



FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

A transitional year for the Oaks at the 1st XI level – sweetened by premierships for the 3rd XI & the Veterans team – plus the 4th XI & U15's almost getting over the line in their respective Grand Finals & the seconds making it to Week 2 of the finals. Congratulations to the various captains & coaches.

The Club made a small profit this season (\$400) - an outstanding achievement considering the loss of several key sponsors in 2023/24; & less wins for the 1st XI - resulting in substantially lower Lobster Club proceeds.

Income rose by \$17,000 to \$137,000 & expenses increased by \$10,000 to almost \$137,000. A breakdown of material items follows.

Wins for the season included \$5,000 from Clads; Turtle's Landscape Construction increasing overall sponsorship by \$2,500; continued support from our loyal sponsors; Ray White Oakleigh increasing by \$1,250 to \$3,750; the KPAC Group coming onboard; & Player Sponsors increasing by \$500. A special mention to BJ McGuinness & Bruce Dowland for obtaining \$7,500 in various grants & to Ivor Donohue for taking advantage of Reserve Bank increased interest rates and managing OCC Term Deposits, accordingly - resulting in an increase of \$2,800 in interest earned.

Members' subscriptions comprised \$32,500 for seniors & \$13,500 for juniors. 2023/24 Subscriptions were increased, following a committee decision to avoid a repeat of the \$6,000 overall loss of the previous season.

As ever Sponsorship revenue made a huge contribution to the overall result – both from new and our core sponsors. OCC was fortunate again to receive sponsorship from: Rotary Club of Oakleigh Clayton Huntingdale; Murrumbeena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; Oak Construction; Allfloors Carpet Gallery; Ray White Oakleigh; Mortgage Choice; Primestone Wealth; Kookaburra; Signarama; Spring Osteo Clinic; Bentleigh Wine Store; Elite School Photography & Cote Terra. Thanks to all these organizations, and - especially Peter Webb & Trent Shields – for locking in continued supporters as above - and attracting new sponsors.

A big thank you to Turtle & our players for increasing Player Sponsorships to \$5,850.

Despite the lower Lobster Club returns, Profit from Social Activities rose by approximately \$2,400 – mainly due to the Toyota Raffle; functions run by Jim Benn & his team, and increased Bar prices.

Thanks to those who bought supplies for the Bar; to Glenda & Pete for their ongoing commitment to Splatty Meal Deals & East Bentleigh Bakers Delight. Again, my finance team of Bettina Latham, Roly Williams & Ivor Donohue assisted greatly in getting OCC back on the positive side of the ledger. Also, no VSDCA fines incurred again thanks to David Anning, although we did receive a Mercantile C.A. fine ...

Neil Croft maintained Lobster Club membership at 53 – which saw a profit of over \$4,300 - making a vital contribution in these tight economic times. These supporters of the Lobster Club can look forward to an enjoyable dinner in late June 2024. Thanks again to Bettina for processing these payments.

The \$10,000 increase in expenses was mainly attributable to higher Cricket Operation costs (\$15,600); cricket ball costs up \$2,000; junior development costs rose by over \$1,600; umpire fees were raised by various competitions resulting in a \$2,000 increase in expense - offset by a \$4,000 reduction in Monash Council rental charges – unlike last season no charge has been made for the Craig Team, the T20 match & Woolworths Blast & only 2 home finals matches were played. Charging for Craig Team indoor training helped the club save \$3,800 & lower senior pre-season training costs, saved a further \$2,400.

In conclusion, (after analysis of member categories showed almost half of players identified as "Students") to keep the club financial & simplify Members Subscriptions, I propose that the current "Full membership of \$680" & lower "Student/Unemployed \$550" rate be replaced by one Subscription fee of \$600 p.a. entitling people to be members of the OCC.

The 2023/24 marked our second season in the Mercantile Cricket Association under the sage leadership of former OCC First XI player Alec Kahn. In addition we welcomed a new captain for the first time in our four-year reincarnation of the Fifth XI, with Anthony Howes handing over the armband to our Stockport Georgians guest Carlos Wakefield.

With the season consisting solely of one day matches, selection proved challenging in the first few months as unavailability and injury decimated our depth and we called on enthusiastic but inexperienced junior players, coupled with moving up a grade to South B and we struggled to be competitive against seasoned veterans.

The positives from this were numerous though with our elevation to a higher division loosening the restrictions on our more senior players and also exposing some of our U15 Friday players such as Cam DeCouto, Seb Trent, Ayaan Gautam, Jashn Shah and Milen George to their first taste of senior cricket.

In addition and as one of the main reasons for the club again investing significant resources in a Fifth XI was the opportunity for other junior players to gain valuable senior experience to fast track their development. The returning Razza Surendran played a single game in the 5s while he was building match fitness, despite the less than ideal conditions he displayed his class taking 3 wickets on his way to becoming a First XI mainstay after Xmas; Joel Ajani accelerated his development with an impressive half century on the way to selection in the Team of the Year; Andrew Thakur and Rayaan Kochhar played key roles in both Essendon's and Prahran's Dowling Shield campaigns, and were two of the leading players in the 5s, both showing maturity beyond their years at times; Archer Johnson contributed some valuable top order innings; Josh Kerr, Harry Cashman and Sam Duckett gained valuable opportunity throughout the year bowling in different conditions and against some quality players combining for 39 wickets which is very exciting for the future; while Jack Allan made up for a pre-Xmas injury with some stellar performances with both bat & ball.

