COACH'S REPORT

Season 2018/19 adds another remarkable chapter to this great and proud club as we tasted success with our 7th Ken Fewster Club Championship and Premierships for our 1st XI and 3rd XI.

The 2nd XI and 4th XI were particularly ruthless as they enjoyed an undefeated regular season. They can be very proud of their efforts, as they were a huge part in securing our Club Championship.

FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

A glorious 2018/19 season saw all 4 senior teams make the finals, culminating in winning the VSDCA Club Championship and 2 flags for the Oaks – congratulations to Coach Splatt & our captains - and off-field, a profit in excess of \$2,000 eventuated.

Income for the year rose by \$2,000 to reach \$103,000 and expenses decreased by \$4,000 - to \$101,000 - a breakdown of items follows.

Wins for the season included \$3,100 revenue from the Toyota Raffle; Ivor Donohue endeavouring to maximise interest received on our substantial term deposit assets; and abolition of the unpopular \$2 “cash-out” fee when using EFTPOS ...

Members subscriptions were increased (for the first time since 2013/14) to help meet significant increases in a number of costs (particularly electricity charges); netting \$23,200 for seniors & \$15,120 for juniors. Analysis showed subs were still lower than many rival sub-district clubs.

Sponsorship revenue continued to contribute significantly to our overall result. OCC was fortunate again to receive sponsorship from our loyal supporters: Murrumbeena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; Rotary Club of Oakleigh; Sign*A*Rama (Oakleigh); Allfloors Carpet Gallery; Ray White Oakleigh; Jetts Fitness; Rosstown Hotel; Mortgage Choice; Gannon & Turner Associates; Junkeer Business Solutions; Spring Osteo Clinic; and Cote Terra. Thanks to all of these organisations, and - especially Trent Shields - for his diligent pursuing of new sponsors such as Icon Sports & Eyecare Plus.

Player Sponsor profits declined slightly on the prior season, as sponsors took up their rewards more diligently than in 2017/18.

Profit from Social Activities rose by \$4,800 - mainly due to Lobster Club returns & the Toyota Raffle. A summary showing the results of these activities is included with this report.

Thanks go to those who participated in various Social Activities, whether by running the event, purchasing supplies for the Bar/BBQ, or working on the day. Special thanks go to the finance team of Roly Williams & Ivor Donohue, for their guidance & support; & Connor Byrne for running the Thursday night raffles during the season.

Special thanks to Neil Croft for organising and recruiting new members to the Lobster Club - which produced a profit of nearly \$8,000 – due to the first eleven winning an admirable 12 games. Roly's skills at processing payments, also made my job easier.

There were 44 members in 2018/19, & these supporters of the Lobster Club enjoyed a sumptuous dinner in May.

Merchandise inventory levels fell by almost \$1,000 as a result of conscious efforts to reduce obsolete stock & hold only necessary/saleable items.

The \$3,000 decrease in expenses for 2018/19 consisted mainly of the following items:

- A \$2,100 drop in Training Facility Hire fees following a change to Sandown Indoor, from state of the art, TNF.
- Substantially lower Repairs & Maintenance spending

In conclusion, continued development of junior players, allied with the core of senior players & recruitment of a professional player, should keep OCC around the top of the VSDCA ladder.




SCOPE

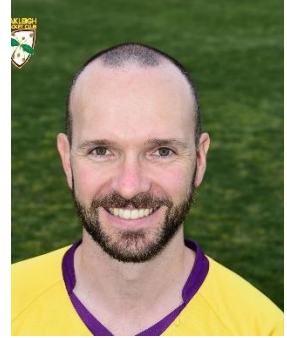

FIRST ELEVEN REPORT

It is with great pride that I submit this report to the Oakleigh Cricket Club as 1st XI Premiers.

The Oaks evolution continued this season, with four debutants and a number of fringe players staking their claim for a permanent spot in the 1st XI.

Personally, witnessing the changing face of the 1st XI was one of the most satisfying highlights in another very successful season. Expectations were tempered this season after the departure of key personnel in Ben Pinwill (retired) and Sam Jones (Premier Cricket) during winter.



However, the opportunities created by the two departures allowed us to experiment with different players and line-ups to find the right team balance. Heading into the season, I was confident we had a group with the talent to challenge for the premiership.

