwing it over the bowler's stumps. 4 to play with off 2. A similar ball again was met with a similar shot, but what looked like a single turned into disaster as the ball bounced under long-ons legs for 4. Scores level with 1 ball remaining. A dot would send OCC into the big dance, any score would send them packing. With the field right in, I darted a wide yorker that swung past the Malvern bat. However, keeper Cooper Fisher spilt it and the ball rolled up the pitch as both Malvern bats sprinted off for the single. Time literally stood still as Coops scurried towards the ball, collected it and dove backwards towards the stumps to knock off the bails. Old umpire Merv at square leg added to the theatre by delaying his decision, then slowly started raising his index finger to signal that Malvern were short of their ground and sending the OCC 3rd eleven into the grand final and into hysterics.

Our grand final opponent was the only team that had beaten us all year, Caulfield. They won the toss and elected to bat, a decision we were very pleased about after our lethal opening bowler Tyso had them 2 for 0! From there though, Caulfield consolidated and put on a very good score of 6/170. We couldn't get any momentum in the chase, dropping to 5/56 until DK came in a provided some hope with a whirlwind 30 off 40 balls. Unfortunately nobody else passed 13 and we ended up all out for 131. It certainly was a disappointing end to the season, but we can hold our heads up high knowing that we fought right to the very end with an extremely youthful and inexperienced side.

I'd like to thank everyone who represented the 3rd eleven this year. It was a privilege to play with each and every one of you. A huge thanks to the other captains and Andrew Splatt who did an amazing job as Chairman of Selectors. It was an extremely difficult year for selection, with a ridiculous amount of last minute changes. At times it felt like a full time job (lucky Andrew doesn't have one). But overall it was very pleasing to see the ongoing success across the grades despite the difficulties with Covid and the large amount of senior players that departed from the season before. Also many thanks to the board, supporters, sponsors and of course our esteemed president Webby who does an incredible job year in year out. Go the mighty Oaks!

FOURTH ELEVEN REPORT

The lead up to the 2021/22 cricket season was once again surrounded by the dark cloud of covid and an understandable reluctance by many to commit to anything, and hence we found ourselves almost at the starting line with many of the squad having only met virtually.

After an ultimately disappointing Grand Final loss the previous season I was extremely proud that several of the players that had led that charge were afforded opportunities in higher XIs due to a number of senior players opting to take a gap year.

Marcus Allen led the wicket takers in the 2s, Prathamesh Khare won the bowling trophy and made a strong impact at First XI level, while Luke Ajani was the leading run scorer and Diyon De Silva improved steadily with the gloves and his match winning innings against Ormond and Werribee in the finals saw them through to a Grand Final berth. In addition, Ashwin Mehta mainstay of the fours last year moved onto Casey-South Melbourne and steadily worked his way up the grades to debut in the seconds, plundering a 3rd XI and Dowling century in a successful season.

Meanwhile others made a splash in the 3rd XI, headlined by mighty Matty Tyson who's name will adorn the famous honours board forevermore after his stunning season leading the 3s attack, likewise Max Cavolo continued his trajectory, Rahul Surendran, Sam Iverson, Ben Salmon and Tom Ison also performed very well at the level after cutting their teeth in the 4s and 5s. Cooper Fisher was another who quickly established himself as a talent of the future and acquitted himself successfully in both the 2s and 3s when the opportunity arose.

With such a high turnover, we commented in the round 4 Semi-Final re-match against Malvern (after the first two rounds were abandoned due to rain and the opposition suffering a covid breakout) that only myself and Harry D'Rozario played in both games, that's an incredible amount of change in just four games. As a result of the vastly inexperienced line up and lack of intensive training our early season our form was patchy, however a promising 50+ run stand in the opening game against a very experienced and rejuvenated Caulfield by 15-year-old Shaun Singh and 14-year-old Enrique Sidhu was a sign of things to come.

Our first win was a thriller against top of the ladder Malvern, missing veteran 4s champ Ryan Chapple, we were up against it, but Shaun top scored in an extremely mature knock, ably supported by Matt Girolami growing in confidence from his 5s premiership the year before and

the first occurrence of what would become welcome cameos by Mr Worldwide Akshay Patel gave us a solid platform of 171 to defend, albeit on a fast, small track at T. H. King. The game went right down to the wire, but Enrique showing control beyond his years for a leg-spinner was able to reign in the set batters and ensure a narrow victory. Unfortunately, the winning formula hadn't been unlocked quite yet and we struggled to close out games in the next couple of months despite holding ascendancy and momentum in each.

