Ron Rees

Much loved Life Member Ron Rees passed away earlier this season, aged 89 in Inverloch, his home for many years. Ron played at Oakleigh for 22 seasons, commencing in 1949/50 and finally retiring after the conclusion of the 1970/71 season. He played 9 First Eleven games (becoming the 19th player to debut in Oakleigh's first season in the VSDCA in '49/50) among 217 club games across all grades (17th highest in club history at the conclusion of the 2019/20 season).

He compiled ten half centuries amongst 4,561 runs with a top score of 95 (in the 3rd XI in 1964/65, which was his most prolific year with 424 runs) and captured 50 wickets with a best of 4/1, also taking 111 catches.

Ron captained the third eleven for many years throughout the successful 1960s period for the club and was made a Life Member in 1967. He greatly enjoyed the social activities hosting several fundraising BBQs at his home in Bentleigh East.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with a great sense of pride that I can report that our club has completed another tremendously successful season, highlighted by the First and Third X1 back to back Premierships.

The club also came second in the VSDCA Ken Fewster Club Championship for the seventh time, which was also a fine achievement. The award was introduced in 2001 /2002. To now have won it seven times, and been runners up a further seven times, is a testament to the club's sustained success.

The Third X1 Premiership was a great reward for a wonderful group of players, who should be tremendously proud of their efforts. The Second and Fourth X1's both had terrific seasons during the home and away fixtures, but ultimately fell short of premiership glory during their finals campaigns. My congratulations and thanks to Senior Coach, Clinton Bricker, Assistant Coach, Alex Jones and our four captains, Brendan McGuinness, Trent Shields, Ben Hogan and Ryan Chapple for their tireless efforts, and commitment to ensuring that all players were provided with the opportunity to develop their talents, and their respective teams performed to their full potential. I would also like to acknowledge the effort of our Chairman of Selectors Matt Naughtin who performed his role superbly.

The Junior Program was again very capably coordinated by Gary Iverson. The junior program is the lifeblood of our club, and it is imperative that it continues to provide young players with the opportunity to participate in our great game, in a caring and enjoyable environment. To highlight the importance of the program, in the First X1 Premiership team this year, five players had graduated from our junior program. My great thanks to all of the coaches, parents and supporters who contribute to the success of the junior program.

The Under 15 Craig Carnival team was again coached by Ryan Chapple, ably assisted by Tom Ison. All the boys played well, and had a wonderful learning experience over the carnival period. Special thanks to Greg Ajani for managing the team, and to Rowland Williams and Gary Iverson for attending to the many administrative tasks required.

I must sincerely thank all of the members of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Board of Management for their tireless efforts in ensuring the club has the appropriate platform in place that is required for achieving sustained success. The board this season consisted of Vice Presidents; Trent Shields, Matt Naughtin and Gary Iverson. Treasurer, Michael Lawson; Administration Secretary Glenda Splatt; Secretary ACT Allan Stamps; Assistant Secretary; Bruce Dowland; and Board members Ivor Donohue, Geoff Latham, Michael Splatt, Brendan McGuinness, and Shannon Kirkby. I would particularly like to thank Glenda, Shannon, Brendan and Michael for joining the Board this year.

Thursday night Splatty Meal Deals continues to be a weekly highlight. Thanks again to Glenda and Peter for the remarkable commitment you both make to the club. The meals provide a wonderful opportunity for all club members to socialise and bond with each other, whilst enjoying a magnificent meal.

I must also acknowledge the generous contribution to the club's finances made by our two coterie groups, the Lobster Club and the Solid Oaks. This year under the leadership of Neil Croft, the Lobster Club membership has reached record levels, and thanks to another very successful season by the first eleven, significant funds were raised once again. Unfortunately, due to the Virus, members were not able to enjoy the sumptuous Lobster Club Dinner at the end of the season, but this great function will be held when health regulations allow. A huge thank you to Neil for his weekly updates and coordination of the Lobster Club, and to Bettina Latham for managing the finances of the group. The Solid Oaks coterie continues to contribute to funding for capital works programs, and I thank them sincerely for the generous donations.

As I have mentioned in the Community Partners Report, our club is blessed to have a large number of loyal and generous sponsors. SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is a pleasure to present on behalf of the Committee, the 140th Annual Report of the Oakleigh Cricket Club Incorporated for the 2019-2020 season.

Oakleigh once again has continued its amazing record in finals appearances in all grades. This season all 4 sides not only saw finals action, but we had back-to-back premierships in the 1st and 3rd XIs and finished second in the "Ken Fewster Club Championship". A wonderful achievement which reflects the dedication on and off the field by all members of the Oakleigh Cricket Club.

Our excellent on-field performances started with a new Club Coach – Clinton Bricker – who brought a new voice to our club and proudly represented the playing group. Gary Iverson once again headed up the management of the Junior teams and Michael Splatt took on the convenor role for the Woolworths Blast program for the 4 to 9 year olds. The work and efforts of both are much appreciated. Matthew Naughtin, again faced the often unenviable task of Chairman of Selectors. Matthew and our Captains of each XI are to be congratulated on managing team selection. Ryan Chapple and his coaches once again took responsibility for the JC Craig carnival, which makes a valuable contribution to the advancement of junior players.