As it often does, pre-season came and went in the blink of eye. A new coach, a focus on strength & conditioning, and a committed core group of players made for an enjoyable and productive pre-season. Positive performances in practice matches against Brunswick and Kingston Hawks in Benalla ensured we were prepared for the season ahead.

We faced a challenging run to Christmas with Caulfield, Melton, Ormond, Yarraville and Williamstown. After accounting for Moorabbin in Rd 1, we faced Caulfield in Rd 2 – playing for the Richardson-Travaglia Shield for the very first time. Reduced to a one-day match, we were superb in almost every way. Mick Splatt jagged Rummans for 0, Geoff Latham destroyed the top order, claiming 3/26 off 9 overs (including Jake Thorne), and Miles Fabris had a day out – claiming 5 dismissals and a quick fire 20 off 14 balls to get us home.



Quality batting performances from Andrew Splatt and James Campbell throughout November & December gave the batting much needed strength and reliability, leading us to victory against Yarraville, Williamstown and Ormond in the run home to Christmas. The return of Premiership Hero/Captain/Coach Graeme Vimpani after Christmas gave the group an enormous lift. Vimps' determination and desire to compete was infectious, and his uncomplicated approach at the crease gave the side much needed stability and runs at the top of the order.

Our form post-Christmas was indifferent, with an unconvincing win against Altona and a disappointing loss at Brighton. This proved to be the turning point of our season, with the group acknowledging that our approach had to change if we were going to have an impact in March. The group committed to doing the hard work, and with every session our performance improved. There was a great sense of belief among the group, momentum was building, and things were starting to click at the right time.

A well fought victory at Hoppers Crossing followed by a deflating tie against Werribee saw us finish 3rd on the ladder – a fair result for our season to date. Hosting Williamstown at Warrawee in the QF, we managed to post 8/218cc – Shane Townsend (57) and Mick Splatt (30) seeing us through to a competitive total. Sunday was all about 'Finals AJ' – capturing a wicket with his 2nd ball and finishing with 5/28 (15) to dismantle Williamstown for an even 70. A shock upset at

Caulfield Park meant we were hosting arch-rivals Caulfield at Warrawee in the Semi-Final the following week.

Winning the toss and batting, our approach was much the same – anything over 200 and we're in the game. At 3/16 things weren't looking great, but key contributions from James Campbell (24), Townsend (47) and M Splatt (46) got us over 200 and firmly in the game. Sunday started well with an early wicket, but with Thorne and Rummans at the crease we knew this is where it had to be won.

Relentless voice, pressure and outstanding fielding, we found a key breakthrough when Jex castled Thorne for 5 – Caulfield 2/33. We managed to wrestle control of the match by the first drinks break, and continued to take steady wickets to maintain control. An outstanding team effort from the bowlers, with contributions from M Splatt 3/27 (22), A Jones 3/49 (28), J Devlin 2/31 (12) and Townsend 2/23 (7) saw us victors by 47 runs, retaining the Richardson-Travaglia shield (2 from 2!) and advance to the Grand Final against Elsternwick.

Grand Final week was fun and focused - the group were relaxed and ready to go. The playing group had the benefit of being in this situation before, which held us in good stead for the weekend.

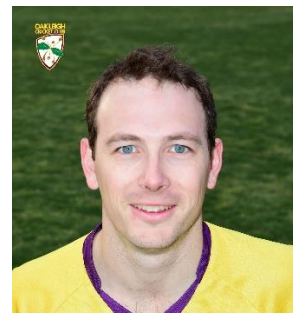


The only low point of the weekend was losing the toss and being asked to bowl first on the flattest wicket ever produced at Warrawee. Led by Jex & AJ with 4 wickets apiece, we dismantled Elsternwick for 62. Despite losing a few quick wickets in the chase, Vimps (68*) and Gareth (29*) saw us through to 2/103 at stumps. At stumps, Elsternwick captain, Cam Christensen conceded defeat. And the rest, they say, is history - 1st XI Premiers.

On reflection, in seven seasons at Oakleigh CC, this Premiership is the sweetest of them all. All season, there were 11 blokes who bought in, who were prepared to work, who left egos at the door, who made themselves accountable, who trusted in one another to play their role and execute. Highlighting the changing face of the 1st XI, only 3 players from our Premiership in 2015/16 were a part of the 2018/19 XI - with a number of players experiencing 1st XI Premiership success for the first time.



I would like to take this opportunity to thank the leadership group - Michael Splatt and Alex Jones. Not only two of the best cricketers I have ever taken the park with, but also two of my best mates. There's no better feeling than that of walking out there with you blokes each and every week.