The never-ending merry go-round of covid related absences and other commitments due to a backlog of celebrations from the past two years made selection as challenging as at any time in memory. An unbelievable 29 players pulled on a 4th XI cap in our 12 games, compared to 23 in sixteen last year, and we also had to deal with mid-season transfers as talented but raw Felix Howard and Enrique Sidhu were enticed to Premier clubs Casey-South Melbourne and Frankston Peninsula respectively. While we at Oakleigh and in the wider VSDCA encourage and actively prepare kids to take the next step in achieving their career potential, we feel the system is not working as well as it could when 15-year-old kids are plucked from fourth XI standard and thrust into the cutthroat premier cauldron. We hope to work more closely with our neighbouring clubs and associations to be more transparent in this pathway moving forward, with the ultimate objective of ensuring the players have the best chance of success.

A shuffling of the bowling attack to move Harry D to the opening slot provided a lot of stability and allowed us to start to introduce some strategy around building pressure across the 40 overs, the rapid improvement of Harry Mann and Sam Iverson in this environment with their ability to maintain this pressure into the second half of the innings drew positive results and we slowly moved off the bottom and into contention for a miraculous finals qualification. Through necessity we selected enthusiastic players from our junior program as availability across the grades fluctuated from week to week, which gave youngsters such as Cam Chapple, Rayaan Kochher, Joel Ajani, Oliver Toohey, Xavier Soldati all making their Subbies debuts, with each performing admirably when given the opportunity.

This opportunity for the next generation was probably the biggest reason for the turnaround that saw us win five of the last 6 games and just miss out on finals, beating all of the qualifiers in the run home, apart from eventual premiers Endeavour Hills who just outlasted us on both occasions with a vastly more experienced line up. It was palpable in games against Caulfield and Malvern where they stacked their sides with fine cricketers, but years if not decades past their peak, while our side not only comprised kids at the start of their journey but trusted them with bat and ball in the key moments and victory was especially sweet in those clashes.

Alongside the precociousness of youth we received a boost from a few older heads, although in the case of Patrick Ryan and Pierce Kidson-Purry not too much older than the youngsters I've outlined above, along with Gurpreet 'Lally' Sidhu (who ended up winning the 4s batting crown) all made valuable contributions, and while Lally will support his son's career from here, I expect Paddy and Pierce to continue a steep curve of improvement next year, both are very capable cricketers.

I'd like to make special mention of Ryan Chapple primarily and Daniel Croft for taking on leadership of the team in my injury absence towards the back end of the season, Ryan has played that role previously, along with a myriad of other tasks such as curator, covers manager, ground maintenance, taxi driver as well as star batsman. DC was coerced back with the lure of the captain's armband, he took to the role with great aplomb, and it would be fantastic to see

him back as he has a lot of value to offer, and the competitive fire still burns as you could see when he struck that glorious straight six in a match-winning knock.

Congratulations to my fellow captains Rob Howes and Ben Hogan on guiding your teams to Grand Finals in such an interrupted season, it was a true measure of your commitment and passion that you were able to rise above any challenge presented to get the opportunity to play off for immortality, unfortunately we faced opposition who were slightly better on the day in each match. Likewise, Brendan McGuinness in his final year at the helm of the First XI, Anthony Howes in the underappreciated role heading the fifths and Andrew Splatt with the unenviable job as Chairman of selectors. I honestly feel we as a collective leadership group did as good of a job in selecting teams and developing players as could possibly be expected. Whether the same quality Oakleigh people continue in those roles or not next season, we are hopeful that greater continuity with training, a traditional mixture of two and one-day matches, and social functions will allow us to rebuild a selfless team-first culture again that has driven so much Oakleigh success through the years.