Michael Splatt also joined elite company in becoming a member of the VSDCA 200 Club and played in the VSDCA Rep game against the VCCL for the first time. His 200th game for

Oakleigh would have been the first XI Grand Final so we hope to celebrate this milestone with him at the start of next season.

One of the most important and rewarding roles of the board was to nominate Daniel Junkeer for Life Membership. This recommendation was unanimously supported by the members in attendance. Daniel becomes just the 63rd Life Member of the Oakleigh CC in our 140-year history, and his elevation to this lofty honour is a thoroughly deserved recognition for a lifetime of outstanding contributions both on and off the field.

Daniel's nomination was supported by life-long friend and fellow Life Member Daryl Mendes who recounted Daniel's journey in cricket and life and the role Oakleigh CC played in both.

A brief outline of Daniel's outstanding career at Oakleigh CC is as follows:

- Joined OCC in 2002/03, became only the 3rd player in our history to achieve 200 First XI pennant matches, before retiring at the conclusion of the 2016/17 season.
- Daniel finished his extraordinary career with 253 First XI games and 386 dismissals (tenth in VSDCA history), along with nearly 1,600 runs at an average of 11.55.
- Overall, he played 284 games, was a key member of 3 x First XI premierships and 2 x T20 titles and holds the VSDCA record for most dismissals in one innings, 8 (7 catches and 1 stumping) vs Brunswick in 2006/07.
- Club sponsor for 6 years, including now becoming the club major sponsor through some significant work initiated by himself and Jenny through their company Junkeer.

In response a humble Junks spoke with great love for his teammates who he likened more to family than just players in a team and hinted that this connection was what set the club apart.

The Board has recently started two significant projects that will be of huge benefit to the club and exciting in quite different ways. Firstly, the history and a detailed chronicle of the Oakleigh Cricket Club is going to be recorded which will result in a professionally written publication.

Secondly, we are in the early stages of planning for new / improved clubhouse facilities and pavilion which will be outstanding for the club and our future development as we are one of the leading sporting clubs in the City of Monash.

FINANCIAL REPORT - TREASURER'S REPORT

A crazy mixed-up 2019/20 with numerous washouts (covers leaking on 1 occasion)/Country Week game abandoned & heat-outs in the juniors ... meant there was little flow to the season. This coincided with the calamities occurring in the world outside our cricket bubble – seeing no premiership decider being played - finally resulted in 2 senior flags, at least!

Congratulations to our respective captains (and coach Clinton Bricker) for steering all 4 senior teams to the finals, culminating in 2 flags for the Oaks – and off-field - a profit of nearly \$4,000.

Income for the year fell by \$4,000 to \$99,000 and expenses decreased by \$5,000 - to \$95,000 - a breakdown of material items follows.

Wins for the season included a number of new sponsors (special thanks to Craig Allen & Associates); with many new sponsors obtained by Barb Reid, & the \$223 Liquor Licence being refunded by the State Revenue Office, as COVID-19 relief!

Members subscriptions decreased by \$5,000 mainly due to the club fielding 2 less junior teams & (to a lesser extent) more students & juniors playing in the seniors at discounted rates; netting \$21,835 for seniors & \$11,750 for juniors.

Sponsorship revenue continued to contribute significantly to our overall result. OCC was fortunate again to receive sponsorship from our loyal supporters: Murrumbeena Branch of the Bendigo Bank; Rotary Club of Oakleigh; Sign*A*Rama (Oakleigh); Allfloors Carpet Gallery; Ray White Oakleigh; Rosstown Hotel; Mortgage Choice; Junkeer Business Solutions; Spring Osteo Clinic; and ICON Sports. Thanks to all of these organisations, and - especially Trent Shields - for his diligent pursuing of sponsorship funding.

Player Sponsor profits increased slightly on 2018/19, due to the diligent work of the players & Michael Splatt - as co-ordinator.

Profit from Social Activities matched the prior season returns. A summary showing the results of these activities is included with this report.

Thanks go to those who participated in various Social Activities, whether by running the event, purchasing supplies for the Bar/BBQ, or working on the day. Special thanks to the finance team of Roly Williams & Bettina Latham for their guidance & support; the Trivia night team of Connor Byrne, Jim Benn, Geoff Latham etc; & Connor for again running the Thursday night raffles & Michael Splatt for the inaugural Wine Drive.

Many thanks to Neil Croft for organising and recruiting new members to the Lobster Club - which produced a profit of nearly \$8,000 – due to the first eleven winning an admirable 12 games. Bettina Latham was responsible for processing payments, freeing me up for other tasks.

There were 43 members in 2019/20, & the aim is for these supporters to be wined & dined later in 2020.

Merchandise inventory levels rose \$1,600 due to new styles & designs being purchased in bulk.

The \$5,000 decrease in expenses for 2019/20 consisted mainly of the following items:

- A \$2,000 drop in Umpires Fees – one benefit of being washed out so many times ...
- Also, a \$2,000 reduction in Ground Hire fees due to the Grand Finals being cancelled



- No VSDCA Function in 2019/20

Hopefully the world will return to normal leading to stable off-field finances.

This, plus continued development of our outstanding junior players, allied to the core of current senior players & recruitment of a professional player, should keep OCC around the top of the VSDCA ladder again!