Thank you for being a sounding board and for your ongoing support all year, and congratulations on your individual performances this season – absolutely outstanding in a Premiership year.

Congratulations to Andrew Donohue and the 3rd XI on their Premiership this season, and to Daryl Mendes and the 4th XI on reaching the Sem-Finals. Both sides are fortunate to have such selfless, dedicated people steering the ship. Our success in the lower grades is largely thanks to your efforts on and off the field. Thank you for your efforts and well done.

Commiserations to Trent Shields and the 2nd XI. A hugely successful season, only to come undone on the last day of the season. So much to be proud of, and your contribution to the Club Championship can't be understated. Well done to all players on an excellent year.

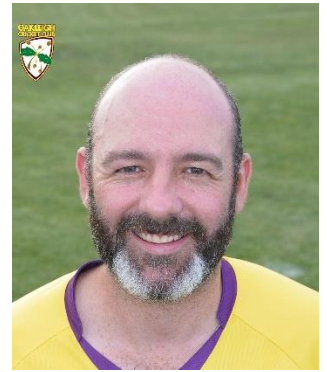

SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

Season 2018/19 much like the previous year was one of many positives, but ultimately the prize we so desperately craved once more eluded us in the final wash up.

From a club perspective though, wow – what a season 2018/19 turned out to be! A stunning, and without being disrespectful unexpected First XI premierships, along with yet another blue triangle for the Third XI despite the ‘policy-on-the-run’ that forced them to grind out a win at an unfamiliar venue even though they earned home ground advantage.



Congratulations to the leadership teams, Brendan, Mick, Alex and Andrew as well as Doc and Ben in the 3s on their very well-deserved crowns.

The club secured an amazing 7th Ken Fewster Club Championship, of which I am extremely proud of the contribution the undefeated 2nd XI played in capturing the title in round 13. Requiring just one victory amongst the four XIs, but this would be no easy feat playing the strong Werribee and Mt Waverley clubs, at times during the day all other 3 sides looked in trouble, but the 2s saluted first and the celebrations commenced – although there were a few late nervous moments at Soldiers Reserve.

To BJ on his selection and performance in the VSDCA representative game against the powerful VCCL XII in a rare win for Subbies, and to Mick Splatt on another exceptional season that saw him claim Oakleigh’s first ever ‘Jack Sheehan’ Medal for player of the First XI final along with his second VSDCA team of the year cap. It would be remiss of me to not mention the wonderful honour bestowed upon Matt Stamps, winning the Allan Stamps Medal for best player in the 3rd XI final, and Dharmesh Patel who was a worthy winner of the Ted Plant Medal for best player in the Fourth XI competition on the back of an extraordinary 904 run season.

While our expectations for last year were not high, a nine-win, 2 draw and two loss season saw us qualify for the finals in first place, a resounding quarter final victory was followed by a disappointing capitulation against our nemesis Malvern. This season, however, we identified Malvern (again), Williamstown and Brighton as our main challengers to the flag in what is typically a very even competition.

Commencing the season with an outright result against Moorabbin with Satvik and Ant recording centuries, before Connor with his debut 5-for steamrolled the Binnars twice on day 2 had our confidence sky high. Annihilations of Caulfield, Taylors Lakes, Melton, Ormond and Yarraville followed before we faced a stern challenge in the form of Williamstown. I personally faced an unusual situation where I was sledged before a ball was bowled due to my selection to bat first on a wicket that was rock hard, but that had a reasonable cover of grass on the surface. To be fair it had been 21 seasons since I last played at Point Gellibrand.

Recovering from 4/55 we entered tea at a solid position of 4/102 before wickets fell at regular intervals and if not for a 29-run stand between Daniel and Nick, Willy may have taken the 6 points on day 1. A couple of late wickets had the match evenly poised, but a wash out left both teams frustrated and itching for the inevitable re-match in March.

The match before Xmas was notable for the debut Second XI appearance of a tall, elegant right hander who started off scratchily before finding his rhythm and carving a majestic century. Of

course, Vimps went on to bigger and better things later in the year and while he may have been unlucky not to be awarded the 'Jack Sheehan Medal', he was certainly best on ground in the hearts of the two boys.