A massive thank you as always to Peter Webb and his committee, Webby is a doyen in the annals of the Oakleigh Cricket Club history and we are so fortunate that in our 142-year history we are under his leadership in our time at the club. Thank you also to all the volunteers and contributors, Neil Croft for his work as ground manager and coordinating the lucrative and iconic coterie groups, and in setting up Frogbox each home game, this initiative has added a great new element to our club and should expand in the coming years, Wendy Webb who is magnificent in her weekly role of managing the Val Holten Rooms and kitchen, it doesn't go unappreciated, to all the scorers and team managers, special shout out to Harry D'Rozario this year in the fours who got many a team out of a technical pickle caused by online scoring. To Brendan McGuinness for his endless drive in improving our club, from the tangible social media content to his back room negotiating to progress our ambitions of new clubrooms he's a marvel, and to Mick Lawson and Glenda Splatt who have indicated they will resign their key off-field posts as Treasurer and Admin Officer respectively (Glenda also along with Pete for keeping the weekly meals an ongoing tradition) for their tremendous service, and Rob Howes for taking on Roly's stats and expanding them into the digital era. We hope that others can see themselves getting more involved next year as we look to refresh and regenerate.

And last but far from least, a special thanks to my family, Kristi and Keats may not always be understanding of my fascination with our great game, but they are to a tee supportive of my passion for our club. Hopefully my efforts make them proud.

I have greatly enjoyed my time as Fourth XI skipper in the past two years, probably moreso this last season, despite not making a deep finals run as it provided greater opportunity to positively impact and influence that important next generation, indoctrinating them with Oakleigh's unique values and game sense, and hopefully fast tracking their improvement to reaching their own ambition and talent thresholds.

CSB T20 REPORT

This season we decided to enter a second T20 side in the Cricket Southern Bayside competition, with the objective being to provide greater opportunities to players not normally picked in the VSDCA T20 side and therefore help to develop more of the playing group.

With the COVID pandemic resulting in the VSDCA T20 competition being abandoned before it began (along with the CSB competition after 3 rounds), it turned out that our second side became our only T20 side for the season.

Our third (and ultimately final) game was undoubtedly a disaster. After bowling Heatherton out for just 98 (and it could have been a lot less if not for some shoddy fielding), the batting unit collapsed to be bundled out for just 63. There was no doubt an element of taking the opposition

lightly in our approach to the run chase, showing that if your focus is but just a smidgeon off then it can be exposed quite significantly on game day.

Unfortunately the COVID pandemic ended our tournament right there, with us sitting 2nd on the ladder at the time of abandonment. Personally I found it quite enjoyable to have the opportunity to play in some T20 games, as it provided myself (and the majority of the side) with exposure to different tactics and game situations that we ordinarily are not exposed to.

CLUBS STRIKE SHIELD FOR BATSMAN WHO COLLAPSED AND A PLAYER WHO HELPED SAVE HIS LIFE

Late in the 2020/21 season, the fourth eleven match between Oakleigh and Endeavour Hills was called off. Endeavour Hills batsman, Bihan Weerakoon, suffered a cardiac arrest in the Scammell Reserve change rooms after being bowled.

The quick presence of mind and actions of Oakleigh Life Member, Ryan Chappell, saved Bihan's life. Ryan quickly went into action and performed CPR for about 10 minutes until an ambulance arrived at Guest Road.

Endeavour Hills president Arun Rajendran, who played in the match, recalled: "At that moment Oakleigh and Endeavour Hills teamed up to perform CPR. Tristan Ward was speaking with the paramedics keeping them updated with the situations and counting his respiratory rate, Phil Sankey was in charge of the defibrillator, Jay Stent was holding B's hand and continuing to talk to B and of course Ryan Chappell did the CPR work."

When it became apparent 'B' had been stabilised, Rajendran said, "Ryan came out of our changerooms in tears and said the words, 'He is going to be OK fellas' and embraced every one of us with a hand shake and a hug."

People were shaken – "We thought we'd lost him," Rajendran said – and the match was abandoned.



A few days later, Weerakoon, soon to turn 40 and the father of two young daughters, underwent a triple heart bypass.

The Chapple Weerakoon Shield will be awarded after all Fourth XI games between the clubs.

The first Chapple Weerakoon Shield match was played a year after Bihan Weerakoon had a cardiac arrest in the changerooms.

Endeavour Hills took possession of the Trophy, with Chappell (30 runs) and Weerakoon (27) both good contributors for their sides.

Weerakoon said he would be eternally grateful to Chappell and the other players who helped him through the ordeal. He said he was "very, very lucky".

In the year since he's taken care to focus on his health. He's eating better, walking, and of course playing for the Hills, alongside some of the players who were there when he most needed them 12 months ago.