FIRST ELEVEN REPORT

Season 2019/20 proved to be historic in more ways than one. The 1st XI are 'back-to-back' premiers for the first time in 50 years, while the spread of COVID-19 forced all cricket in Australia to be abandoned immediately in the week leading up to the VSDCA Grand Finals.

This season was one of significant change and growth for the senior squad. It started with the appointment of a new coaching panel in the off-season, welcoming Clinton Bricker (Coach) from Kingston-Hawthorn Hawks CC, and Alex Jones stepping up into a dual role as a playing Assistant Coach. A welcome change from the familiar faces who had previously occupied the coaching positions, Clint & Alex brought an infectious enthusiasm to the role which had a visible impact on the group from the outset.

The 1st XI squad lost key talent & experience over winter, including 'Premiership Heroes' James Campbell (UK), Shane Townsend (WA) and Jeremy Devlin, as well as emerging talent in Daniel Croft & Joshua Knight, leaving us with less depth than we had a season ago. To counter the departures, it was extremely pleasing to welcome gun off-spinner, Dravid 'Tiger' Rao to the club from Plenty Valley CC, and welcome back Elliot Fabris following a season off.

After a robust preseason of strength & fitness training, skill sessions and practice matches in Sale & Benalla, the season was on us in the blink of an eye. The annual realignment saw the South group pitted against a very strong North group, which presented an opportunity for Oakleigh to test itself every week against quality opposition. There were no 'easy' fixtures this season, and every win was going to be hard fought.

Adverse weather and ground conditions wreaked havoc in the first half of the season, resulting in a lot of white ball cricket. Fortunately our one-day form was strong, recording comprehensive victories against St Bernards, Preston, Brunswick and Moorabbin. Each win saw a different player step-up and lead us to victory, including an excellent 72 from Elliot Fabris vs St Bernards, and 68* from Connor Byrne vs Brunswick – both of whom took enormous strides in their development as 1st XI cricketers this season.

A reality check against Brighton followed by a nail-biting last ball victory against Ormond before Xmas left us 7-1 at the break and atop of the North/South Group ladder.

2020 didn't start the way we wanted, with sub-par performances against Plenty Valley & Coburg. Again, individuals stepped-up to lead us to victory, with outstanding performances from Mick Splatt (6/47) v Coburg, and Dravid Rao (3/25) & Geoff Latham (3/16) vs Plenty Valley was enough to secure the points and maintain top spot on the ladder.

We had a late season wobble against Caulfield & Malvern, however we managed to put our best foot forward against Elsternwick in the final round – a workmanlike victory. While not overly convincing, the group regained some confidence and belief in the lead up to finals. Pleasingly, the evenness of the competition saw a few big name casualties – with the much fancied Brunswick, Brighton & Malvern all missing out by less than a game.

The quarter final saw us lose the toss to be sent in by Ormond. We stuck to a simple plan to grind out a competitive 164 on a track more suited to the bowlers, led by Graeme Vimpani's 67.

As it had done for the entire season, our new ball pair of Mick Splatt & Alex Jones destroyed top-order line-ups. Mick Splatt took the first 4 wickets to have Ormond 4/24, and Alex Jones returned 2/26 off 17 overs. Ormond all out for 84, with Jex finishing with 6/20 off 17 fiery overs.

The Semi Final pitted us against St Bernards Old Collegians, who we had accounted for comfortably earlier in the season. The match was almost a carbon copy of the Quarter Final, only this time we won the toss and decided to bat. Again, a workmanlike effort from the batsman, spearheaded by Graeme Vimpani (46) helped us to 9/178 at the close. Although, at 9/133 with 10 overs to bat, things could have been much different...

What followed was an unbroken 45-run stand between Dravid Rao (28*) & Geoff Latham (17*). The 10th wicket partnership belted the St Bernards bowling attack to all corners of DW Nicholl Reserve, with 16 runs coming off the final over. An outstanding effort that had the entire playing group in raptures for the final hour. The team were united in belief, confidence was up, and we'd take momentum in to Day 2. One of the greatest hours of cricket I've ever been a part of.

On Sunday, Mick Splatt had 4 wickets in the first 15 minutes and St Bernards were 4/7 – right on top. However, at 4/100 things were looking tight, yet an inspired 2 over spell from Connor Byrne forced an error and broke the partnership with a sharp caught & bowled. Alex Jones followed up with the wicket of the other set batsman, and at 6/104 at tea we were back on top.

Some tight bowling from Rao & Splatt kept the pressure on as the wickets continued to fall, eventually bowling St Bernards out for 121 in 55 overs. Jex finishing with 5/33 from 16 overs. The Oaks through to a Grand Final, and an opportunity to go back-to-back.

Unfortunately, that opportunity to play never eventuated. In light of COVID-19, Cricket Australia ordered that all competitions cease play immediately. After a week-long deliberation, the VSDCA Executive awarded the premiership to Oakleigh as the highest ranked team. Our 10-3 season against a formidable North/South Group being good enough for top spot.

An unprecedented and somewhat disappointing decision, but one Oakleigh graciously accept.