Post the Christmas break our batting collectively developed an unwelcome habit of not utilising our allocated overs. Fortunately, our bowling continued to drive our results, in all six players finished the season with at least 15 wickets and all averaging less than 16 per dismissal. It might sound ridiculous considering those outstanding figures, but I felt we probably could have been even better – I don't believe we were as disciplined as last year, and our fielding provided less support. Special acknowledgment to Ant Howes who performed admirably in his first full season leading the second XI attack with 28 wickets and 349 runs. Aaron Lund claimed 25 wickets following on from his spectacular 17/18 season but would be disappointed he couldn't re-capture that same consistency despite taking important wickets all through the year, especially in the first two finals. Connor Byrne stepped up again and was recognised as the 2nd XI bowling champion taking 22 wickets at a miserly 13.73, at times he was under bowled, an unfortunate side-effect of such a strong attack but still has a lot of room for improvement and I expect him to add to his First XI debut next season.

From a batting perspective, on paper again it looked very successful with six players contributing 298 or more runs on the season, but it was probably our inability to build meaningful partnerships and pace our innings that saw us fall short in agonising fashion on the final day of the season. Rob Howes continued his amazing return from injury and struck 386 runs for the season, mostly in the pivotal number 3 position, without his composure and mental fortitude in the final against Williamstown we quite simply would have lost. Satvik and John O'Keefe earned First XI recalls on the back of some fine innings and both strike the ball with power and finesse, a little luck and clearer focus will see them excel in years to come. Great credit to both on their attitude and efforts to improve their fitness over the course of the year.

Our standout from a batting perspective though was undoubtedly Gareth Campbell, who went from uncertain starter, to Third XI, to dominating the Second XI to striking an imperious unbeaten 29 in the First XI premiership. His technique is not always textbook, but his understanding of his limitations and mental strength more than combat that, and his innings of 78 in the semi-final against Malvern chasing 212 went a long way to removing that hoodoo.

After two hard-fought finals victories against Williamstown and Malvern, we faced the final team, Brighton we'd identified at the start of the season that stood between us and premiership glory. Selecting an extremely talented and capable XII we were unfortunately beaten by the better side across the two days, however this missed opportunity should be considered in full across two seasons where we won 21 home and away matches, losing only 2 and drawing a further three, won 3 finals and had 7 First XI debutants come through the Second XI.

Leading the Second XI over the course of the past two seasons has been a career highlight in my time at Oakleigh, I am very proud and privileged to have had this opportunity and whatever may happen next year I know the strong core group are hungry for success.

The support I received from Jim Benn, Dan Croft and Josh Knight, all whom would acknowledge didn't have their best on-field seasons was immense and a large contributor to the way we performed this year, while others such as Ed Cowan, Kish Sudeep, Nick Thurgood and Tom Cashman all were extremely valuable members of the team and added great skill and

personality when playing in the side, I would expect each of them to push for permanent positions from the 2019/20 season.

One of the biggest challenges to maintaining our professionalism as a club and the associated rewards is the conscious sacrifices we all make, whether that be at work, at home or other social activities. There is no doubt that everyone involved in the club has had a conversation at some stage with a loved one, a boss or a group of friends and had to explain that they can't go on that weekend away, stay late to finish a presentation, make a family wedding, or go to a festival in March because – cricket finals. The love and support we each receive from outside the club walls is an absolutely necessary ingredient for what we achieve on the field, and our successes this year are in no small part to our amazing support network that are every bit as important as the batters, bowlers, administrators, procurement managers, line markers and all other volunteers. Personally, I owe a huge debt of gratitude to my very understanding/patient/selfless wife, Kristi and Keats for not only allowing me to indulge in this great passion, but for actively encouraging me to continue.

To Pete and the board, my fellow skippers, BJ, Doc and especially Daz who endured similar heartache in the washup, Junior in his coaching role, and Norto as chairman of selectors, my eternal gratitude for the support, guidance and willingness to toss around ideas. Last, but not least, a special thanks to the best in the business, Shan for your dual scoring/team management role, a tough gig would be almost impossible without your passion and enthusiasm – thanks and Go Oaks!

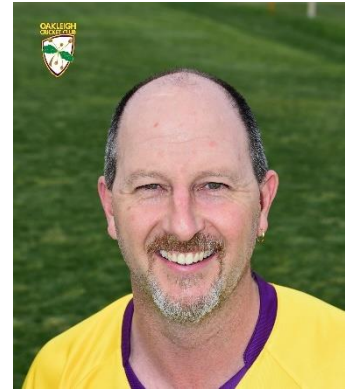

THIRD ELEVEN REPORT

Last year we came very close to a coveted blue triangle eventually losing in a high-quality semi-final to a very good Box Hill team. Entering pre-season and assessing the potential team my genuine belief was that we would struggle to even make the finals.