While we enjoyed some important cameos from established senior players Ben Salmon, Matt Tyson, Tom Ison, Diyon De Silva and Sam Iverson (many of whom cut their teeth in this team while working their way through the grades), we had consistent contributions from players of various backgrounds that add so richly to the culture of the Fifth XI. Vijay Gatta belying his years, bowled with great skill and amazed those in attendance with his handstand feats; Sanjay

Rathnakumar, walked in off the street and added greatly to the team; Matt Johnson, brought passion and elite wicketkeeping along with a newly discovered talent for swing bowling; the peoples champ Tom Miles' infectious personality inspired and energised the team; Noah O'Neill, over from the UK made an immediate impact; and Vets premiership keeper Damien Cleary, selflessly supported wherever was required throughout the year.

Ultimately we managed seven victories from our 19 completed games, including an impressive stretch of three wins in the last 5 matches, with those two losses by a narrow ten runs against teams that played finals. Our major award winners were Ant Howes with 25 wickets at just over 8, and Carter Billbrough a revelation who ended up with several half centuries in the 2nd XI, who won the batting averaging 54.

There has been some movement with the VSDCA keen to support a 5th XI Sunday comp, however it looks like the South/East will not have enough clubs until the 25/26 season. Until then we greatly look forward to again entering the MCA B South division under the new cocaptaincy of Ben Salmon and Rayaan Kochhar.

I'd like to thank all those who supported the team during the season including but not limited to: Mick Lawson, Anthony Howes, Matt Johnson, David Kerr, Damian Cleary, Neeraj Kochaar, Ryan Chapple, Craig Johnson, Shane Cashman, Kate Duckett, Greg Ajani, David DeCouto, Brendan McGuinness, Peter Webb and especially Carlos Wakefield who went over and above in his role as captain as a young man in a foreign land. We've been very fortunate to have such great contributors to our development XI, which have reaped exceptional rewards in the past four years, and greatly look forward to that continuing to bridge the gap from our junior to senior program.

MID-YEAR



LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARDED TO BRENDAN McGUINNESS

Brendan (BJ) joined us in 2012/13 after an excellent career at Prahran in premier cricket.

BJ immediately made an impact, scoring 697 runs at 46.47 in his first season. He began with a 98, soon added a 99(run out) and it appeared there might be a block getting to 3 figures. He quashed this in the finest fashion with an imperious 115 in one of our most memorable Grand Final wins of all time as we downed Plenty Valley 278 to 263. This started an illustrious eleven year career at Oakleigh which included four first XI premierships, four T20 Premierships and innumerable records which are summarised below.

BJ won the batting award 7 times in his 11 years – it probably could have been 11 but for a couple of other stars stealing in for a win, such was his consistency. The number of times BJ stood immovable between our batting innings and its oblivion is beyond counting. He just did it week in week out.

BJ set punishing standards at training, including the infamous (and thankfully short-lived) "If you're out, you're out" rule for batsmen at training. He was meticulous in his preparation and did his best to instil his standards into others.

Eventually, he undertook the even more onerous task of Captain/Coach, and took it in his stride. As an example of his attention to detail, he booked pre-season training sessions a YEAR in advance to ensure we had the best times. Off the field, BJ contributed just as strongly. He was heavily involved in accelerating our digital presence in the modern era, promoting our social media and lifting the quality of our communications. He was also key to the implementation of our popular Frogbox streaming of weekly matches from Warrawee.

It is onfield where BJ excelled. In 11 seasons, he passed 500 runs a remarkable 7 times, with a high of 697 and even in his least productive season he produced a more than respectable 363. He represented the first XI 156 times, coming in at 9th on the all-time list. He logged 6 centuries and 38 fifties. Some of his most memorable innings include an unbeaten 83* in a classic semi-final win over Caulfield at Caulfield where he simply refused to get out. He followed it up the next week with a magnificent 89 in a losing cause in the Final.

In his last season he made his final ton a magnificent 104* coming in at number seven (due to injury and being off the field when we bowled). From 5-30 he shared in a century stand with Jack Clark and then an improbable 46 for the last wicket with Thari against Brunswick as we fell 1 agonising run short of a remarkable win.

His 5397 runs is a club record, overtaking the legendary Val Holten and a whopping 1300 in front of third placed Gordon Carleton. He shares the club record opening partnership of 201 with Andrew Splatt vs Moorabbin He snaffled 111 catches, usually at 1st slip (no one who was there can ever forget the glee with which he took a catch off Pinny at slip to dismiss Damiano in the 15/16 GF at Oakleigh). He captained the club to BTB premierships in 18/19 and 19/20. Its fair to say BJ has done it all for the Oaks. BJ is in the conversation to be our best ever player and he is our newest Life Member.

Hearty congratulations and very, very, well deserved.