To both Michael Splatt & Alex Jones – thank you for your support, and congratulations to you both on a fantastic season. To take 42 & 33 wickets respectively (more than half our season total) is simply outstanding, and your efforts with the ball this season were enough to catapult us into a Grand Final. You are both hard working, gifted individuals that are right at the top of your games, and will no doubt finish your careers as two of the greatest players to ever wear the 'purple & gold'.

Great clubs are run by great people, and without an army of dedicated volunteers our club would cease to exist. Personally, I'd like to extend my gratitude to the following:

- **Peter Webb** – Thank you. I'm genuinely lost for words. You do the work of 10 men, provide a steady hand & have led this club with distinction for a long time now. Our success is largely due to your extraordinary contribution to our great club.

SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

With the benefit of reflection and time, most of us can objectively review events and decisions and then justify them, excuse them, or admit changes could have been made. From a team sport perspective if you ultimately fall short of winning the premiership this can be at times a sobering experience. However, if you are intrinsically part of a wider collective, a club full of committed and passionate members who represent both those who have come before and those who eagerly watch on then the question of success becomes more complicated than simply winning or losing.

The Oakleigh Second XI were unsuccessful in their quest to win the premiership in season 2019/20, just like in 18/19 and 17/18. 30 wins interspersed with just six losses incorporating two minor premierships and a home ground advantage 3rd place for no addition to the trophy cabinet may seem superficially to be a disappointing outcome. A part of me agrees with the previous statement, but the other part of me, the part that firmly believes in the club being bigger than any individual – fondly recalls: the eight players who made their First XI debuts in the last three seasons after graduating through the twos; the thrilling final round win at Werribee last year that secured a record seventh Ken Fewster Club Championship for the mighty Oaks; the back-to-back flags claimed by the Third and First XIs both strongly pushed to these heights by the role of the Second XI; and importantly the tears, laughter and good times that accompany spending nine months working together with your mates for a common goal.

2019/20 was another season with significant turnover, several players had family commitments or injury early in the year, while several young guns forced their way into the team early on through weight of pre-season performance.

As a result of this tumult an undertaking was made to identify the next group of leaders (enthusiastic mid-20s crew, who effectively ran the club now anyway) and install them in roles of responsibility so they could grow into the void between the tired veterans and the precocious youngsters pushing up from our famed junior program. To that end, I invited several players to consider leadership positions and of those nominated, James Benn (VC) and Rob Howes (DVC) answered the call. Early in the season I also officially extended a formal invitation to John O'Keefe to join the leadership group, and the growth of these players from a leadership and management perspective was one of the great highlights of the season for me.

Coming off a devastating Grand Final defeat is always a challenge, and the early season brought not only an awful battle with the weather but indifferent form from a team accustomed to racking up wins. After seven rounds the 2s were precariously poised at just three wins along with 4 losses, bizarrely we had not yet saluted at our home fortress with the three wins all on the road. There was no great impending doom about the defeats however with the margins very small, Rd 1 we lost by 3 wickets with Kew scrounging the last 18 runs for the eighth wicket, Rd 3, we were beaten by early season form team St Bernards by just 18 runs in a high scoring one-day fixture after our poorest bowling and fielding performance in memory, and Rd 5 we lost by two wickets against last season's premier in the N/E Brunswick. Round 7 we were completely outplayed, potentially spooked by the team who mercilessly crushed our undefeated dream last March, and as the mid-point of the season was upon us, we were in danger of slipping out of contention.

The final match of 2019 we travelled to EE Gunn to face form side Ormond in a must-win match. Fortuitously we won the toss and elected to bat, however after another bright and

promising opening we again slumped to be 5/69. The collective mood had dropped as a chill swept over the ground, deathly quiet from the stands in stark contrast to when we are at our best. A controversial decision whereby the Oaks felt a fielder on the opposition had incorrectly signalled a boundary rather than six brought us back to life, and the remaining batsman and support slowly turned. A typically pugnacious 47-run partnership between Donohue 45, and Thurgood 18 helped us scrape to a defensible 165. However, the energy we had re-found was almost sapped as the 'Monders moved easily to 1/47 after 10 overs, then the entire season turned collectively on its head. The combative swagger returned, we had regained our voice, and our very effective brand of unsociable cricket had returned. From this point we took 5/0 and then 3/1 to go to Xmas at 4-4.

Straight after Xmas we had an honest self-assessment of where we were at as a team, the statistics were damning. Of the 53 innings in the 2nd XI by the twelve players selected for round 9, only twice had we scored over 40, and one of those was by Doc in his only innings. Another significant turning point, were injuries, with the previously indestructible skipper (give me some due I'd somehow scrambled 50 consecutive games together for the first time in my career) along with the dependable Ed Cowan, thrust Jim (The Commodore) into the main role. From here we went on an unbeaten tear for the rest of the season as we walked the tightrope to qualify for finals. Eventually results fell our way and we ended up with a 'home' final, albeit at the unfamiliar surrounds of Scammell Reserve.

Unfortunately we couldn't quite put together a perfect game against a very worthy and hungry opponent in St Bernard's, even with our paltry day one total we almost, almost stole the game and as a global pandemic swept across our local sporting fields, probably would have ended up as premiers. But that's the thing about sport, sometimes there are fairy tales, sometimes nightmares, but always tomorrow! A greater focus on fielding, fitness, and batsmen taking control of strike rates are the key areas to improve once the 20/21 season rolls around.