How wrong I was. However, it was not until we beat Bayswater in the semi-final did I realistically entertain the idea we may actually go the whole way. A spate of retirements and departures had impacted the club across the elevens and we were also (rightfully) going to lose some very good players to higher teams.



Overall just from the 3rd XI 17/18 group we had lost players like Howes (Anthony and Rob), O'Keefe, and for the most part "Ed" Cowan and Gareth Campbell (all to higher 11's); Brasher (Tom and Jordy), Brambleby, Skade, Shaw, Burke and van der Merwe (work, study, other clubs, retirements etc).

To counter this was the arrival at the club of a crop of players who at nearly all other clubs would not be playing in the 3rd XI. We added to the books Sam Phelan, Manav Shah, Kishan Sudeep, Chris Tsesmelis, Michael Carter Heshan Inamulawa and mid year regained Zac Raymond. Crucial cameos from high quality players such as Matt Naughtin and Dylan Grandell were also crucial as it would turn out.

So, we patched together an assorted team of new players, old players, experienced players, young players and even younger players. The season commenced, round one kicked off and the die was cast. Yet again we had no specialist keeper and Tom Cashman did an admirable job filling in until Sam foolishly admitted he had once been a keeper and got the job for the rest of the season. Early on we dropped catches, fielded poorly and batted worse. We sputtered and struggled and battled and found different ways to muddle and bumble to get through the regular season.

Yet somehow after an improbable and bizarre round 1 outright against Moorabbin, we stayed on top all the way through until round 12 (when an outright to Bayswater meant they leapt over us). So, though we eventually finished second we were not humming along (in fact we lost two of our last three games). On the way to doing this we:

- Scored the 2nd lowest runs in the competition.
- But took the 2nd most wickets and had the 2nd lowest runs scored against.
- Won outright twice.
- Did not bat the full overs XI once for the entire season (not in 80 overs games, nor one day game or even in the T20!).
- Made 200 just once: in round one, on a tiny ground, against Moorabbin.
- Lost to three of the eventual top six teams (Bayswater, Malvern and Mount) and didn't finish the game against one other (Balwyn; OCC 72 drew Balwyn 7-45!).

But then came the finals and somehow, we had worked out our game enough and how we played best as a team at the right time. We played with regard to our limitations and keeping our strengths in mind. In the last five games we bowled first in perfect batting conditions on absolute roads (four times of our own choosing). In all three finals I won the toss and with heart in mouth chose to bowl (to the total bemusement of the opposition captains, they obviously don't use My Cricket enough!). Each time I was expecting to have Ian Chappell's famous

aphorism about winning the toss and batting unceremoniously shoved down my throat; but it wasn't. We had saved our best three games of the season for the last three games and the result was a Grand Final win for OCC. Across the finals series every single player did as they were asked, checked their egos at the door and all made crucial contributions. Our batting is our Achilles heel, so we protected it and led with our strength because yet again it was the bowling that relentlessly and repeatedly won the games for us, even when the opposition thought they had us at their mercy. Without fail our bowlers did the job all year.

Five of the competition's top twenty bowlers were from OCC. Regulars Stamps, Hogan, Thurgood, Cowan, Knight, Raymond were joined by newcomers to the 3's Matt Tyson, Chris Tsesmelis, Michael Carter, Heshan and others. And to add to this bowling attack the batsmen stood up just in time. In the finals we only lost 13 wickets (that does give a slightly misleading impression of the closeness of the finals series) and the two games we batted for the longest for the entire season were both when it mattered, in finals. We have some very good batsmen and we saw that at times throughout the season, guys like Sam, Kish, Manav, Thurgood have talent to burn and along with Will and Jack Iverson, Tom Cashman and Zac, the best is very much still to come.

The season lows seemed numerous and large at the time but were actually few and far between: our inconsistent batting, the games against Baywater and Balwyn, the way some responded to difficult selection decisions and the ever widening gap between the good and not so good clubs/teams.

But the highlights were many and varied and a totally biased, non-comprehensive, selection of my personal ones (with apologies to the many more I don't have the time and space to include) would include:

- Will Iverson's innings in the grand final, I can't say enough about it. He has now batted for around 130 overs against Balwyn in three games without being dismissed and has carried his bat twice.
- Matt Stamps was robbed against Balwyn in the home and away game where he took all 7 wickets before the game was washed out the following week so he followed up with 5 in the Grand Final to take best on ground honours.
- Every Matt Tyson wicket (and there were some big ones) lifted the spirit of the whole team, the stumping at Brighton a particular highlight (and fun fact he was not dismissed for the entire season!).
- Batting with Norto against Mt. Waverley in the first final was fantastic (I'll also selfishly say playing in the 2's at Werribee with half the 3's team that won the flag two years ago).
- Josh Knight: ability, character and professionalism personified in the face of obvious disappointment.
- Zac's devastating spell of 14 balls in the first final to take 5 for 2. He was on hat trick twice and took a hat trick (all bowled) and yet no one at all noticed!
- Tom Cashman and Nick Cowan's batting and running masterclass in the 2nd innings at Moorabbin
- Ben Hogan's sustained excellence, again. 190 overs (including a lazy 22 in a row in the grand final) 71 maidens 26 wickets at 13.7 with an economy rate of 1.9. If we could catch, he would have had 40.
- Watching over the last few seasons as young, former 3's players like James Benn, John O'Keefe, Miles and Satvik rise up the ranks and into the ones. I look forward to watching them continue and more to follow.

- The continued evolution of Nick Thurgood in to a genuine all rounder. Can bat, can bowl and could talk for Australia if required.
- Daryl's OCC Life membership acceptance speech.

Thanks again to the many, many people who helped get us to the premiership this year. The OCC committee, but particularly Peter Webb and Trent Shields, they just do so much work. Thanks, and congratulations to Andrew Splatt for a great inaugural year as coach. To the captains/selection committee (Brendan, Trent, Daryl and Matt Naughtin) for in depth, nuanced discussions, long emails and fabulous support. Congratulations also to BJ and all the 1's and commiserations to Trent and Daryl and the 2's and 4's. I truly believed they were the two best teams this year, it is a harsh and unforgiving sport. Thanks to Richard Blaze (scorer, manager and adviser) for being exceedingly generous with his time. To the fellow members of the triumvirate Ben Hogan and Matt Stamps. I may have the captain's asterisk next to my name but that is not an accurate indication of how the team worked.

Thanks to the many parents, partners, families, children and friends who chatted, supported, helped, drove, prepared afternoon teas and cleaned up but especially Tony and Raquel Raymond. Thanks yet again to my friends and family, Kerri, Hamish, Angus and my parents Ivor and Diana for on and off field support. And to the entire OCC a big thank you.

To the 22 players who took to the field in the 3's this year, every single person without exception, played an important part in our win this year. From new rooms, outrights after oppositions declared, to having 12 players on the field, missing hat tricks, to fielding mishaps, batting collapses, run outs, home grand finals at oppositions grounds it was a strange year. Thank you and congratulations to you all for your efforts and contributions. It truly is a team effort and other clubs would be wise to take note. Job well done.

So, I guess that sums up the season in one small way. We did what we needed to do. It wasn't pretty most of the time, it wasn't classical, we didn't destroy teams, but we found a way. And that is the way Oakleigh does things; just find a way. At the end of the day you only need one more run than the opposition, each game for 16 games and that is all.

Next year when our batting catches up with our bowling, when our fielding steps up again, then look out because no one will get near us. So, enough about the statistics, the mishaps, the selections, the controversies, the who did what and when because the upshot is the 2018/2019 premiership plaque and blue triangle now sit in the club rooms, along with the medallions, the stories and our memories of playing together this year.

FOURTH ELEVEN REPORT

The 4th XI had 24 players play at least one game this season, welcoming new seniors Harkanwal (Harry) Singh, Manav Shah, Kishan Sudeep, Michael Carter and Heshan Inamaluwa, and new juniors Tom Ison, Tom Reid, Diyon De Silva and Dhruv Parikh.

For the home and away rounds, we had eight one dayers, four two dayers and one T20, going through unbeaten to finish on top of the ladder.