Congratulations go to James Benn on winning the batting award, and the returning Matt Stamps with the bowling honours, both for the first time in this grade. Matt contributed brilliantly in all facets once he was recalled early in the season, along with Zac Raymond with the ball who led the attack throughout the year. Rob Howes and John O'Keefe will be disappointed with their output, but both improved strongly in the back end of the year and are set for the prime of their careers with excellent attitudes. Jack Iverson had a taste of higher levels and was a well-deserved winner of the DW Nicoll trophy for best young player. With his undoubted talent could he have produced even better results? I believe so. Could he have been afforded more opportunity to perform as well? In hindsight, I believe the answer is also yes. Unfortunately with captaincy the buck stops with you, and eleven blokes every week have their own agenda that you must try to balance to achieve the team outcome you desire, but also provide opportunities for them to reach their potential. I'm very proud of the steps forward most of the players who have played under me have made in my time, and I'm sure they will be better cricketers for the experience wherever they might end up. Special mention to our Georgians guest, Oli Ormerod who was all class throughout the year, and our spiritual dynamo, Nick Thurgood who is a heart and soul type who can also perform, and I hope he does!

Congratulations also to Brendan and Ben on leading their respective sides to back-to-back premierships. Ben in particular in his first year in the role, and after bemoaning his lack of team success before moving to Oakleigh, now four years later he has three premiership medallions. Brendan pulled together a team widely expected to trail off after losing three premiership stars

from last year along with star Jeremy Devlin early this year, led his team to the minor premiership and then to the flag. Also, great credit to Mick Splatt and Alex Jones for Team of the Year worthy seasons, hopefully they are duly recognised at a suitable time.

Kudos to Peter and his board, in particular Allan, Glenda and Gary in the extremely critical roles they play, I again implore anyone wanting to get the most out of themselves or the Oakleigh experience to put up your hand and get involved, you won't regret it, and it makes the successes even sweeter.

And last but not least, thanks to Shannon, Wendy, Bridene for the incredible roles they play on match day supporting us off the field. Would we still be able to play and survive without their help? Sure, but that adds an extra layer of stress and uncertainty and is what separates Oakleigh from its rivals, our people. They and all the other supporters are every bit a part of this club as the players.

Finally, a special thanks to my family, Kristi and Keats primarily, and close friends for allowing me to continue to indulge in my passion to the detriment of their ambitions. I promise it won't last for ever, but it might not be quite over just yet.

After playing under Doc's guidance the past three seasons (2 of which were premierships), the pressure was certainly on from game 1. My intention was to run an extremely tight ship and set very high standards for the group. Unfortunately, that was all brought apart before we even bowled a ball when I arrived at Scammell Reserve only to find one of our new recruits, Kevin Theobald, giving throw downs to the opposition. Despite this setback, we started off with a very solid win against Mt Waverley, with the hardest part learning everyone's name with 6 new Oakleigh players in the side.

Unfortunately, my 35-year-old body didn't last long as I suffered a knee injury before round 2. The great Gary Iverson was kind enough to take the reins. Obviously, Gary had huge shoes to fill, thankfully though the opposition wasn't the strongest. Dharmesh Patel's (55) and Jack Iverson's (79) opening partnership of 142 against Moorabbin was higher than 11 of our total team scores from the prior season. Matt Stamps then tore through their batsmen with an amazing 7/14. We followed this with a couple of good wins against Noble Park and Croydon, the highlights being a dominant 69* from Will Iverson and an incredible 2/1 off 9 overs from Big Ben Cuthbertson - the 1 run being a wide.

This brought us to the match up against our eventual Semi Final opponents in Ormond. We set a very strong 3/170, a great score considering the awkward Scammell pitch. Dharmesh continued his good form with a blistering 64* from a few hundred balls, and our loveable import Jon Keogh hit a very impressive 54. With Ormond 8/109, we took our foot off the pedal and unfortunately let them back into the game. Eventually they passed us 9 down, which was a big wake up call for the group. This was followed up by a big loss against Elsternwick with Doc making 54 chasing their huge total of 6/276. Suddenly, slipping out of the top 6 was a real possibility.

We finished the year off with a dominant display in our T20 against last season's grand finalists, Balwyn. We restricted them to 9/42 in their 20 overs, with Ethan Wright taking an amazing 3/2 off 4 only to be superseded by Ant Howes taking 3/1 off his 4. I have never seen so many rain cards played in my cricketing life after Chrissy, with most Saturday's being washed out. When we eventually got some cricket in, we played some really good cricket. The highlight being an outright against Box Hill where we almost lost chasing their small total of 106 8 wickets down, Reidy played an extremely mature innings with the bat to get us over the line. We proceeded to bowl them out for 38 in the second dig - the second time this season we rolled a team for 38. Ant, Lundy and Thari all dominating with the ball taking 5 wickets for the match each. Sam Phelan also found some form with a 64 run knock to get us over the line against Brighton.