The first game of the season was a two dayer against Moorabbin. With five juniors in the team (including three OCC debutants), we were put in by their skipper who clearly rued that decision after we had compiled a solid 7/269cc, led by Dharmesh Patel who carried his bat for a memorable 120*. The Bins were in immediate trouble on the second day at 4/31 (Mendes with all four), before an irritating 78 run stand. In one for those with an alliteration fetish, it was the deft Diyon De Silva and the guileful Grace who took two wickets apiece to put the Bins out, before a brief foray into a potential outright was scuppered after Ison's two quick wickets and a run out from De Silva.

Our batting was again the mainstay of the season to date with a mammoth 3/246cc in the Round 2 one dayer against Caulfield. The backbone of the innings was a 216 run opening stand between Patel (119) and Jack Iverson (95*), whose chances of an (Iron) maiden century after his first senior half century were stymied only by the limited overs. The Fielders were never in the hunt as their ersatz batting crumbled early, with wickets shared around. Round 3 was essentially a non-event as only one Noble Park batsman reached double figures, demolished for a paltry 57 (De Silva with four wickets) before Patel and Iverson made quick work of the runs, winning in less than nine overs.

Croydon laid down our first real challenge in the Round 4 one dayer with two sixty run partnerships against some ill-disciplined bowling and fielding to finish at 8/160cc, curbed only by Kobi Wallis' mop up 'Michelle'. The burgeoning relationship between Patel and Iverson continued with a 48 run opening stand, and we were sitting pretty at 2/96. Inexplicably, we disintegrated to 7/122 before some rear-guard action from De Silva and Singh took us to 8/146. The loss of De Silva and then Ison left us at 9/151 with four overs to play and no room for error. The tension was unceremoniously released by Singh, who despatched a full ball for six (luckily dropped and carried over the boundary) before landing the killer blow of a boundary from the next ball with the temerity of Arya Stark stabbing the Night King. Post-match discussions about the need to keep the Number 11 (Mendes) off the strike to ensure the win were quickly sullied by said Number 11.

The recent domination against Ormond continued in our Round 5 one day fixture, ripping through their inexperienced batting line up led by Mendes' 'five-fa' to leave them with a miserly 101, before another unbeaten opening union of 'Piverson' ('Jamesh'?) laid claim to their corpses like Countess Báthory to secure the win in fifteen overs. The ease of this win was unbelievably surpassed in the Round 6 one day fixture against Elsternwick. With Iverson being promoted to the 3rd XI and Sudeep playing in the 4th XI, it was utter devastation as the opening pair put on an extraordinary 0/271cc (Sudeep 128*, Patel 123*). This score not only surpassed the record for the highest OCC partnership for any wicket in any eleven, but is also the record for the highest

VSDCA 4th XI opening partnership. The Wicks were snuffed out for a meagre 105, Carter doing the bulk of the damage with four scalps.

Round 7 against Balwyn finally brought about a return to two day cricket after a hiatus of two months, being put in on a dreary day in difficult batting circumstances. After losing openers Patel and Wallis, the experienced pair of Chapple and Grace (62) put on 97 to steady the innings before a disappointing collapse of 5/14. Once again, it was De Silva who braved the conditions to slowly build an innings, firstly with Singh and then with Ison, to finally be the last man dismissed with the score on 177. The Balwynites had to face eight overs on the first day, and it was the hostile pace of Singh that tore through the top order, hunting his prey like some sort of crepuscular animal to take 3/8 and have us poised for an onslaught, only to have the second week washed out. The last round before Christmas was against Bayswater in the unpopular T20 format, where a 60 run partnership between Patel and Chapple was the platform to build a competitive 8/129cc before a clinical bowling and fielding exhibition slowly squeezed the life out of Bayswater like a boa constrictor.

The new year brought more of the same for Patel (90) in the Round 9 one dayer against Box Hill, firstly putting on 55 in an opening stand with Wallis, followed by a second wicket partnership of 160 with Chapple (71). A quick fire cameo by Grace propelled the score over 250 before a calamitous call from Patel saw him run out just ten runs short of his fourth ton of the year. 5/255cc was going to be difficult to chase, and it was youngster Tom Reid's four wickets that closed out the game as we triumphed by 125 runs. The Round 10 two dayer against Brighton saw the return of Iverson (52) to the 4th XI, and an overjoyed Patel joined forces with his wunderkind partner to put on 110 for the first wicket, followed by 117 with Chapple (71). While wickets continued to fall, Patel batted on as calmly as the waters of Lake Baikal, finishing unbeaten on 110* in a total of 8/282cc. The second day was all about Singh's brutal five wicket haul as he systematically dismantled the top order to show that 'Singh Is King' as we rolled through them for 52. Unsurprisingly made to follow on, Wallis' three quick wickets had the sniff of a potential outright as they floundered at 5/27 before steadying.

Our batting continued to defy logic in the Round 11 fixture against Malvern, with another immense opening stand of 155 from Patel (77) and Iverson (74), before the theme was continued by Chapple (62) and a late innings blitz of clean hitting from the ever-capable Singh finally generated a total of 6/330cc. It seemed that for many of the team that we would just win this by default, but Malvern came out fighting and continued to score freely, ably helped by some inconsistent bowling and some of the most woeful catching and abysmal fielding that has been seen at Oakleigh for some time. At 9/289cc, it was Malvern who probably won the day though the points were still ours. A poignant reminder for the team to not assume victory, regardless of the score that is on the board. The penultimate round of the home and away season pitted us against Endeavour Hills in the even more unpopular 'split innings' format, with Patel (92*) and David Labrooy (amazingly only 27*) putting on 0/126 from our first forty overs before the Hills Hoists cautiously persevered to 1/62 at the end of the first day. Their continuation on Day 2 was somewhat less inspiring, losing 9/36 in a rout led by Reid's five wickets before another dominant batting display from Patel (retiring on 100* as per 'split innings' rules), Chapple (51 ret hurt) and the middle order piled on 211 from our second allotment of forty overs to conclude on a colossal 5/337cc.

The last match of the home and away season, a one dayer against Mount Waverley, had a lot riding on it for the 4th XI, as a win would secure both top spot and ensure that the club would win

the Club Championship. Chapple's rich vein of form continued with a fluent 78 as wickets fell all too regularly around him, before De Silva joined him at 6/107. Together, the master and the apprentice put on a quickfire partnership of 56 before the elder was dismissed at 7/163. De Silva continued to exhibit his value as a reliable lower order bat, putting on 59 with Inamaluwa to take the score to 7/222cc, De Silva finishing with his first senior half century of 51*. Regular wickets fell to leave them struggling at 6/88 before a slight resurrection with some lower order firepower (Ed. also the name of an excellent Judas Priest album) before the game petered out, ending at 9/180cc with a victory to us and locking in our VSDCA record seventh Club Championship.

Our fourteenth finals campaign in fifteen seasons began against Moorabbin in the quarter final, winning the toss and batting on Moorleigh Reserve. A 52 run opening stand from 'Piverson' followed by a more measured 56 from Chapple looked to be the beginnings of a huge score before being reined in before tea. With the loss of Chapple and Wallis in quick succession, it was the flair of Manav Shah (69) and outright bullying by Singh (41) that formed the yin and yang of an 87 run stand, ending at 8/256cc after a deluge of dropped catches. Singh's form continued with the ball with three early wickets on the second day, but Moorabbin played an excellent brand of cricket to be within striking distance of an unlikely win. It was De Silva again featuring in the key moments with a wicket on either side of tea which turned the tide back into our favour. The lethal Singh then cleaned up the tail for his second 'five-fa' of the season, Moorabbin dismissed for 162.

We made the trek to Bayswater for the semi final, losing the toss and bowling. Both openers were taken just after tea following an 88 run stand, but a third wicket stand of 88 runs gave the home side the ascendancy at 4/194. While we clawed back a potential huge score to take 6/55, it was our numerous dropped catches and somewhat wayward bowling for Bayswater to finish on 249. At 0/60, 'Piverson' had us scoring freely and quickly before losing the top three in quick succession, and at 5/85, it was Wallis and Singh who built a 58 run partnership only to have Wallis dismissed on the last ball before tea at 6/143. The task became more difficult with the loss of de Silva at 7/163, finally being all out for 171. It was extremely disappointing to play our worst game in the semi to end out season after being the best team all year, but Bayswater were the better team across both days.

The most notable mention of the season must go to the incomparable Dharmesh Patel, whose ability to bat for lengthy periods of time for the team resulted in a tsunami of runs, and culminated in him winning the medal for the best 4th XI player in the competition after being runner up last season.

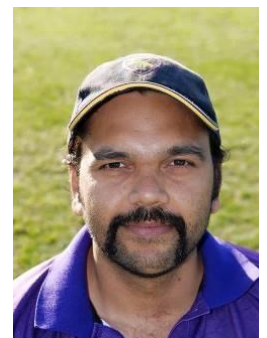