This brought us to the final round, a matchup against the undefeated Endeavour Hills with top spot on the line for the winner. Winning the toss and bowling on what looked to be a road ended up being a masterstroke - if I do say so myself. Although with Endeavour at 2/99 off 15 overs and smacking us all over the field it didn't seem that way. Fortunately, our bowlers changed their lengths and we took the next 8 wickets for a mere 28 runs. Lundy ripping through their batting line-up despite his 1:30 arrival and lack of warm up. We comfortably chased them 5 down which took us to the top of the table, little did we know how important that win would end up being!

Our quarter final matchup was against Mt Waverley, the same team we played in the quarters last season. It was Big Ben Cuthbertson's time to shine, ripping their top order apart to have Mount 7/38. They scraped their way to 105 before Benny finished off the tail, ending the day with the ridiculous figures of 7/30 of 29.2 overs in his first ever senior final. We made light work of the chase, winning 4 down led by coach Clinton Bricker's brilliant 54. It was a very dominant display by the team given our lack of 2 day cricket throughout the season (this was only our 4th 2 dayer). We then played Ormond in the semi who won the toss and batted much to our enjoyment, however at 1/66 things weren't looking too great. In came Ant Howes to run through their batting order on his way to 5/18 off 17. We eventually bowled them out for 96 and comfortably chased it 2 down. Sam Phelan hitting an unbeaten 50* in the process. Another very impressive win by the team.

Unfortunately, as we all know, the grand final was abandoned. I have no doubt we would have been extremely difficult to beat had it gone ahead. It's a shame we didn't get to sing the song together once more, but everyone should be extremely proud of how they performed throughout the season, and you all thoroughly deserved the premiership. A big thanks to all 31 players (including 4 Iverson's) who represented the third eleven through season 2019/20. I'd also like to thank the committee for their brilliant work in seamlessly running this great club, especially our esteemed president Peter Webb, the selection committee (sorry for all the arguments Norto), and a special thanks to Doc, GI and Clint who all provided great insights and assistance in my first year as captain. Not to mention all the help from the self-appointed VC, Jon Keogh! The biggest thanks of all though goes to Richard Blaze. What a privilege it is to have a full time scorer and team manager in the third eleven - not many other clubs have that honour. Thanks Rich for all your hard work and guidance throughout the season!

I thought I'd finish by listing some of my personal highlights for the season. Along with assisting opposition players with throw downs, Kevin Theobald constantly yelling out "shot Will!" every time Jack hit a boundary. Dharmesh explaining that if the gully fielder wasn't there to catch him, the ball would have gone for 4. Super coach Clint dropping an absolute pudding in the semi-final after calling 5 blokes out of the catch. Jon Keogh being the target of a vicious drink spiking incident before our round 13 match. Ant Howes eating a sandwich on the field as I blasted the team about their lack of professionalism in the warm up. Ethan Wright backtracking and apologising for sledging a batsman after he bit back at him. Reece Williams running down the pitch and telling a batsman to "use the &%\$@ing thing in your hands!" only to be hit for the biggest 6 of the season next ball. Lundy bowling 4 yorkers after we collectively set a field for short pitched bowling. Big Ben sprinting onto the field as nightwatchman, only to not face a single ball in the evening. And finally, Sam Phelan telling everyone he had the safest hands at the club before proceeding to drop 4 catches in the quarter final. Thanks for a great season all! Go the mighty Oaks.

MICHAEL SPLATT JOINS VSDCA 200 GAME CLUB

Congratulations to Oakleigh all-rounder Michael Splatt who plays his 200th 1st XI match in this weekend's North/South Semi Final against St. Bernards.

Michael joins an illustrious group of Oakleigh players to achieve this milestone counting the incomparable Val Holten, legendary Ron Munyard, champion Daniel Junkeer, record-breaking Ben Pinwill and multiple premierships winner, the prolific Hamish Morrison.

Considering the incredible talent and contribution of that group, Splatt more than holds his own in this prestigious company with already two VSDCA Team of the Year caps (and as leading wicket taker in the competition in 19/20 you'd be brave to bet against a third), four club championship awards, an MVP trophy, a Jack Sheehan Medal, multiple bowling averages and four premierships medallions with a fifth medal as 12th man in the 04/05 triumph as a youngster, along with a five-wicket haul in a Second XI flag for good measure.



Jex, as he is affectionately known amongst his Oakleigh brethren has been a model of consistency since debuting in the top grade in the 2006/07 season. From the following year when he established his place in the Firsts, he has never played less than 14 matches in any season, possessing an eye-catching style of power and grace he has stroked almost 3,000 runs at a tick over 20 with eleven half centuries, and with his robust right arm pace taking an impressive 328 wickets at just 16, with seven 5-wicket hauls, including a career best of 8/9 against Moorabbin in 17/18. His all-round abilities are complimented by an amazing presence in the field which is illustrated by his 28 run-outs and 86 catches, mostly from the slip cordon.



His longevity at the club has encompassed all seven of Oakleigh's record Club Championship victories and began in the U16s and lower XIs as a technically correct top-order batsman and leg spin bowler. His 80 matches across the other grades included batting and bowling averages of 22 and a further 55 catches and 1 stumping.

In addition to his on-field records, Michael has served on the Oakleigh CC Board of Management and coordinated the Social Committee, while also managing and facilitating the Woolworths Blast Program.

All connected with the VSDCA congratulate Michael as he celebrates this very special milestone in front of his extremely proud family, friends and teammates.

EULOGY FOR ROB McCARTHY

I first met Rob whilst we were in primary school and our mums played netball together at Oakleigh recreation centre. All I really remember is Rob's cheeky smile and that Sally was a gun centre, but I had no idea how good our friendship was to become.

I then joined the Oakleigh Cricket Club & Oakleigh Dragons Football Club when we were 12 years old and this is where I would become lifelong friends with Robert "Rocket" McCarthy. Rob was the sort of kid that would be the most polite, well-spoken and well-mannered boy around anyone's parents and other adults but as soon as they were gone he would instantly become this little cheeky devil who took pleasure in annoying you and being as inappropriate as he could.

As young teenage boys Rob and I had the most important things a kid at this age could have in common. This was the following: 1. Playing cricket; 2. Playing football; 3. Barracking for Richmond; and 4. Trying to attract girls. But whilst we played cricket and footy every weekend, it just wasn't enough for us and the McCarthy backyard became one of the greatest sporting arenas that the suburb of Oakleigh has ever seen.

After winning 3 junior undefeated premierships in a row, Rocket, Sam Riley and I eventually graduated to the senior teams as 16-year olds at Oakleigh Cricket Club and at this stage we were inseparable. Rocket was a quality top order batsman who was ultra-competitive and tough to get out. He then bowled these little in-swinging mediums which were always on the spot and so tough for any batsmen to hit. I'll never forget watching his first senior hundred against noble park where he pointed to the sky to salute his dad in his celebration. He would have been so proud of you Rocket.

A season or 2 later we then played a Twenty20 Grand Final against Plenty Valley. Whilst I tried to bowl as fast as I could and went for 7 an over without taking a wicket, Rocket beat them with accuracy and variations and took the prized wicket of their West Indian first class batsmen as well as 2 other top order batsmen. He ended up with figures of 4 for 20 off 4 overs and we won the game. Unfortunately for Rocket he didn't get 'man of the match' but we went back to the club to celebrate and he proceeded to inhale as many Jim Beam cans as he could. For those of you who have never drunk with Rocket, I can tell you he was one of the worst drinkers I've ever seen, and this led to almost certain disaster later on. He was absolutely hammered and was telling anyone who would listen that he was robbed of 'man of the match'.

Even with all his well-meaning inappropriateness, Rocket will mostly be remembered for having a heart of gold and endeavouring to help people anyway he could. He had a caring soul and always had that ability to make people laugh no matter the circumstance. His flaring nostrils videos every Sunday on Facebook to try to reduce the stigma of talking about mental health were an inspiration to many people and this showed what an unbelievable human being he was.

Rocket was the best friend I could ever have, and I feel privileged to have been such a part of his life. He was the most loyal, caring, selfless, strong and resilient human being I've ever met. He's left such an impact on so many people and has left an enormous legacy behind. He's not in any pain now – hopefully he's resting up there with his Dad and cheering the Tiges home together.

THE RUN-MACHINE WITH THE HEART OF (PURPLE &) GOLD

With an email from the VSDCA executive on Friday, 20th March a curious anomaly in the history of the Oakleigh Cricket Club was finally redressed. For a club so accustomed to success in recent times counting nineteen senior premierships since 2003/04 it would appear inconceivable that one of its favourite sons could remain barren in grand final victories achieved.

Dharmesh emigrated to Australia in 2000, nominally to study a Masters in Information Technology at Swinburne University, but cricket – his true love and passion would become as much of a focus as his budding career over the years that followed. Like many of us Dharmesh flirted with a few clubs before finding his home, amongst them Elgar Park CC and Trinity Willison CC before the Eastern Cricket Association scheduled a fortuitous bye in the 2008/09 season and D succumbed to the mystical siren's call from Warrawee Park one fateful day. It was there while watching Michael Splatt plunder his highest First XI score that he met Life Member and fervent Oakleigh CC spruiker John Doig.

Doig invited him down to training that week with the promise of a match the following week, which duly occurred on the 1st November, 2008 when Dharmesh set the tone for what was to come over the ensuing 12 years, top scoring with 39 and taking 1/16 from eight overs in a 5-wicket victory over Mt Waverley. Other well-known Oakleigh names in that first match included Life Members Daryl Mendes and Doig, dual-First XI premiership wicket keeper, Miles Fabris, the great Jody Bruerton and our dearly departed Rob McCarthy.



In his early seasons Dharmesh played as an all-rounder, his cagey medium pacers netting 43 wickets, and batting in various positions in the order. After a solid, but unspectacular debut season in purple & gold Dharmesh blossomed in season two, striking the first of many half centuries in the first round versus Ormond, eventually compiling over 400 runs for the year. At this time, he also gave up the long run up and took the gloves, over time becoming a more than capable wicket keeper.

The next year was even more prolific, another three 50s and two 40s seeing him elevated to the Third XI for the finals series. A solid 35* in a rain affected Semi Final win saw Dharmesh retain his position for the Grand Final, however this meant he missed joining his beloved teammates in the Fourth XI decider.

Unfortunately for Dharmesh, 3rd XI skipper Andrew Mitchell and his team, they were ultimately bested in a see-sawing battle as Croydon claimed victory by 2 wickets. Meanwhile, the 4th XI were claiming their first and to date sole premiership at nearby Mt Waverley with a completely dominant performance. Dharmesh's replacement in the side as opener and wicketkeeper, Guy Driscoll top scoring with 75 and taking three catches. The winning side captained by Mark Wylie also featured future First XI stars, Matt Stamps, John O'Keefe and Geoff Latham, Matt taking 8/29 to oust Guy for man-of-the-match honours.

This heartbreak served as motivation to D, who started to place more emphasis on his physical fitness with a view to improving his mental prowess. Furthermore as a keen student of the game, he started subscribing to some key learnings to be a successful top order batsman, such as a willingness to place a high value on your wicket, the ability to bat for long periods of time, and the trust to play your own game.

Coupled with his hunger for hard work, Dharmesh possesses a gritty determination along with the rare but highly prized capacity to remain positive in times of adversity and remain unflustered by sledging from the opposition or his own team.



Slowly but surely, improvement started to come and Dharmesh celebrated his maiden century in round two of 2011/12 in a big innings victory over Ormond. During this time, his leadership capability came to the fore, and he showed an excellent understanding of his role to play in junior development, often sacrificing his own ambition to nurture a young batsman at the other end. His aptitude in communicating clearly and concisely to players of all ages has seen him take on the role of stand-in captain on numerous occasions with great aplomb and an admirable win/loss record. However, a lack of personal and team success in finals continued to drive him as the years rolled by.

A famous watershed moment where he was forced to retire on the cusp of a century due to cramps was the missing piece in the puzzle that elevated Dharmesh's game to a whole new level. In the 2018/19 season with a newfound confidence in both his ability and importantly stamina, D with a new and highly talented partner at the top of the order, (young Jack Iverson with 407 runs at 68) seemed to take umbrage at opposition bowlers attempting to dismiss and then even curtail him, and plundered an extraordinary 904 runs for the season in just 15 matches. It would be glib to compare his season average of 100.44 to the incomparable Sir Donald Bradman, but perhaps only because the Don only averaged 99.94.

A remarkable five centuries, a ninety and a seventy-seven punctuated this season from heaven for Dharmesh, but all the personal accolades including the coveted Ted Plant Medal for best player in the 4th XI, along with the Peter Newton (Best player in 2/3/4 XI) and Sam Blackburn (MVP) trophies could not make up for once again stumbling at the semi-final at the hands of a seemingly unstoppable Bayswater.

In addition to these accomplishments, Dharmesh along with Kishan Sudeep set a new 4th XI VSDCA partnership record for any wicket with their 271-run unbroken stand against Elsternwick in a one day match, and Dharmesh's total of 904 runs surpassed the previous best by David Love of Plenty Valley who bludgeoned 688 in 2015/16.



While Dharmesh's on-field record is one filled with multiple highlights his importance to the very fabric of the Oakleigh Cricket Club runs far deeper. From his leadership particularly of the young

impressionable players, through to helping drive the club culture in the lower XIs, simple tasks that are often taken for granted such as putting down the covers to ensure 24 players get a game in, mixing cordial for drinks (on the few occasions he isn't actually on the ground) and putting out or packing up boundary cones, and with his friendly and easy-going manner, he has become a truly excellent club man. There is also no doubt the love is reciprocated with Dharmesh purchasing an apartment only a couple of hundred metres away from D.W.Nicoll Reserve, not willing to bear the thought of being too far apart from his beloved. He has also volunteered in many off-field roles, namely in regards to administration and IT requirements, along with introducing several recruits over the years namely Jatin Shah (who also became Admin officer), Meher Jall (who came with Jatin from Trinity Willison), both of whom played in the '10/11 4th XI flag), Yogesh Malu and two-time batting award winner Rahil Gandhi.

And so, another unfulfilled season, but this time a difference with long time teammates and friends Daryl Mendes and Jatin Shah hanging up the boots, Dharmesh made the decision to put his hand up for selection in the Third XI. The step up in quality was no obstacle for D as he returned a meritorious 282 runs at 31 – with two fifties, enough to claim the batting award and complete nineteen dismissals behind the stumps. However, by far the most satisfying outcome, at least for Dharmesh and his army of friends and admirers (even though due to the Covid-19 situation it was achieved in very unusual circumstances) was the aforementioned email from association CEO Ken Hilton outlining that Oakleigh were declared premiers in the Third XI and finally handing that most elusive premiership medal to a most deserving Oakleigh hero.

He has also taken 43 wickets at 14.1 with a best bowling return of 5/22 and made 203 dismissals.*

WOOLWORTHS CRICKET BLAST

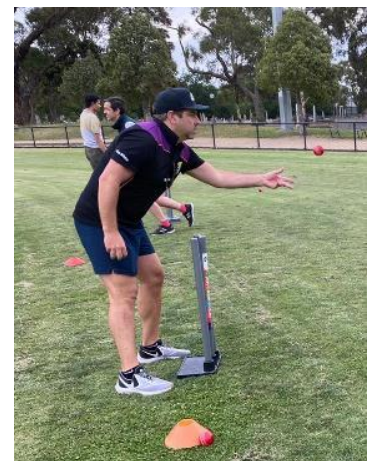
